

A Suggestion for an Interview Question

The following examples are variations on one theme. They all seek to eliciting a response from the candidate about the impact organizational affiliations might have on their work and decisions as a Commissioner. In each case, the parts in blue need to be replaced with something appropriate to the candidate.


Examples:

1. Mr./Ms. Wright. You have been actively involved with the "*City Slicker Farms' Backyard Garden Program*" for a long time. How will this community organization benefit by you being a Commissioner? Please explain.
2. Mr./Ms. Wright. You have been active with the "*California Native Plant Society*" and "*Children from China*" for some time. How will these community organizations benefit by you being a Commissioner? Please explain.
3. [for someone who worked for a County]
Mr./Ms. Wright. You have worked for the County of Santa Clara for many years. How will your county benefit by you being a Commissioner? Please explain.
4. [for someone who worked for a City]
Mr./Ms. Wright. You have worked for the City of San Jose for many years. How will your city benefit by you being a Commissioner? Please explain.
5. Mr./Ms. Wright. Does your long time membership in the The Sierra Club prevent you being an impartial and effective Commissioner? Please explain.
6. Mr./Ms. Wright. You are an active member of the Union of Bricklayers and Allied Craftworkers (BAC). Does your Union membership affect your ability to be an impartial and effective Commissioner? Please explain.
