To whom it may concern,

The redistricting plan should attempt to do three things. First, there should be no splitting of the counties of: Santa Cruz, San Benito, and Monterey. Second, the Central Coast and the Central Valley should not be paired together in any district. Third, if there must be any division of our central coast counties, it should only separate the Central Coast from the Salinas Valley.
