





Hello,

My earlier email was wrong, We MUST arrive at least by 5:00 pm to get a number to speak (not as late as I thought in an earlier email).

You can see the attached meeting notice to understand why. We will be given numbers and 2 minutes to speak. But they will not guarantee that everyone gets to speak. First come first serve. So even a little before 5pm would be good. It would also be good if we had numbers in sequence but not absolutely needed.

Remember that we do NOT want to seem partisan or mention that we are Democrats. This will backfire.

We DO want to say that we support the Mountain Redistricting Plan to keep our land rural.

We DO want to say that rural mountain Assembly districts should be separated from suburbs. The mountain community of interest is divided when suburbs are included. Urban districts that support conservation could be nested with rural mountain districts to create State Senate districts. *ecov, rural, historical (49), low density, rural business*

Keep together community of interest, Sonoma, North Hills, high density
 We DO want to say that we want to keep Auburn, Chico, Grass Valley, Mammoth Lakes, Nevada City, Oroville, Placerville, South Lake Tahoe, Turckee together. *in counties of people, biosystems, rural people, low density*
