Another comment earlier deserves repeating:

"Voters should choose their elected officials, not the other way around.

When politicians' electoral districts become safe, the public is put at great risk.

Competition is very healthy and vital for the preservation of effectively functioning representative democracy.

Keep each district geographically compact with a tight radius and none that look like string beans or lightning strikes.

Don't be partisan!"

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
