Connie, MaryAnn asked me to comment and you may have already received this information via the public comment mechanism, but I wanted to ensure that this opinion was taken into consideration. Thank you for serving the state in this capacity. We are proud of your "Blueprint for Leadership Diversity" roots.

On the May 5th visit of the Commission to our area in Norco we presented four area district maps which I have attached, one for the state senate, two for the state assembly and one for the congressional district. On June the 10th the Commission came out with their first draft of all the districts base on residents recommendations according to them. We were pleasantly surprised that the State Senate district and the two Assembly districts were pretty much the same as the ones we submitted. On the Congressional district however we feel we were short changed. As you will see by our Congressional map we include the Cities of Riverside, Moreno Valley and Perris plus other unincorporated areas such as Mead Valley Lake Mathews and Good Hope. The Commission's map excludes Perris, Mead Valley, Lake Mathews and Good Hope and instead includes Norco, Eastvaile and Coronita.

During our last presentation on June 19th in San Bernardino we asked the Commissioners to reconsider our original Congressional map. The three major arguments that we presented were : 1. The March Joint Powers Authority which is made up of Perris, Moreno Valley and Riverside which together with Riverside County are seeking to develop the unused area around March Airforce Base into a business and industrial complex which is proposed to bring 38,000 new jobs to our area, 2. Perris, Moreno Valley and Riverside have much more in common than they have with Norco and Eastvail. 3. Riverside, Moreno Valley and Perris share, medical facilities, shopping centers, Community parks and entertainment venues also Moreno Valley and Perris share school districts.

Our Congressional map is precise and meets the population guidelines according to the redistricting rules and more important with our maps we feel that our residents will have a better opportunity to elect representative of our choice. We are asking the Commission to include Perris in our congressioanl district.






