First Draft of State Senate and Assembly District Maps

Honorable Chairman:

As a resident of Dana Point, I very strongly oppose any state Assembly or Senate redistricting plan that would (1) divide Dana Point geographically and/ or (2) place Dana Point outside of any state Senate or Assembly districts that do not include our neighboring south Orange County cities.

I, and most neighbors I have spoken with, understand that our small city should not be divided and that also our entire city should be grouped with other South Orange County cities for state Senate and Assembly purposes. This is due to the common issues our cities face.

Shared issues include, but are certainly not limited to, ocean water quality, regional transportation at both the local (Orange County Transportation Authority) and state (Caltrans) levels, regional land use planning and affordable housing.

Splitting our small city introduces unnecessary difficulty in getting our interests represented while making it significantly more difficult for the representatives to understand and represent a single Dana Point consensus. Further, there is no valid reason a town the size of Dana Point should ever be considered for a split in representation.

I respectfully request the Commission reconsider the state Senate and Assembly district boundaries proposed in the First Draft.
