Dear Commissioners:

Two approaches to fixing the first draft maps are offered based upon extensive analysis of the COI testimony for Marin, Sonoma and Napa Counties.

Assembly Alternative 1

This alternative is the refined version of the sketch map presented on June 7, prepared at the Technical Assistance Site. The portion of Santa Rosa south of Hwy 12 is in MARIN for population balance, and all of West Sacramento south of I-80 is excluded from NAPA. With tweaking, these three districts can be brought to a deviation of -0.25% each. The “tail” on the east side of the DMNDO district is the City of Santa Rosa, avoiding a further split.

Assembly Alternative 2

This alternative is the minimum change to the 1st draft Assembly maps to satisfy the COI to keep Marin whole, joined with Sonoma, and not extending to the east. It returns American Canyon to Napa (as desired by COI testimony from both Marin and Napa), adjusts the MARIN boundary northward and adds a westerly portion of Santa Rosa to DMNDO for population. Some tweaking of the location of the Siskiyou County easterly boundary will be required to bring these three districts to a balance of less than 2% each.


Senate

The nesting of MARIN and DMNDO assembly districts to form a North Coast Senate District is the recommended approach in all scenarios. This matches the Commission’s intent in with the 1st draft maps.


Congress

An adjustment to the size of the current 6th Congressional District for population, keeping it exclusively covering all of Marin and most of Sonoma Counties is the best solution, as proposed on June 7. The North Coast alignment in the 1st draft maps is an acceptable second choice. This does keep the district somewhat in conformity to the Senate district. Do not go east with this district.

Assembly Alternative 1 – June 7 Proposal




North Bay Senate and Assembly Districts Proposal, 6-7-11




Marin Assembly District Proposal, 6-7-11
