As someone who has lived in both the Bay Area and Davis, I can say with certainty that the only reason to draw these two districts this way is to make both seats Bay Area dominated and preserve George Miller and Mike Thompson in different districts. What a gerrymander!

There is just no good reason for this. Any reasonable person would draw one district combining the Central Valley counties with eastern Solano in one Central Valley dominated district and the other with Napa, Sonoma and western Solano in a Bay Area district.
