The Chinese American Citizens Alliance, Grand Lodge, at its 51st Biennial National Convention, passed Resolution 31 on July 29, 2011, The resolution supports the maps for voting district boundaries for the 49th and 60th Assembly Districts, the 29th State Senate District, and the 32nd U. S. Congressional Districts that were submitted by the Chinese American Citizens Alliance, Greater San Gabriel Valley Lodge.

Careful thought was given by the San Gabriel Lodge in initial and subsequent revised drawing of suggested maps and district boundaries that were presented at public hearings on June 14, June 26, June 30, and July 12. The San Gabriel Lodge welcomed the opportunity presented by the California Citizens Redistricting Commission to correct the discriminatory electoral processes against communities of interest, including Asian Americans. The suggested drawings and boundary changes comply with the goals mandated by the United States Constitution, the United States Supreme court decisions and the requirements of the Redistricting Commission.

The Chinese American Citizens Alliance, Grand Lodge, is forwarding this resolution to the California Citizens Redistricting Commission with the request that it be distributed to each Commission member. The national Grand Lodge commends the Greater San Gabriel Lodge for its participation in the political process and urges all Local Lodges to conduct local and regional activities to improve prospects for electing qualified Asian American officials.

I have lived in Redondo Beach, Torrance and currently in Rancho Palos Verdes. I have purposely stayed in this area for its demographics. I am concerned about the dragging of the district line north to Santa Monica and Malibu. The policies of these regions and "West LA" are not similar and do not represent the communities of the South Bay.
