Re: Request to Inspect and Copy Public Records; Request for Immediate Public Display of Requested Documents

Dear Mr. Claypool and Commissioners:

This letter is to request access to records in the possession of the California Redistricting Commission for the purpose of inspection and copying pursuant to the California Public Records Act (Government Code Section 6250 et seq.) and public disclosure of Commission-produced or Commission consultant and staff-produced documents used or to be used in connection with Commission decision-making pursuant to the Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act (Government Code Section 11125.1).

The information that I ask to inspect and/or for the Commission to immediately make public is as follows:

1. All writings, communications, electronic mail communications, memoranda and other materials of the California Redistricting Commission identified as follows:
 - (a) The Memorandum or report from Professor Matt Barreto provided to Commissioner Ancheta to which Commissioner Ancheta referred at the June 24, 2011 meeting of the Commission, relating among other things to possible Voting Rights Act section 2 districts;

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- (b) Any document outlining the scope of work of Professor Barreto, also referred to by several Commissioners at the Commission's June 24, 2011 meeting;
- (c) Any memorandum prepared by Commissioner Ancheta relating to the constitutional deviation standard referred to by Commissioner Ancheta and Commission counsel Kirk Miller during Mr. Miller's testimony to the Commission and recommendation at the June 24, 2011 meeting;
- (d) The Memorandum prepared by Commission counsel Kirk Miller referred to in his testimony before the Commission on June 24, 2011 concerning the constitutional deviation standard; and
- (e) Reports, memoranda, or electronic mail communications sent by Commissioners relating to mapping and top line suggestions to the work plan team of Commissioners Ancheta and DiGuilio to be sent to Q2 by them, per the Commission's direction at the June 24, 2010 meeting.

This request reasonably describes identifiable records or information produced therefrom, and I believe that there exists no express provision of law exempting the record(s) from disclosure. Pursuant to Government Code sections 6257 and 11125.1, I ask that you make the records not only "promptly available" for inspection and copying, based on my payment of "fees covering direct costs of duplication, or statutory fees, if applicable" but immediately available publicly without any redaction on the Commission's website in order to comply with Government Code section 11125.1(b) relating to materials that were, or are expected to be the subject of Commission decision-making at the June 24, 2011 meeting and future meetings.

If a portion of the information I have requested is exempt from disclosure by express provisions of law, Government Code Section 6257 additionally requires segregation and deletion of material in order that the remainder of the information may be released.


If you determine that an express provision of law exists to exempt from disclosure all or a portion of the material I have requested, Government Code Section 6256 requires notification to me of the reasons for the determination not later than 10 days after your receipt of this request. Government Code Section 6256.2 prohibits the use of the 10-day period, or any provisions of the Public Records Act "to delay access for the purpose of inspecting public records."

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Also there is no justification for delay in making such materials public as part of the Commission's website or Meeting Handouts under the Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act.
