I first met Dr. Aguirre in 1973 when he moved to Santa Paula while still an undergraduate at UCLA. He was a volunteer for a farmworker education project and was selected to take over as Executive Director when the position became vacant. He immediately began strengthening the core services of the organization and, acting on a request from migrant parents groups in three local school districts, set about organizing the Adelante Summer Education Program. He proceeded to meet with district administrators and successfully negotiated a school site, license for curriculum development and delivery, control over hiring of (veteran) bilingual teachers and thirty farm worker background college students to serve as teacher assistants. Adelante sought strategic engagement of parents in home-based instructional support as well as involvement with their local schools and

districts. Over the several summers of its existence, this program hired more than one hundred college students and impacted over a thousand families with a program that was linguistically and culturally relevant and sowed the seeds of a better future for children based on meaningful education. Years later, some of the college students who worked with the project and are now successful professionals have expressed how this participation helped guide and motivated their college studies. During this time, Dr. Aguirre also wrote the foundation grant (and was awarded $\$ 250 \mathrm{k}$ ) for what evolved into Clinicas del Camino Real, a community clinic system that serves over 50,000 lowincome county residents annually with a variety of medical and health maintenance programs. His efforts also helped establish several county organizations. One of these, El Concilio del Condado de Ventura, is one of the primary social service agencies serving Latinos and other low-income groups in Ventura County.

Besides this social organization aspect of his work, I worked with him on a variety of projects aimed at polifical empowerment. Some of these included voter registration, get-out-the-vote campaigns, supporting and/or opposing various state initiatives, and supporting political candidates, etc. Along the way Dr . Aguirre continued his education and ultimately received his Ph.D. from the University of California Los Angeles where he immersed himself in social science theories, comparative/international education and development models that helped sharpen his analytical and policy development skills. With his Ph.D. and skills under his arm, he re-engaged with community issues using sophisticated paradigms to guide his understanding and practice.

Eventually in 2002, he ran for City Council and was elected overwhelmingly by a broad cross-section of the community. He still serves on the Council and is a tireless advocate for the underrepresented and disenfranchised. He has determinedly address issues that include homelessness, hunger, health and safety, affordable housing, resource allocation, recreation, economic development and many other related municipal matters. He has worked with a broad cross-section of the population that include faith-based organizations, seniors, the disabled, veterans, and other groups regardless of religious beliefs, gender, age or ethnicity or racial background. He is fair in his consideration of issues and problems that come before him and he

always endeavors to serve the total community equitably and respectfully.
