To whom it may concern,

It has come to my attention that consideration is being given to redrawing Federal and State district lines to include certain parts of the San Diego East County in with Imperial County. You have got to be kidding me!

San Diego East County shares many infrastructure issues (water, electricity, phone and cable infrastructure connectivity, trash disposal, economic development collaboration, roads and other transit cooperation, and a number of other similarities within San Diego County) as well as being more relevantly tied to the City of San Diego and other adjacent cities, than it is tied to Imperial County. The cities of El Cajon, La Mesa, Santee, Ramona, Poway and the unincorporated communities of Alpine, Jamul, Lakeside, Harbison Canyon, Crest and several others are interrelated to each other, and have common infrastructure and civic relationships, all which are completely unrelated to the predominantly farming area of Imperial County.

Any action to redraw lines in this fashion is unacceptable and would be unreasonable, and would additionally create an environment for a lack of appropriate representation by elected officials.

I strongly urge any plan to more directly connect the San Diego East County with Imperial County, for representational purposes, to not be implemented.
