On Friday, April 29, 2011 there was a public hearing which took place at San Gabriel Mission Playhouse. I have to say that I was dismayed in the manner voters were unable to speak before the Commission to include input regarding the City of Pomona. As a resident of Pomona, our city has had to endure years of political mayhem on the state level and legal challenges to include our city as a Community of Interest. If the Commission is to do the work the voters charged it with, then I hope you change the way of choosing speakers that come to public hearings from now on. Whether you choose a lottery system or seek an alternative our community deserves better and so does the number of other communities that have similar issues with this

process.

I ask that staff address these concerns in a timely manner.
