Dear California Citizens Redistricting Commissioners,

We are known for nature based tourism with our small bed & breakfast inns, fishing both commercially and for sport, recreation in our magnificent state parks and beaches, internationally known wine and specialty food products including, but not limited to, ranching, grapes and other products of agriculture.

There is a sense of cohesiveness and a commonality to the northern coastal districts as they now stand—physically, economically and psychologically. Even our main roads—Interstate 101 and Highway 1—run North-South. Moreover, there is a common need and strong desire to protect the facets that bind coastal communities to one another from the Oregon border to the Sonoma coast.
