Your mapping data is not available in a form that all citizens can apply and understand. This is a lack of transparency that will return to haunt your efforts.\*\*

Your boundaries for districts like Altadena, CA place a small city's "community of interests" with far distant cities like Santa Clarita and Upland, not the nearest major city where local citizens work, shop, play, send their children to school, and get on the nearest freeway! Legislators representing similar districts would have little or no influence in the nearest school district, water district, and major civic government for most of their citizens.

Such legislators would also have to try to reconcile the highly divergent water interests of locations like Santa Clarita, Altadena and Upland, to give but one example, resulting in ineffective representation for all, and effective representation for none on most issues.

You require many civic leaders to deal with 2 or 3 legislators, all with far distant constituencies to reconcile and satisfy, instead of just one local legislator with shared interests. Again, the result is effective representation for none.

Sacrificing other legally mandatory and praiseworthy goals on the politically correct altar of purely ethnic boundaries does not satisfy any goals of good representation or fairness.

Creating a private fiefdom for any ethnic group only deprives the remaining local majority of fair representation, whether members of a "protected class" or not.

The Voting Rights Act, and associated decisions, requires fair representation for all, not a grant of suzerainty to a protected class, making all other citizens present representing the actual majority - their involuntary and unrepresented vassals.

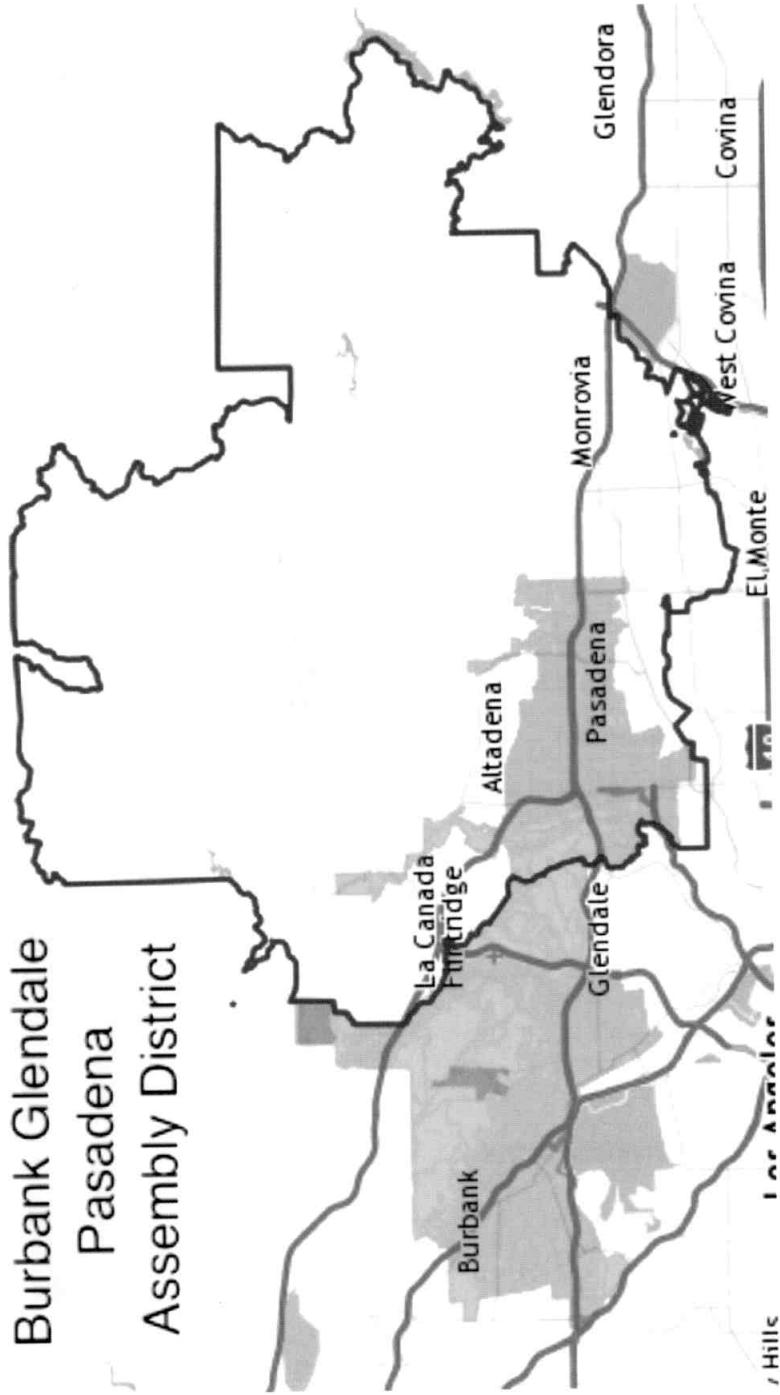


Assembly District spanning Arcadia, San Marino, Temple City, South Pasadena, Alhambra, and Monterey Park.

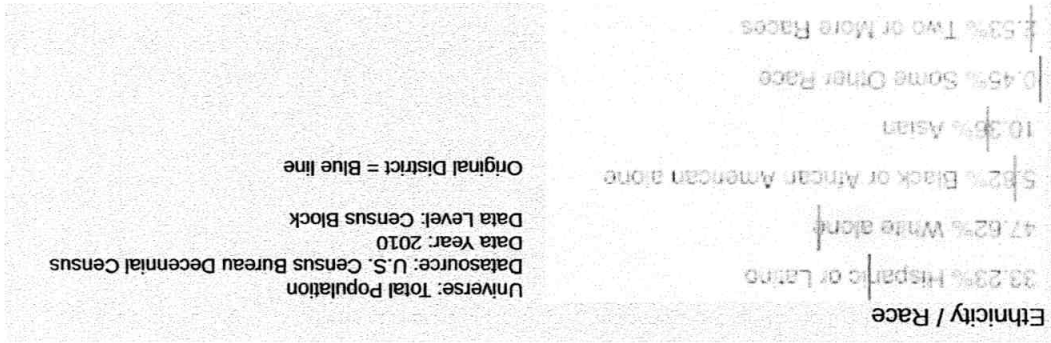
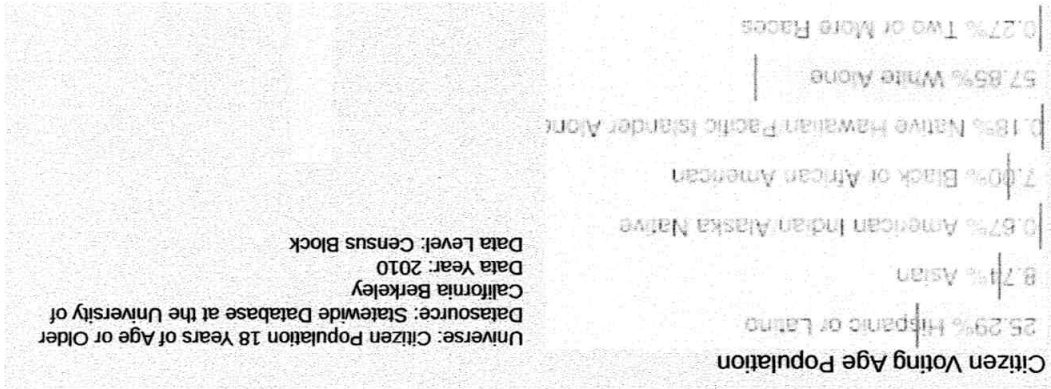
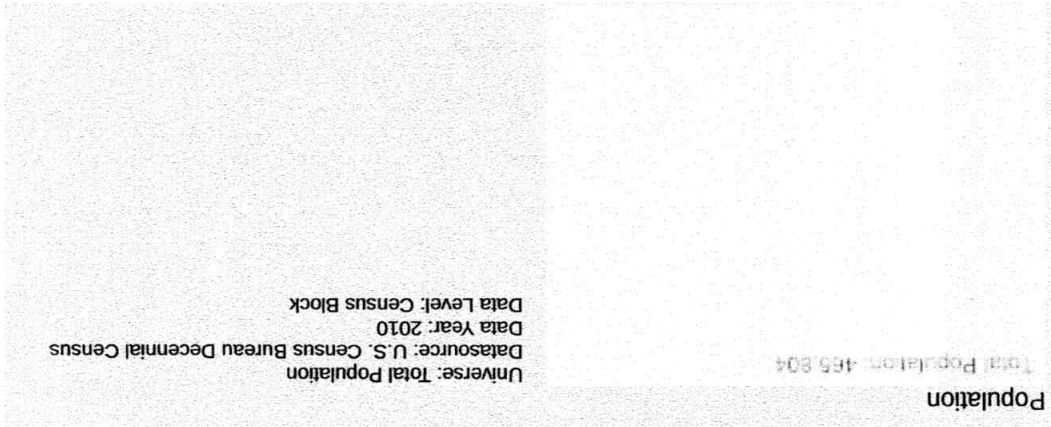
# Assembly District Burbank, Glendale proposed revision June 13, 2011



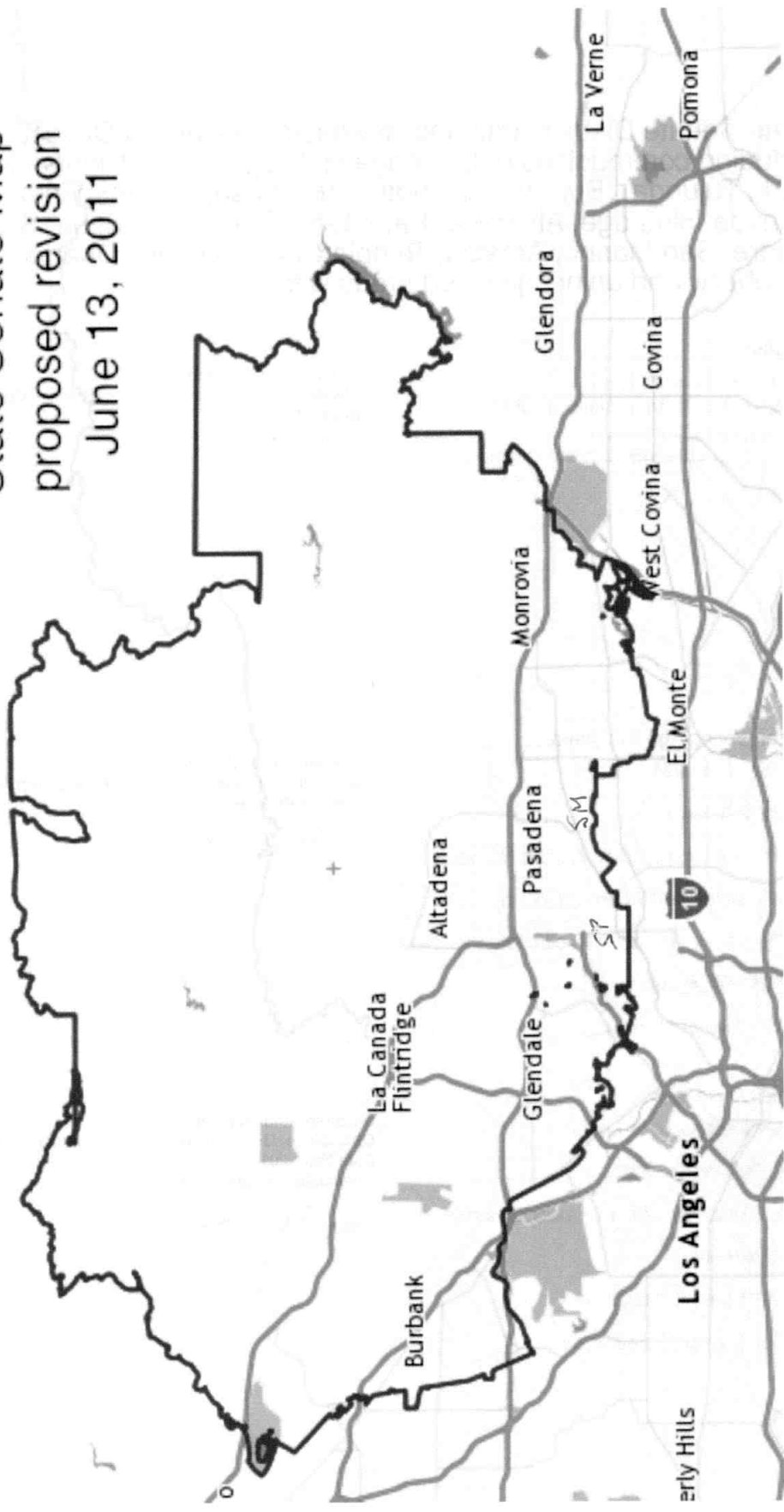

# Assembly District spanning the bordering communities of the San Gabriel Mountains

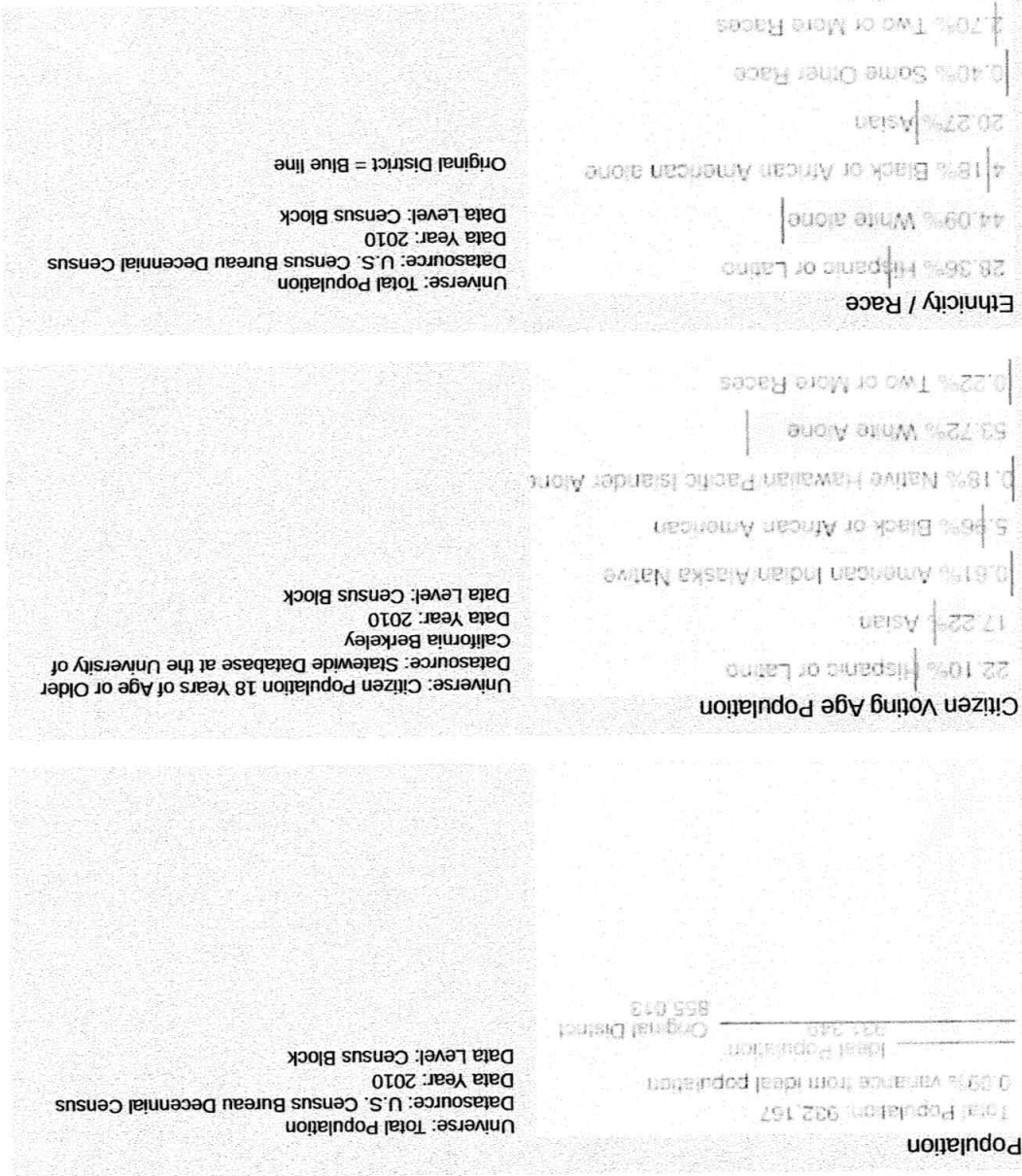


State Senate Map

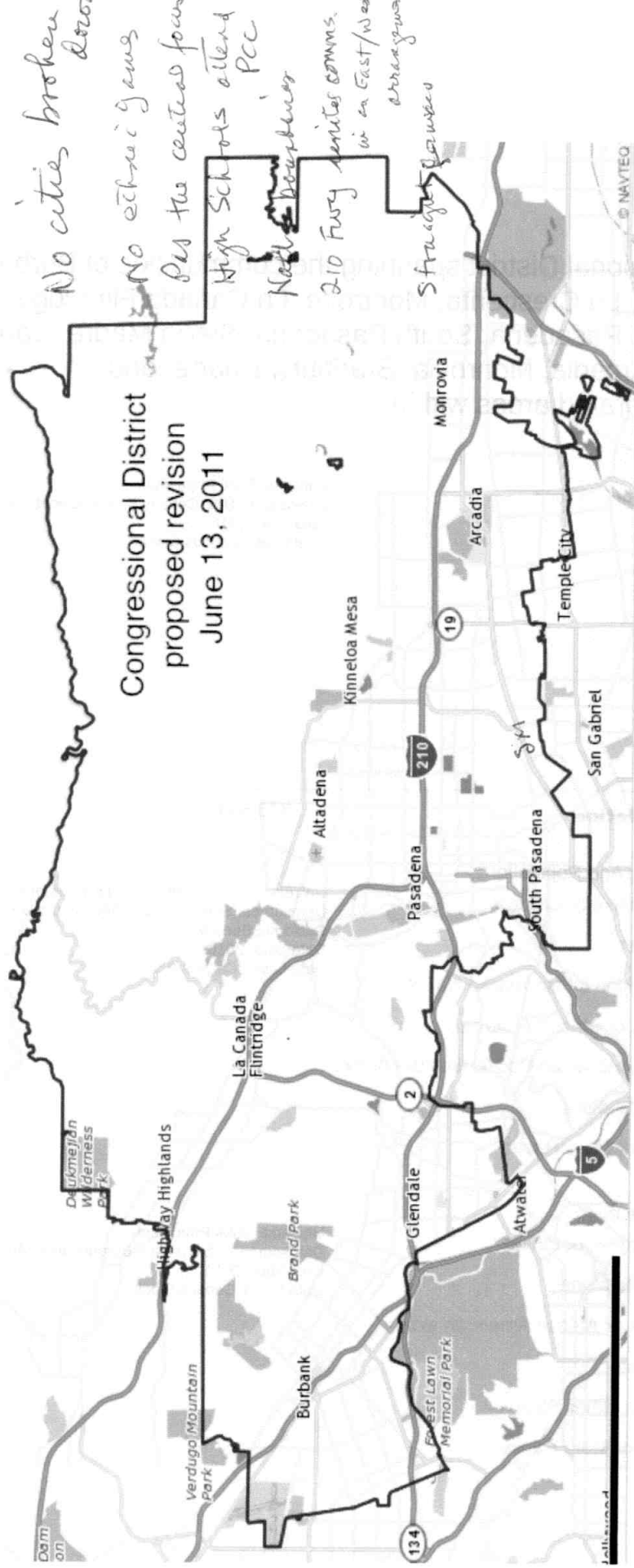
