My name is Oscar Ramos, and I am a resident of the Greater Golden Hill neighborhood, just east of downtown San Diego. I have been eagerly awaiting the release of your draft map of San Diego, and I have a concern about the southern boundary on the western edge of the proposed district.

Golden Hill is contained by the I-5 to the west, the 94 to the south, the I-805 to the east, and it flows north into other neighborhoods.

Currently, you have an east/west-running boundary, parallel to the 94 freeway (but a couple of blocks north of it).

I would like to request that you consider moving the boundary from paralleling the 94 to actually being the 94. This change would move the boundary a couple of blocks south, and would maintain the entire Golden Hill neighborhood intact.
