In reading the local paper this morning, I was shocked to learn that the proposed new and improved redistricting plan splits our city.

Surely this is a mistake. Is it possible that citizens of Redlands are expected to contact separate representatives to argue for our interests? Can you imagine that the north and eastern sides of Redlands have more in common with California residents over 300 miles away (6+ hours by car) than with their neighbors, customers, schoolmates on the next corner?

Please reconsider the boundaries to keep Redlands discreet, preferably within the San Bernardino district. In fact, it would be preferable to keep all the Inland Empire cities together as we are all similarly interested in economic solutions for our region which has suffered disproportionately.

Effective representation in California and federally depends on strength in numbers. Therefore, we are hopeful that the California Citizens Redistricting Commission will allow us to be counted with our neighbors, particularly with those within our own city boundaries.
