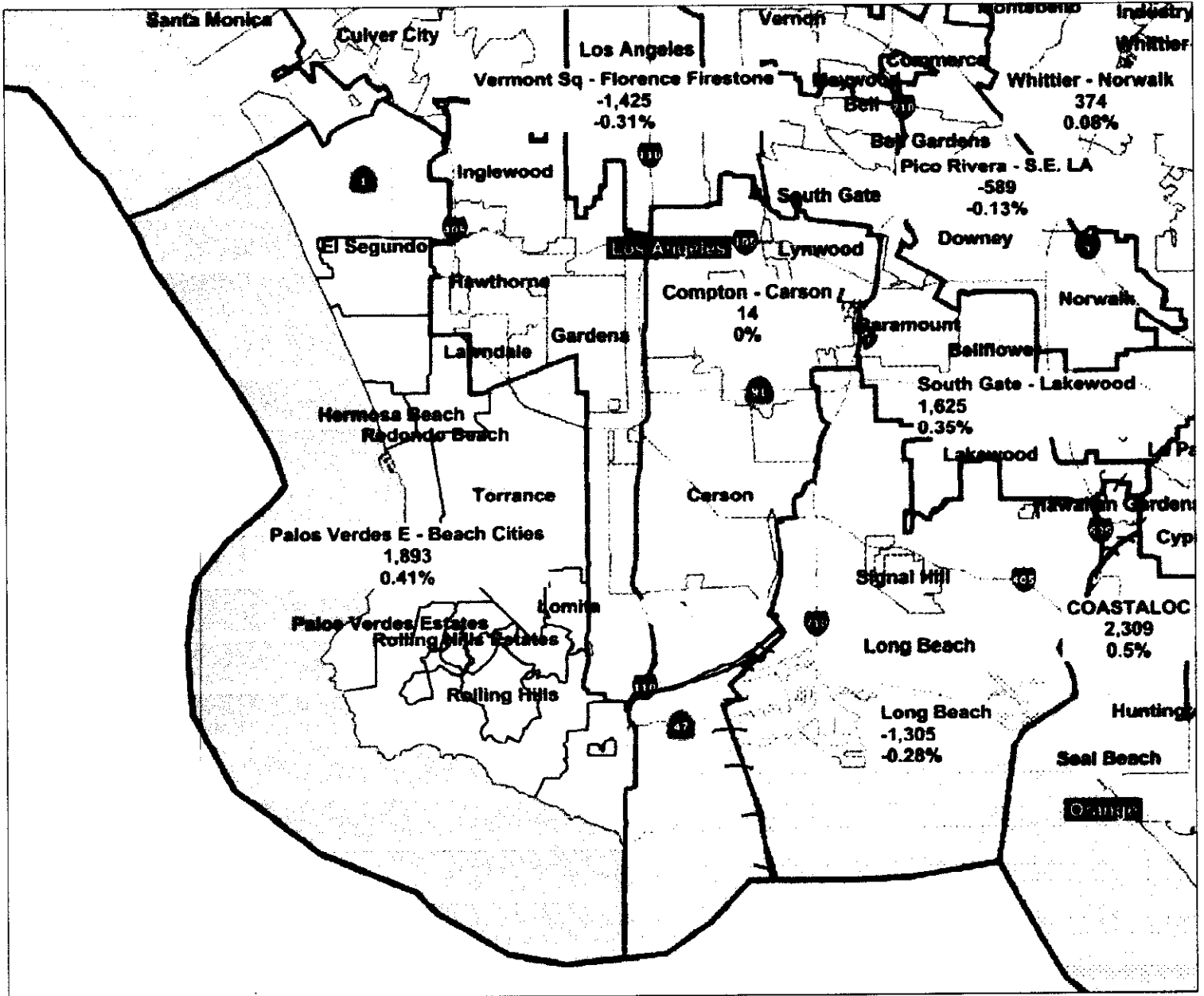
California State Assembly - Long Beach

RE: Objection to Redistricting "ROSSMOOR, CALIFORNIA 90720"

Dear Commissioners:

My wife and I are 12 year residents of Rossmoor, a large, unincorporated residential community in Northwest Orange County. We were shocked and are extremely upset that your commission has moved Rossmoor and Los Alamitos in the first draft of the proposed new California Congressional Districts from an Orange County-based Congressional District (currently District 40, represented by Congressman Ed Royce) to the proposed LA County-based LBPORT Congressional District. The LBPORT Congressional District is dominated by the large cities of Long Beach, Lakewood and Paramount. Including Rossmoor and Los Alamitos in the LBPORT Congressional District where we have no political or community interest seems wholly inconsistent with your motto of "Fair Representation-Democracy at Work!" We believe that inclusion of Rossmoor and Los Alamitos in the LBPORT Congressional District will result in NO REPRESENTATION for our communities and we are adamantly opposed to the California Congressional Districts as you have proposed in the first draft for the following reasons:

- We have no political relationship with the City of Long Beach (or Lakewood or Paramount for that matter) or the County of Los Angeles and we have no desire to have one;
- Rossmoor and Los Alamitos, with about 10,600 and 11,200 residents respectively, would have no effective political influence in a district so dominated by Long Beach (Long Beach, the second largest city in the Greater Los Angeles area, would have over 65% of the population of the LBPORT District);
- My wife and I moved from LA County to Orange County 12 years ago because we were wholly dissatisfied with the political climate in LA County and we do not want to be forced back now;
- We are active in our community and in Orange County and we strongly believe that it is critical to have our Congressional representative Orange County based;
- We believe that the Los Alamitos Joint Forces Training Base is a key local, regional and national asset. Its immediate neighbors, Rossmoor, Los Alamitos, Seal

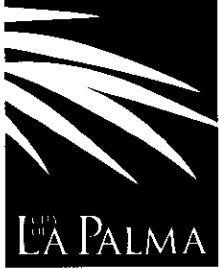
Beach, Cypress and Garden Grove have been actively involved with the Base for years. Our Congressman, Ed Royce, has been instrumental in protecting the Base. The first draft of the proposed California Congressional Districts would rip the key Congressional representation out of Orange County and give it to a Congressional district dominated by Long Beach, which has had no history, experience or connection with the Base.

- The San Gabriel River and 605 Freeway in our area have acted as a physical barrier between LA County and Orange County and we have very little interest in, knowledge of or community with Long Beach, nor they with us.
- On the other hand, Rossmoor and Los Alamitos have a strong and significant community of interest with Seal Beach (we share the same school system and use their adjacent shopping centers), with Cypress and Garden Grove (we share with Seal Beach and Los Alamitos an effective regional “mayors” council for response to regional issues and Los Alamitos, Seal Beach and Cypress share a police dispatch system) and with Orange County, which constitutes Rossmoor’s primary government and on which we interface on a whole list of issues from transportation to government structure. We believe our Congressional representative needs to be Orange County based so he or she effectively understands and represents our needs that are so closely intertwined with our neighboring communities and with Orange County.
- In the past, Congressional support has been critical for our community in dealing with our neighbors and with Orange County. We believe that support is stronger because our Congressman, like our other elected representatives, is Orange County-based.
- Finally, our Congressman, Ed Royce, has done an incredible job representing our interests in Washington and in Orange County. He is simply the best and most responsive elected official we have ever had the privilege of electing. He has served Rossmoor exceptionally well for years and has a strong and deep knowledge of and commitment to our community and needs. My wife and I would be personally devastated to lose his service.

For the above reasons, and to meet your goal of redrawing districts that provide “Fair Representation”, we urge you to reconsider your proposal to include Rossmoor and Los Alamitos in Congressional District LBPORT-1 and return them to the Orange County-based LHYL-1.


SUBJECT: City of La Palma – Communities of Interest

The City of La Palma would like to thank the California Citizens Redistricting Commission (CCRC) for providing a more transparent redistricting process and for extending the deadline for public comments regarding the first draft maps. On June 21, 2011, the La Palma City Council deliberated regarding the proposed Congressional, State Senate, and State Assembly district maps. Unfortunately, the City Council cannot support these maps as currently drafted, especially the "Long Beach Port" Congressional district map which places La Palma with a variety of Los Angeles County cities.

La Palma's interests are more closely matched with the Orange County cities of Cypress, Buena Park, Fullerton, and Los Alamitos. With most of these cities, La Palma shares school districts, fire protection services, emergency ambulance providers, coordinated recreation activities, regional water delivery functions, sanitation services, waste and recycling contractors, animal control providers, court liaison services, and local newspapers. Further, these communities are mostly small suburban "bedroom" communities that went through a building boom in the 1950's-60's and now have increasing Asian populations, specifically Korean Americans in many cases.

For these reasons, the La Palma City Council respectfully requests that the CCRC adjust the proposed maps to place La Palma within districts that are more closely aligned with the joint interests of the Cities of Cypress, Buena Park, Fullerton, and Los Alamitos. Thank you for accepting our comments and considering their impact on our community.

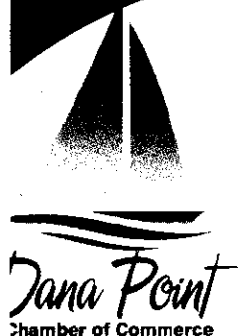

At its June 13, 2011 meeting, the Dana Point City Council voted unanimously to object to the California Citizens Redistricting Commission's first round of draft maps for State Assembly and State Senate district boundaries relevant to Dana Point. The Dana Point City Council also unanimously approved a Resolution, which opposes any state Assembly or Senate redistricting plan that would (a) divide the City geographically and/ or (b) place the City outside of any state Senate or Assembly districts that do not include our neighboring south Orange County cities.

The Dana Point City Council formally opposes the redistricting proposal released on June 10, 2011 and any other proposal by which the City is split into multiple districts. Under the current map draft, the City of Dana Point would be split into two different State Assembly districts. Thank you for furnishing the first draft of the new redistricting lines for State and Federal representation and voting process. I commend your efforts on this challenging project that will benefit all residents of California regardless of political registration.

You have made Long Beach whole again which all residents of our city appreciate. It will be easier for good governance when the city officials that we elect can properly interface with elected state and congressional representative concerning our city's specific interests.

At the Long Beach hearing there were also comments on the need to have better focus on the port activities that includes both LA port and Long Beach port. Since there are few residents in the LA port area, I would suggest you relook at the possibility to include the LA port interests with Long Beach rather than place it with a district that runs all the way north past 105 freeway that has interests other than the port activity.

Reviewing the lines beginning with the state assembly district I submit that it would be logical to remove Hawaiian Gardens and even the north west corner of Long Beach that is west of the 710 freeway. Then pick up the LA port and coast line to the line for P.V. East Beach cities district begins. This would allow all coastal issues to be better represented with the California State Coastal commission and other agencies.

The next district count for congressional representation, the same concern applies. In the 702,000 needed for the congress representative it makes more sense to move the Paramount resident into the Compton district and put the LA port and San Pedro residents not already in the P.V. East Beach city district in with the Long Beach district. Also it would be best to move La Palma out from the north east portion of Long Beach district and adjust the congressional line to include Seal Beach residents rather than La Palma for more common interest with Long Beach residents.

For State Senate district the same suggestion applies. To better address the state coastal issues and these residents' concern for focus on clean water and air issues at the port and beaches, combining the Long Beach assembly district with the Palos Verdes E. Beach Cities would give a better common interest interface with all state agencies.

In all cases the LA port and Long Beach port interface with state and federal should be the same elected official. I have attached support letters from neighbors who also support these additional adjustment requests. Thank you for your consideration on this important point.
