In particular, as a resident of Felton, it appears I will once again be lumped with Silicon Valley. Since that interest is shared by people from Monterey to Sacramento, it's not a strong enough basis for drawing a congressional district boundary.

The interests of people in Santa Cruz County lie together and I would like to see us grouped together. You cannot possibly convince me that those of us living in the woods in the Santa Cruz Mountains have stronger cultural, environmental, economic, or civic

ties to the suburbs of Sunnyvale than we do to the cities along the Santa Cruz coast.

Please do the sensible thing and draw a line across the top of the mountains (or slightly to the northern side, but south of Los Gatos and Saratoga) and give us our votes back.
