Santa Rosa is the hub of the North Bay, and should remain in the same district as the majority of Sonoma and Marin Counties. The "North Bay", particularly Marin and Sonoma Counties, are tightly linked economically, politically, culturally, and geographically, and should be represented together. I believe the Commission's draft map is a step in the wrong direction. The old boundaries made a lot more sense. Yes, Sonoma and Marin Counties are very liberal, but that's no accident. We work and live here because we share common values, and we tend to vote members of the community who share those values to represent us. There is nothing wrong with that. I imagine putting Santa Rosa and Yuba City more or less evens out the rolls of Democrats and Republicans, but it still smacks of gerrymandering, eve!
