I understand that there is a hearing tonight in San Francisco on proposed redistricting but I cannot attend that meeting. I hope that my comments here will be included in the public record.

I am a native Californian, 58 years old, and I have always paid attention to civic affairs. I have lived in Sonoma County for 14 years and am very involved with many local organizations. I have heard that the proposal for new state senate districts includes dividing our county with part of it being combined with regions in the Central Valley in a new district. This makes no sense at all and would be a disservice to residents of all areas. How can someone represent the interests of people who have no geographic connection? The environmental, water, transit, economic and demographic issues are entirely different in Sonoma County than they are in Lodi or Woodland.

I believe that especially looking forward to climate change and the need for more local self-reliance, it is more important than ever that districts be geographically linked with features like watersheds and access to food production as well as transit connections being crucial connecting factors.

Please keep the North Coast regions connected, as they belong.
