It seems very haphazard to have part of the City of Temecula attached to the 50th Congressional district which is mostly in North County San Diego, while the other half is attached to an area including Corona and Norco (why?!?) and to have it similarly divided for State Assembly. Temecula is a fairly solid (if a bit mixed) community with unique concerns and particular circumstances, it would not be in the community's interest to divide it between two different districts. Please reconsider moving all of Temecula into one area or another for both the Assembly and Congressional districts.
