USHS cares for our community's most vulnerable residents, providing housing, supportive services, emergency shelter, and job retraining for the homeless. As an organization, we are greatly concerned that removing the wealthy and influential neighborhoods on the western side of our community will adversely impact our ability to advocate for and care for our clients.

Honorable Chair and Members of the Commission:

Please accept the following comments from the City of Hidden Hills on the latest visualization maps prepared by the Citizens Redistricting Commission.

The five communities of Hidden Hills, Agoura Hills, Calabasas, Malibu, and Westlake Village comprise the Las Virgenes Malibu Council of Governments (COG), and are deeply connected communities. These five COG cities have been working together for many years, and are a prime example of a "community of interest" as defined by the California Constitution (a contiguous population which shares common social and economic interests). As we have stated in earlier letters, we believe our COG cities should remain together in any and all districts established. On the new visualization maps, the proposed Senate District encompasses four of our five cities, but excludes Malibu. The proposed Assembly maps place our COG cities into three different districts - Hidden Hills and Calabasas in one, Agoura Hills and Malibu in another, and Westlake Village in yet another. The Congressional maps totally decimate our COG, placing Hidden Hills alone with portions of the Western San Fernando Valley, and separating Westlake Village into a completely different district, while placing the remaining three cities (Agoura Hills, Calabasas, and Malibu) in yet another district. This type of division may make it very difficult for the five cities to continue to function as a closely knit community.

In addition to being a part of the beautiful Santa Monica Mountains area along with the other COG cities, we are also linked to our neighboring communities by the following: as contract cities, we are all serviced by the Malibu Lost Hills Sheriff Station and the L.A. County Fire Department; the Las Virgenes Unified School District and the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District service four of our cities; the *Acorn* is the only newspaper covering local news and city activities in our region; all five cities share a Hazard Mitigation Plan that was prepared through the COG. Sharing common goals and working together for the benefit of the entire region and all of our residents is very important to smaller cities such as ours to give us a unified voice.

Again, we would respectfully request that the cities of Hidden Hills, Agoura Hills, Calabasas, Malibu, and Westlake Village be placed together in all legislative districts, to allow us to maintain our long existing COG and to continue to work together to best address our common interests in relation to public safety, water quality, emergency preparedness, education, transportation, traffic, air quality, and any other issues that affect our cities and our region.


