PETITION TO THE CALIFORNIA CITIZENS' REDISTRICTING COMMISSION

We the undersigned hereby request that the California Citizen's Redistricting Commission permit Commissioner Michael Ward file a minority report explaining his reasons for voting against the state and federal legislative districts in California.

The Commission's Code of Conduct requires commissioners to "disclose information that belongs in the public domain freely and completely." Article 21 of the state Constitution, provides in Section 2(a) that the commission shall "conduct an open and transparent process enabling full public consideration of and comment on the drawing of district lines."

These goals and criteria will not be met if Commissioner Ward is muzzled. All Commissioners should be allowed to file a full and complete minority report to the public on the Commission website and to the media.

It's more important in my view to group similar neighborhoods together, than it is to keep any particular city within a single district. In other words I disagree with Matt Henry's views expressed in http://www.mercurynews.com/ci_18672359

If Belle Haven has 1/2 or 1/3 the median household income of the other part of Menlo Park; if the rest of Menlo Park votes the opposite of Belle Haven on many issues -- well, why **should** Belle Haven be in their district? Belle Haven's votes would be nullified, wouldn't they?

Here's what I wrote in response to the above article:

Ms Samuels,

It's a tough question, isn't it? On one hand, people like Matt Henry don't want to see Menlo Park divided by congressional district lines; on the other hand, it's also important that groups of people who might vote similarly have their votes mean something. If a majority black/Hispanic neighborhood is glommed together with a polar-opposite Menlo Park, that neighborhood's votes are essentially nullified. This is the sort of inequity that the redistricting commission is supposed to correct.

There's a neighborhood in Menlo Park where black families are not welcome, and I mean repeated acts of vandalism, and we're talking corporate VP parents and private-school kids. Do you think Menlo Park has only one such neighborhood? And do you think the rest of Menlo Park would vote with Belle Haven on many issues? Any issue?
