PETITION TO THE CALIFORNIA CITIZENS' REDISTRICTING COMMISSION

To whom it may concern:

The Commission's Code of Conduct requires commissioners to "disclose information that belongs in the public domain freely and completely."

Article 21 of the state Constitution, provides in Section 2(a) that the commission shall "conduct an open and transparent process enabling full public consideration of and comment on the drawing of district lines."

These goals and criteria will not be met if Commissioner Ward is muzzled.

All Commissioners should be allowed to file a full and complete minority report to the public on the Commission website and to the media.

The reason that I am concerned with this, personally, is that I had submitted my petition for the district lines for Westchester, map #43, to be grouped with our sister communities of Playa del Rey and Playa Vista, which surround us.
