### California Disability Population

People with disabilities are a part of all communities!
Disability is Rarely Captured

- Data from American Community Survey (ACS)
- Center for Disease Control and Prevention(CDC)
- Likely even higher

### **Diverse Types of Disabilities**

Individuals can have more than one disability. Examples of disabilities:

- Sensory Disability
- Mental Health disability
- Learning disability

## Diverse Types of Disabilities cont.

- Mobility Disability
- Developmental Disabilities
- Traumatic Brain Injury

#### **Building a Culture of Access**

- Reasonable Accommodation
- Inquire about Access Needs
- Dedicated staff for access provisions
- ADA and other federal and state law compliance
- Working with partner agencies to ensure access

#### Accessible Materials & Communications

- Plain language
- ASL and Captioning
- Acceptable document formats
- 14 point Arial font printed materials (28 font for presentations), Braille
- Image descriptions (alt text)
- Audio descriptions (video)
- Clear, slow communication

### **Accessible Virtual Meetings**

- Simple registration process
- Accessible platform
- ASL/captioning
- Explaining accessible features (shortcut keys)
- Meeting agenda and time
- Identify who is speaking
- Plain language (avoid jargon, acronyms)
- Clear communication (turn taking)
- Describe visual contents
- Phone-in option
- Staff available for access support

#### Accessible In-Person Meetings

- Simple registration process
- ADA Accessible location/navigational spaces
- Parking, public transportation
- ASL, captioning (CART)
- Meeting agenda and time
- Develop process to request to speak
- Identify who is speaking

#### Accessible In-Person Meetings cont.

- Required microphone use for all speakers
- Assistive listening devices
- Plain language (avoid jargon, acronyms)
- Clear communication (turn taking)
- Describe visual contents
- Phone-in, video options
- Staff available for access support
