## A BILL

- To modify the deadlines for completing the 2020 decennial census of population and related tabulations, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Fair and Accurate
  - 5 Census Act".
  - 6 SEC. 2. CENSUS DEADLINE MODIFICATION.
  - 7 Notwithstanding the timetables provided in sub-
  - 8 sections (b) and (c) of section 141 of title 13, United
  - 9 States Code, and section 22(a) of the Act entitled "An

1	Act to provide for the fifteenth and subsequent decennial
2	censuses and to provide for apportionment of Representa-
3	tives in Congress", approved June 18, 1929 (2 U.S.C.
4	2a(a)), for the 2020 decennial census of population—
5	(1) the tabulation of total population by States
6	required by subsection (a) of such section 141 for
7	the apportionment of Representatives in Congress
8	among the several States shall be—
9	(A) completed and reported by the Sec-
10	retary of Commerce (referred to in this section
11	as the "Secretary") to the President within 13
12	months after the decennial census date of April
13	1, 2020; and
14	(B) made public by the Secretary not later
15	than the date on which the tabulation is re-
16	ported to the President under subparagraph
17	(A);
18	(2) the President shall transmit to Congress a
19	statement showing the whole number of persons in
20	each State, and the number of Representatives to
21	which each State would be entitled under an appor-
22	tionment of the then existing number of Representa-
23	tives, as required by such section 22(a), and deter-
24	mined solely as described therein, within 14 days

- after receipt of the tabulation reported by the Sec retary; and
- (3) the tabulations of populations required by 3 subsection (c) of such section 141 shall be completed 4 5 by the Secretary as expeditiously as possible after the census date of April 1, 2020, taking into account 6 the deadlines of each State for legislative apportion-7 ment or districting, and reported to the Governor of 8 9 the State involved and to the officers or public bodies having responsibility for legislative apportion-10 ment or districting of that State, except that the 11 tabulations of population of each State requesting a 12 tabulation plan, and basic tabulations of population 13 14 of each other State, shall be completed, reported, and transmitted to each respective State within 16 15 16 months after the decennial census date of April 1, 17 2020.

### 18 SEC. 3. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR 2020 CENSUS.

On the first day of each month during the period beginning on the date of enactment of this Act and ending on July 31, 2021, the Director of the Bureau of the Census shall submit to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs of the Senate, the Committee on Appropriations of the Senate, the Committee on Oversight and Reform of the House of Representatives, and

1	the Committee on Appropriations of the House of Rep-
2	resentatives a report regarding the 2020 decennial census
3	of population that contains the following information:
4	(1) The total number of field staff, sorted by
5	category, hired by the Bureau compared to the num-
6	ber of field staff the Bureau estimated was nec-
7	essary to carry out the census.
8	(2) Retention rates of the field staff described
9	in paragraph (1).
10	(3) Average wait time for call center calls and
11	average wait time for each language provided.
12	(4) Anticipated schedule of census operations.
13	(5) Total appropriations available for obligation
14	for the census and a categorized list of total dis-
15	bursements.
16	(6) Nonresponse Follow-up, Update Enumerate,
17	and Update Leave completion rates by geographic
18	location.
19	(7) Anticipated schedule and completion rates
20	for Group Quarters (including Service-based Enu-
21	meration and Targeted Non-Sheltered Outdoor Lo-
22	cation operations), Enumeration of Transitory Loca-
23	tion, and Remote Alaska operations.

(8) Self-response rates by geographic location.

1	(9) Total spending to date on media, advertise-
2	ments, and partnership specialists, including geo-
3	graphic and demographically targeted breakdowns of
4	the spending.
5	(10) Post-enumeration schedule and subsequent
6	data aggregation and delivery progress.
7	(11) Post-enumeration survey schedule and
8	completion progress, including anticipated schedule
9	for release of results from the coverage measurement

6	CATION.—In this section, the term "institution of higher
7	education" has the meaning given the term in section $102$
8	of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1002).
9	(d) Sunset.—The authority under this section shall
10	expire at the conclusion of 2020 decennial census oper-
11	ations.
12	SEC. 5. LIMITATION.
13	The Bureau of the Census may not compile, produce,
14	or publish any data product or tabulation as part of, in
15	combination with, or in connection with, the 2020 decen-
16	nial census of population or any such census data pro-
17	duced under section 141(e) of title 13, United States
18	Code, that includes topics specific to the 2020 decennial
19	census that were not part of—
20	(1) the report submitted under section
21	141(f)(1) of that title on March 28, 2017; and
22	(2) the 2018 End-to-End Census Test con-
23	ducted in Providence County, Rhode Island.

#### 1 SEC. 6. FUNDING.

- (a) APPROPRIATION.—There is appropriated to the
- 3 Bureau of the Census, out of amounts in the Treasury
- 4 not otherwise appropriated, for additional amounts for
- 5 "Periodic Censuses and Programs", \$400,000,000 for fis-
- 6 cal year 2020, to remain available through fiscal year
- 7 2021.
- 8 (b) Use of Funds.—The amounts made available
- 9 under subsection (a) shall be used to address the impacts
- 10 of the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) on the 2020
- 11 decennial census, and to support enhanced 2020 decennial
- 12 census activities, including-
- (1) additional mailings to households that have
- 14 not self-responded;
- 15 (2) expanded communications and advertising
- 16 targeted to low self-response communities in rural
- 17 and urban areas, Native villages, and on Tribal
- 18 lands;
- (3) targeted outreach to the location of the
- 20 2018 End-to-End Census Test;
- 21 (4) increased in-language outreach and assist-
- 22 ance;
- 23 (5) expanded Census Questionnaire Assistance
- 24 capacity;

1	(6) expanded field operations to enumerate peo-
2	ple experiencing homelessness at service-based facili-
3	ties and non-sheltered locations; and
4	(7) a modified Questionnaire Assistance Center
5	operation that includes mobile and fixed locations of-
