Hello!

I am a resident of Walnut Creek and Senate District 7, and in the 2021 redistricting, I urge you to substantially redraw SD7 by moving it north and making it much more closely match the borders of Contra Costa County and CA-11. An area that more closely matches those area's borders would allow SD7's representative to work more closely with CA-11's Congressperson and the Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors and to focus on the very real issues unique to CA-11 and Contra Costa County - and I would absolutely define the County as a community of interest in every way.

In that spirit, I would urge the Citizens Redistricting Commission to include West Contra Costa County, such as Richmond, San Pablo, Pinole, and Hercules, in SD7, and to move Dublin, Pleasanton, and perhaps Danville and San Ramon (which, though a part of the County, are culturally much closer to Dublin/Pleasanton than to most of the County and SD7, and are in CA-15 rather than CA-11) to another district, while keeping Lamorinda/Walnut Creek/Concord and East Contra Costa County in SD7.
