1 PROCEEDINGS 2 Friday, December 3, 2021 11:02 a.m. CHAIR TOLEDO: Welcome to the California Citizens 3 4 Redistricting Commission. We've been working on 5 visualizations for the State Assembly maps, and we'll continue to do so today. We are going to start the day 6 7 off in Northern California, then move into Southern 8 California. And with that, we will start roll call. 9 Ravi --10 MR. SINGH: Thank you. 11 CHAIR TOLEDO: Could you please do roll call? 12 MR. SINGH: Thank you, Chair Toledo. 13 Commissioner Turner? 14 COMMISSIONER TURNER: Here. 15 MR. SINGH: Commissioner Vazquez. 16 COMMISSIONER VAZQUEZ: Here. 17 MR. SINGH: Commissioner Yee? 18 COMMISSIONER YEE: Here. MR. SINGH: Commissioner Ahmad? 19 20 COMMISSIONER AHMAD: Here. 21 MR. SINGH: Commissioner Akutagawa? 22 COMMISSIONER AKUTAGAWA: 2.3 MR. SINGH: Commissioner Andersen? Commissioner Fernandez? 24 25 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Presente.

1 MR. SINGH: Commissioner Fornaciari? 2 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Here. 3 MR. SINGH: Commissioner Kennedy? COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: Here. 4 5 MR. SINGH: Commissioner Le Mons? COMMISSIONER LE MONS: Aqui. 6 7 MR. SINGH: Commissioner Sadhwani? Commissioner Sinay? 8 9 COMMISSIONER SINAY: Aqui. 10 MR. SINGH: And I did get you, Commissioner 11 Sadhwani. Thank you. 12 Commissioner Taylor? 13 COMMISSIONER TAYLOR: Presente. 14 MR. SINGH: And Commissioner Toledo? 15 CHAIR TOLEDO: Present. 16 MR. SINGH: Roll call is complete, Chair. CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you very much. 17 18 Let's start with the line drawers. Let's go to 19 Northern California. So we have Tamina helping us today. 20 And let's bring up the map. 21 MS. RAMOS ALON: Good morning, Chair. Good morning, 22 Commissioners. We are back in the Bay Area, north. 23 Where would you like to start today? 24 CHAIR TOLEDO: So I'm just curious if you were able 25 to work on the San Francisco maps last night.

MS. RAMOS ALON: I was; would love to show you what I did.

CHAIR TOLEDO: All right, let's take a look. I hear there's been some success in shifting populations down.

MS. RAMOS ALON: There's been a lot of work done.

Let me turn on the neighborhood layer. So starting in

San Francisco, there were several requests, which I will

walk you through now. As you'll remember, we wanted to

balance at least the populations between WESTSF and

EASTSF. So the first request was to move east, the line

over here -- there was Marina on Van Ness, and move it

over east population, so that has kept Russian Hill full.

There was also a request to keep the Fillmore together, which is this area here, along with Japantown, which is this area. Japantown was also to be kept with Chinatown, which is up here, and they are both in EASTSF. Haight-Ashbury is whole again, as is The Castro. Twin Peaks is in with EASTSF, connected with Bernal Heights. And the areas of San Francisco County, which are part of other islands, were included with those islands, so this is going to be Angel Island block, which is incorporated with Tiburon. And the Alameda city block, which is with Alameda city.

The WESTSF district then comes down into Daly City,
Colma, and splits south San Francisco. This line has not

changed, so the Westborough and Buri Buri neighborhoods, which requested to be together and with Daly City, are still intact in this plan.

Coming down to SMATEO. This map keeps the North Fair Oaks census designated place, as well as North Fair Oaks COI together with this larger area of Redwood City, as well as the three Redwood City area COIs that exist right in here. The line that you're seeing is -- that you're seeing up here -- is El Camino Real. So areas towards the hills were kept together with Woodside, and areas which were more toward the railroad tracks were kept together with the North Fair Oaks area. This allowed no change to be made to GATOSCRUZ, and that was what allowed most of the balance of SOUTHPEN. You'll remember, is that a negative 8-point-something when we left it last night. And so that's one change.

And then the other was just a very slight line change to clean up this line between SUNNYTINO and SOUTHPEN, which is a little bit straighter now along the street, which results in SUNNYTINO and SOUTHPEN being at a negative 3.92 and negative 3.93.

One other thing that we looked at was the COIs in the Oakland split and the line that was there; so this just keeps one more COI together that wasn't together before. And that is all that we worked on.

1 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you, Tamina.

2 Commissioner Yee.

COMMISSIONER YEE: Yes. Thank you, Tamina. It's a pleasure working with you on these.

If we can zoom back into Redwood City, please. So of course, the discussion yesterday was how to keep Redwood City whole, and Tamina and I worked all different possibilities to try to do so, but found that it multiplied the splits in other COIs and cities, and so we decided to make this split hills versus bayside of Redwood City. Although an important split for Redwood City, it solved all those other problems, so we decided to make that split. This line through Redwood City does respect all the different COIs that we have received information on, and that includes that little corner of North Fair Oaks that goes into Atherton; that's why that line is there, to respect a COI that we received.

I think we did make a small change in San Jose as well on the outside to pick up another -- just a little bit of another COI. Yeah. So still, a little bit more population up the peninsula in San Francisco than we had hoped to be able to push down, but nevertheless, all the deviations are more comfortable now. So that's what we did.

CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you.



- 1 We will take comments.
- 2 Commissioner Akutagawa.
- 3 COMMISSIONER AKUTAGAWA: Yeah. Commissioner Yee and
- 4 Tamina, thanks for the work that you did. I think
- 5 | generally speaking, I think the Redwood City split seems
- 6 to work. I did read another COI testimony that said if
- 7 Redwood City split that El Camino Real would be a good
- 8 place to split because then it would keep at least the --
- 9 particularly the Pacific Islander COIs together.
- 10 Was just curious, in your exploration, did you
- 11 | find -- did you find a path -- a potential path to
- 12 | incorporating in Belle Haven, as well as East Palo Alto,
- 13 or was that just going to throw everything off
- 14 completely? And then just to the south of that, I also
- 15 | want to note that we heard quite a bit of recent
- 16 testimony about keeping Saratoga, Campbell, and
- 17 Cupertino, I believe, together, too. So I was just
- 18 curious as to, you know, any efforts around there or what
- 19 | the implications were going to be.
- 20 COMMISSIONER YEE: I believe, Tamina, you can speak
- 21 to the Belle Haven situation.
- 22 MS. RAMOS ALON: Sure. So Belle Haven is right here
- 23 | in Menlo Park. It would cause a split in Menlo Park and
- 24 give kind of the rest of this area nowhere to go. I did
- 25 try to take in East Palo Alto and Menlo Park, but it was

1 just a lot of population that I would have to shift out of Redwood City and other areas. So we did keep it 3 together and did not split Belle Haven, so it is intact 4 with East Palo Alto, it's just not with the rest of 5 Redwood City. COMMISSIONER YEE: And all the Pacific -- Asian 6 7 Pacific Islander COIs in Redwood City are whole and kept 8 together. 9 MS. RAMOS ALON: Yes. 10 COMMISSIONER YEE: The --MS. RAMOS ALON: All of the rest of them are 11 12 together in this -- in SMATEO with the greater Redwood 13 City and San Mateo-based district, as they had requested. 14 COMMISSIONER YEE: And then the Saratoga question. 15 MS. RAMOS ALON: And then the Saratoga -- I was -- I 16 actually did not look at this one. 17 Would you please repeat what that was, Commissioner 18 Akutagawa? Is Saratoga with? 19 COMMISSIONER AKUTAGAWA: Well, we received recent --20 quite a bit of recent testimony about Saratoga, Campbell, 21 and Cupertino being together. I guess they call 22 themselves the West Valley -- I guess the West Silicon 23 Valley cities, and they felt that they had more in common 24 then, I guess, Cupertino being attached elsewhere, but 25 those were the ones that are -- the cities that I recall

- 1 | hearing quite a bit about. Although, it does -- okay,
- 2 | I've seen another one that also includes the City of
- 3 | Santa Clara, as well as Sunnyvale in West San Jose. I
- 4 | think there's similar COI testimony that's speaking to
- 5 | the same thing, but it looks like the deviations would be
- 6 off if you were to try to incorporate all of them into a
- 7 | single district.
- 8 COMMISSIONER YEE: Yes, and I think there was other
- 9 COI testimony about Sunnyvale, Santa Clara, Cupertino
- 10 also, so I guess everybody likes Cupertino.
- 11 CHAIR TOLEDO: Great. So let's zoom out. Let's
- 12 | zoom out, and then let's get hands raised, comments.
- 13 | Let's start off with just general commentary and let's
- 14 keep it to a minute if -- all right. Let's start with
- 15 | Commissioner Ahmad.
- 16 | COMMISSIONER AHMAD: Thank you, Chair.
- 17 Just generally, I wanted to highlight the deviations
- 18 | in this area, particularly the peninsula going down;
- 19 they're all in the negatives. However, the geography in
- 20 this area kind of explains that a bit, right? So there
- 21 | is mountain ranges; there's only a certain geographical
- 22 | area where that is inhabitable by large populations. So
- 23 | when I was looking at this, trying to figure out how we
- 24 can get those numbers up more and closer to zero, it's
- 25 just difficult with the geographic landscape in this

1 area, so just wanted to highlight that. 2 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you, Commissioner Ahmad. 3 And can we have the terrain layer just so we can see 4 that? So we can see the mountainous areas. 5 Any other comment on this area, Commissioner Sinay? I think you had your hand raised a couple minutes ago. 6 7 I like this, I -- you know, and COMMISSIONER SINAY: I wanted to make sure that we weren't only looking at the 8 Asian and the Black, but there was also some Latino COIs, 10 and I think they're all in there. I would love to see it 11 with East Palo Alto, that southern part of Redwood City. 12 And I was trying to figure out -- originally in my notes 13 I had written that could we swap San Car -- you know, 14 move San Carlos to the southern district, but I don't 15 know if that works anymore. So that was my old notes. 16 CHAIR TOLEDO: So I do believe the priorities we set 17 yesterday were to try to get -- to try to get all of 18 Redwood City together, Menlo Park, and East Palo Alto. 19 don't believe that was possible, Tamina, based on not 20 being able to bring down enough population --21 Commissioner Yee, and maybe you can both speak to some of 22 the challenges in trying to keep San -- Redwood City 23 Whole and potentially connect them to the Menlo -- I believe it's East Palo Alto, and was it, East Menlo Park 24 25 area, I believe, was the COIs? But so I'll turn it over

1 to Commissioner Yee and Commissioner -- and Tamina to give some of the highlights over some of the challenges 3 that they experienced while doing that. And then after that, we'll go to Commissioner Turner and Akutagawa. 4 5 COMMISSIONER YEE: Right. So I mean, as Commissioner Ahmad mentioned, it's just geography, you 6 7 know? You have water on two sides and a narrow peninsula 8 with an even narrower band of highly-populated areas, so you know, that line between SMATEO and SOUTHPEN just has 10 to go somewhere. So I mean, if we moved it up to take 11 San Carlos, maybe we could, I don't know, do something 12 else, but unless there's strong -- a strong desire to do 13 that -- I mean, we can explore it, but you know. 14 CHAIR TOLEDO: Let's hear from the Commission: 15 Commissioner Turner, Commissioner Akutagawa, and others. 16 COMMISSIONER TURNER: Thank you. I see the area 17 that we're working on, San Mateo, SOUTHPEN, but in the 18 explanations, Tamina also mentioned Oakland. 19 wanted to name when we get ready for that conversation, I 20 have some changes I'd like to make there. 21 CHAIR TOLEDO: Yes. 22 COMMISSIONER TURNER: So I know we're planning to 23 move to Southern California after this, but at some 24 point, we will need to go back.

CHAIR TOLEDO: Oh, I'm planning to continue working

25

1 on all of Northern California. So I want to be done with all of California, and then move into Southern 3 California, so that is the plan. So yes, you'll have --4 we'll also have an opportunity to work on Alameda County, 5 Contra Costa County, and that portion of the Bay Area. 6 Commissioner Akutagawa. 7 COMMISSIONER AKUTAGAWA: Just to follow-up on Yeah. Commissioner Sinay's question, is it possible using the 8 9 same El Camino Real as maybe the kind of the dividing 10 line for, let's say, San Carlos and maybe even up into 11 Belmont? Would that be enough to be able to bring in 12 Menlo Park and East Palo Alto? I guess I am -- I mean, I 13 understand that, you know, East Palo Alto is, you know, 14 is just a -- you know, they're surrounded by some extreme 15 wealth, and yet they're the only one that really has that 16 more working class immigrant and it's in -- and of 17 multiple ethnicities there, and they're kind of the only 18 one in that district there, and I'm just kind of thinking 19 if there's a way to maybe combine them with the other 20 COIs that have similarities if that might just benefit 21 all of the people there in that area a little bit more. 22 But that's a question. 2.3 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you, Commissioner Akutagawa. 24 Commissioner Kennedy.

Thank you, Chair.

1 difficulties in bringing population down without splitting communities of interest. I'm just interested in hearing a little bit more because we started out with 3 4 EASTSF and WESTSF between them having something around 70 5 to 75,000 thousand people that potentially, we could have brought down, and yet we still seem to have that same 6 7 number. The lines have shifted, and so there's a little bit of population that moved from EASTSF to WESTSF, but as I see it, little to no population moved down the 10 peninsula from San Francisco itself -- or those two 11 districts -- East SF and West SF -- as a single unit, so 12 I just wanted to hear a little bit more about the 13 obstacles to that. Thank you. 14 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you, Commissioner Kennedy. 15 I think I'll speak a little bit of that. 16 So what I'm seeing in this map and -- and it 17 certainly is areas of great wealth and great disparities. 18 So we have communities like Daly City, South San 19 Francisco, where certainly large numbers of essential 20 workers live there. We heard from health care workers in 21 Daly City -- largely Filipino, we've heard from -- and 22 certainly the industrial workers and all kinds of 2.3 essential workers in that area, and then we hear -- then 24 we have Brisbane and other communities to the south that 25 are wealthier, and so there -- and the challenge is, I

1 Any other comments? Just want to hear from 2 everybody if we're comfortable with these districts and 3 these changes. 4 COMMISSIONER SINAY: Tamina has a comment. 5 CHAIR TOLEDO: Tamina. MS. ALTO: Thank you. Just wanted to point out to 6 7 Commissioner Kennedy's question, the one thing that I did 8 not explore was SMATEO does come right up to EASTSF. 9 Technically, we could link Brisbane with the southern 10 areas -- southeastern areas of San Francisco, adding this 11 valley -- Excelsior or Bayview to that area; that was not 12 explored and is an option if you would like to explore 13 it. 14 CHAIR TOLEDO: There's a potential option to try to 15 draw down -- bring down population from the southeastern 16 portion of San Francisco. Any thoughts on that? There 17 doesn't seem to be strong opinions on these, so it seems 18 like we're all comfortable with these maps. 19 Commissioner Sinay. 20 And I just want to speak that I am comfortable with 21 these maps; these maps appear to be aligned with our 22 priorities. 2.3 Commissioner Sinay. COMMISSIONER SINAY: I'm comfortable with the maps; 24 25 I'm not comfortable with taking that kind of east -- the

- 1 | southeast part out and putting it with Brisbane. We've
- 2 | had this conversation before. That's a lot of, you know,
- 3 traditionally disenfranchised communities in San
- 4 Francisco, and putting them with San Mateo, it feel -- it
- 5 | doesn't -- it just doesn't feel right.
- 6 CHAIR TOLEDO: And that's exactly my point, that
- 7 | there's a lot of disparity, there's a lot of -- and a lot
- 8 of wealth in this area and it's -- it is concentrated in
- 9 areas that make it difficult to unite communities of
- 10 | interest.
- 11 Any other comments?
- 12 | Commissioner Akutagawa?
- 13 COMMISSIONER AKUTAGAWA: I'm just wanting to back to
- 14 | the San Carlos Belmont question. Are we willing to --
- 15 | are we then not willing to split those cities so that we
- 16 can try to -- to try to bring East Palo Alto in with more
- 17 | aligned cities? Or -- It's just -- I've only seen it
- 18 because East Palo Alto's just kind of hanging out there
- 19 on their own, along with Belhaven.
- 20 But more East Palo Alto is -- is, as you've said,
- 21 | you know, in this kind of grouping of very affluent
- 22 areas. And a lot of them are those essential workers, as
- 23 | well as, you know, other low income communities, renters,
- 24 and others.
- 25 And so -- I -- and I mean, I -- I could live with

1 this, but I am concerned. I will say, I am very 2 concerned that they're just kind of out there. 3 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you, Commissioner Akutagawa --4 COMMISSIONER AKUTAGAWA: And so I'd rather split, 5 so. CHAIR TOLEDO: Well, yeah. Let's -- let's ask 6 7 Commissioner Yee. COMMISSIONER YEE: You know, it would be possible. 9 I wish that East Palo Alto were on the other side of Menlo Park. That would make it so much easier. 10 11 But if we're taking East Palo Alto, and then, we 12 have to take in Menlo Park. And we split it, or not. 13 And then, you know, the splits just multiply. Then 14 splitting San Carlos, splitting Belmont. Yeah. You 15 know, it just seems like a high price. 16 And the same is true for the questioning from Mr. 17 Kennedy about moving population down. I know we tried to 18 explore every possibility. Of course, it would be 19 better. But on the other hand, you know, the splits 20 would just multiply, COIs and cities. 21 And you know, as it is, we're still within our --22 our acceptable deviations. So it seemed like an 23 acceptable price to pay to maintain the -- the communities and cities that we do. 24 25 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you, Commissioner Yee.

1 In trying to bring alignment to some of the like socioeconomic communities, we talked about perhaps having more splits. But cities and COI, I think they're all on 3 4 the same level. And so I -- if we know -- and since we 5 have them identified, I would really like for us to consider splitting cities in order to keep like 6 7 communities together. CHAIR TOLEDO: Um-hum. 8 9 COMMISSIONER TURNER: I think the greater harm would 10 be in pairing communities that are much more affluent 11 with those that are not --12 CHAIR TOLEDO: Um-hum. 13 COMMISSIONER TURNER: -- as opposed to trying to 14 keep the city together. 15 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you. 16 Any specific thoughts about that? Is it 17 specifically East Palo Alto and some of the -- I believe 18 it's Eastern portions of Menlo Park that are within 19 the -- and Commissioner Yee and Tamina probably have COIs 2.0 identified a little better than I do. 21 COMMISSIONER TURNER: Just a note, Chair, on the 22 socioeconomic areas here. So looking at the option of 23 East Palo Alto and part of Menlo Park in to the S. Mateo 24 District, it's either going to be -- just from where it's 25 situated, it's either going to be with Stanford in

- Atherton, or it's going to be with Brisbane in Burlingame.
- So I'm not exactly sure which is poorer of those two
 areas, but -- or -- just thinking about, kind of, the -the trade that would need to be made. Because this
 Pacifica to Half Moon Bay area, even if you were to move
- 7 all of that population, it would literally move, like, a
- 8 line in Redwood City, just because of the way that the --
- 9 the density of the population in those areas are.
- So happy to look at those, but that's what we are looking at when we're trying it out yesterday.
- 12 CHAIR TOLEDO: And that's -- thank you for the 13 reality check, there. This is --
- 14 COMMISSIONER TURNER: Um-hum.
- 15 CHAIR TOLEDO: This is an area of great wealth and
 16 great disparities, and the disparities are -- I mean, a
 17 lot of these areas of -- with essential workers are
 18 changing and evolving quite quickly because of
- 19 affordability, as well.

RAMOS ALON: Belmont. 13 COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: Belmont, thank you. 14 I thought -- my thought around this was, what if we 15 were to put San Carlos and Belmont down into the 16 Gatos/Cruise (sic) district? Would that be enough to 17 open up opportunities to keep the entirety of Redwood 18 City, and/or bring in East Palo Alto and portions of 19 Menlo Park? 2.0 CHAIR TOLEDO: Tamina, can you speak to that? 21 MS. RAMOS ALON: Happy to try it, if you'd like. 22 CHAIR TOLEDO: Yes, go ahead. 2.3 COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: Yeah, I would be interested, 24 if other Commissioners want to --25 CHAIR TOLEDO: Well, let's --

I believe even last night, in our public comment, a 6 7 caller had specifically identified Belmont and San Carlos as possible swaps in this area. So I certainly don't 8 want to take credit for it, but -- I don't even know if 10 it'll work, but I figured it's worth just exploring 11 before we -- before we settle. 12 And I'm sure Commissioner Yee will have more in terms of the hills of Redwood City. I know he had 13 14 mentioned that. I would be curious to hear more about 15 those hills. 16 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you so much. 17 COMMISSIONER YEE: So yeah. I mean, if Redwood City were to be split, the hills versus the base side seem the 18 19 best split. But, of course, to keep Redwood City 20 entirely whole is even better, so. CHAIR TOLEDO: Commissioner Fornaciari? 21 22 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Yeah. What I -- what I'm 23 grabbing -- Pacific down -- I'm grabbing the whole West 24 San Mateo --25 CHAIR TOLEDO: Yes.

1 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: -- West of Skyline 2 Boulevard. And I'm getting, like, 70,000 people. CHAIR TOLEDO: Um-hum. 3 4 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: I mean, there's -- you 5 know, I mean, that's -- rather than splitting cities, if we move those South, and do -- well, I don't know if we 6 7 can do that rotation, actually. Okay. I'll retract my 8 statement. 9 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. Well, let's do this rotation, 10 and then, if there's other options, we can employ those. 11 Commissioner Akutagawa? 12 COMMISSIONER AKUTAGAWA: Yeah. Do we have to take 13 all of that portion of Menlo Park that goes along 14 Atherton and Stanford? It -- it just seems like -- just 15 that part that keeps Menlo Park continuous with East Palo 16 Alto is all that's needed. 17 CHAIR TOLEDO: Yeah. So we'd be doing a split for 18 Menlo Park, yes? I see consensus on that, so it's split. 19 COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: Okay. 2.0 CHAIR TOLEDO: Yeah. 21 And just wanting to make sure. It's been a long 22 time since I've lived in this area. 2.3 Is that -- the area that we're splitting, does that 24 have more in common with East Palo Alto, or with the Palo 25 Alto area?

1 Does any of the Commission members know? COMMISSIONER AKUTAGAWA: I believe it has a lot more in common with Palo Alto and Stanford than it does with 3 4 East Palo Alto. 5 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you, Commissioner --COMMISSIONER AKUTAGAWA: When I've driven through 6 there. 7 8 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. 9 Commissioner Ahmad and Commissioner Andersen? 10 COMMISSIONER AHMAD: Thank you, Chair. 11 Not related to what you were asking, but can we zoom 12 in on where we are splitting Menlo Park? CHAIR TOLEDO: We get this --1 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: -- you've got your other --3 you have --4 CHAIR TOLEDO: So --5 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: -- your other districts, as well. 6 7 CHAIR TOLEDO: So what I'm saying is, this change -if we go with the change with Belmont, we'd be pushing 8 9 population up. When we -- and what your statement -- it 10 wants us to -- well, we actually, at this point, need to 11 push population down. COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Right. And then continue 12 13 down, in terms of --14 CHAIR TOLEDO: Well, actually --15 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: -- some of the negative --16 yes. 17 CHAIR TOLEDO: Actually, we would get us into 18 compliance if we put population up at this point. 19 do see your point, in terms of trying to get population 20 down in the peninsula. 21 So Belmont is -- is everybody comfortable with 22 putting Belmont -- Belmont has how many people? 28,000 23 people -- into the San Mateo district? 24 MS. RAMOS ALON: Resulting deviations to S. Mateo 25 would be 0.21 percent. Resulting deviation to S. Pen

1 would be -5.89 percent. 2 CHAIR TOLEDO: Commissioner Fornaciari? Are you comfortable with that? 3 4 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: How are we going to fix an 5 excessively negative outcome? 6 CHAIR TOLEDO: Can you explain this excessively 7 negative outcome? COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Well, it -- South Pen's 8 9 going to be -6 percent. So I mean, we would have to --10 so we would --CHAIR TOLEDO: So we'd --11 12 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: -- split them --13 CHAIR TOLEDO: -- have to balance the population. 14 So at this point, given that this is something that we 15 can have Tamina work on off-line, let's see if we can 16 come --17 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Well --18 CHAIR TOLEDO: -- come to a consensus. 19 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: -- yeah. I have 20 suggestion, actually. 21 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. Let's hear your suggestion. 22 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: We could move Belmont 23 north, and then -- and then move more of Menlo Park back into South Pen. 24 25 CHAIR TOLEDO: And that seems like a fair

1 compromise. That would be what Commissioner Sadhwani and Commissioner Sinay had suggested earlier. Let's hear from Commissioner Andersen, and then, 3 let's make a decision. 4 5 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Yeah. I agree with Commissioner Fornaciari. 6 7 The other thing, though, I want to have a look at, if we go a little further south, is we've got quite a bit 8 9 of testimony about Los Gatos and Sunnyvale and --10 CHAIR TOLEDO: And we're going to be moving into 11 that direction --12 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Well --13 CHAIR TOLEDO: -- in that direction --14 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: But they're in --15 CHAIR TOLEDO: Do you want to look at it now? 16 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: But they're in South Pen. 17 Campbel --18 Um-hum. CHAIR TOLEDO: 19 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: -- Saratoga, Los Gatos -- they 20 all want to be with Cupertino, who they share a width, 21 and north. 22 And so I'm just wondering, how do we do that? CHAIR TOLEDO: So we're going to be getting down 2.3 24 there in a second.

So let's go back to the region that we're at.

1 Because we have to make a decision there, and then, we'll 2 come down and make decisions down there. Commissioner Fernandez? 3 4 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: So my question -- what did 5 you say, men -- what did you say, Neil? You said --CHAIR TOLEDO: Commissioner Fornaciari, can you 6 7 repeat your -- your recommendation for direction? COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Sure. If we -- if we make 8 9 the move to move Belmont into S. Mateo, then we can make 10 up some of that population by moving the border of Menlo 11 Park maybe up to Highway 84, and putting more of Menlo 12 Park back in South Pen. 13 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Okay. I guess my -- so if 14 we moved Belmont, we're going to get -- that district 15 will be at about zero. So then, it'll go back to 16 negative if you move Menlo -- is that right? Am I going 17 the wrong way with that? 18 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Right. They're -- but 19 they're all going to be negative. 2.0 CHAIR TOLEDO: So --21 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: And I quess that was my 22 concern. I was trying to fix all the negatives. 2.3 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Yeah, but you can't --24 CHAIR TOLEDO: There's --25 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: -- without pulling --

1 CHAIR TOLEDO: -- there's no way --COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: -- all that population down from San Francisco. And that was --3 4 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Yeah. 5 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: -- that was something we were struggling with before. 6 CHAIR TOLEDO: So we're --7 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: We're kind of getting there 9 if -- all right. 10 CHAIR TOLEDO: So do we want to shift more population from San Francisco? Is that a direction that 11 12 we want to continue to give? Or are we -- are we 13 comfortable with --14 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: My -- my point with having 15 that entire side of negative means that there's going to 16 be some other sides that have to take in that additional 17 population somewhere. So then, you're going to have 18 these -- these offsetting. Be it in Contra Costa, or 19 these other areas, will have to be positive. 2.0 So I was -- what I was trying to do is just balance 21 areas as we go through. But that's fine, if everyone 22 else is fine with it. 2.3 CHAIR TOLEDO: So the question becomes whether we --24 the difficulty in bringing down population in San 25 Francisco, which we've discussed, given that there are

Perhaps it's just a larger counterclockwise move, so that it might also enable some of the other adjustments that people are asking for on the east-based side to also occur. Without having to try to do it all on the -- on the peninsula side.

CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. So we have to make some decisions. And I believe -- let's hear from Commissioner Turner and Yee, and then, we will move on.

COMMISSIONER TURNER: Yeah. So Commissioner

Andersen earlier was looking at the southern part of the same district. And I don't know that she was necessarily going to go to a different district --

CHAIR TOLEDO: No.

COMMISSIONER TURNER: -- but a southern portion of South Pen. I'm wondering if there are opportunities there to move population into South Pen.

CHAIR TOLEDO: Can we look -- can we zoom out and see if all of these are -- they're negative? Yeah,

1 they're all negative. So we have negative 5, negative 2, negative 3, negative 1. Alum Rock has a little bit. COMMISSIONER TURNER: Um-hum. 3 CHAIR TOLEDO: Sunnyvale, Sunny -- Sunny Tino has --4 5 Sunny Tino has a 3.92 negative. Commissioner Ahmad? 6 7 COMMISSIONER AHMAD: Thank you, Chair. Just to go back to that piece on balancing these 9 populations. 10 So we made a commitment -- or we wanted to honor not 11 crossing the bridge, right? So that puts a hard boundary 12 for us on our starting point. 13 Working our way down the peninsula, it's going to be 14 negative. I don't see a way that we can get closer to 15 zero or in the positive without breaking up communities 16 of interest and cities, moving down the peninsula. It's 17 just the way that the population is distributed in this 18 area. 19 And like, Commissioner Yee, you mentioned earlier. 20 It's a narrow strip down the peninsula, with the more 21 concentrated areas that are populated. 22 So I don't know -- as long as we're in the 23 acceptable range of deviations, I think we should move on to the other criteria --24

CHAIR TOLEDO: Um-hum.

1	COMMISSIONER AHMAD: on our list.
2	CHAIR TOLEDO: I would agree.
3	And so and we do have a sufficient population in
4	San Francisco. We have positive population in San
5	Francisco. It's just the difficulty of bringing that
6	down. So we could bring it down, but it would be very
7	difficult without breaking up communities of interest up
8	there.

A caller had called in last night saying, don't give

up on Vineyard. Please, please keep trying to -- I wanted to see if there's agreement from the Commission.

It seemed like there was generally agreement yesterday, and then, we kind of let it go. But just to give Tamina the direction to try and work on that, to try and get Vineyard back in, so it's not with a rural district, and to create a more rural area.

And I don't think that's something we have to necessarily work on now, if --

CHAIR TOLEDO: That -- that would impact Sacramento. I think, yesterday, what we agreed on was that we could live with that. If now -- if we're changing our minds, and we can no longer live with that, then -- then we have to have -- that's a decision point. And I think because it impacts important areas in Sacramento, that would lead to some potential contentious issues. I think we'd have to work on trying to do it live line drawing.

So it's -- it's not something we can send -- Tamina to come back, and then end up having a larger conversation afterwards. Because we are running out of time.

But I do intend to bring that conversation to the



- floor. Once we're done with the Bay Area, then, we'll go
 back up to Sacramento for that very brief conversation.

 And hopefully, it's a quick swap. I didn't see a quick

RAMOS ALON: To unite Los Gatos with Saratoga and Campbell, adding Monte Sereno? I think that's 6 7 possible. Adding in Cupertino would be more difficult. I think you could take Los Gatos and bring it into 9 South Pen and adjust the line in -- over here in San Jose 10 to bring more of that in. 11 CHAIR TOLEDO: So let's zoom out and go back and --12 MS. RAMOS ALON: Yeah, no. We can't do that --13 CHAIR TOLEDO: For the most part, I want to hear 14 from the -- from the Commission. Are we comfortable with this -- with this district? 15 16 More or less -- is it more or less where we want it? 17 can't keep all the COIs together. We know that we were 18 doing our best, and certainly, we've done a great job, I 19 think, of these -- these visualizations are based on all 20 the COI testimony we received over the summer and to the 21 last couple of weeks. 22 We're now having to make difficult decisions, and we 23 do have some splits. And so I just want to hear from the 24 Commission. Are we comfortable with this map, as is?

are there any minor refinements to the map that would

1 make it -- that would get us to be comfortable with the 2 maps? 3 Commissioner Sinay? 4 We're just talking about this COMMISSIONER SINAY: 5 one right here, correct? CHAIR TOLEDO: We're talking about this one, but if 6 7 you have general, then let us know. COMMISSIONER SINAY: Well, we haven't gotten into 8 9 East Bay yet. 10 CHAIR TOLEDO: No, we haven't. We will be going 11 next. 12 COMMISSIONER SINAY: Or further south. 13 But I think one of the challenges I'm having, as 14 well as, probably, others are having is that we created 15 these maps -- the visualizations. We created the 16 visualizations based on communities of interest. And 17 then, those visualizations took -- we took the six 18 criteria, and we created our draft maps. We knew that 19 they weren't perfect, and that there was going to need to 2.0 be some tweaks. 21 And then, we've received some new -- new communities 22 of interest, because new people are learning about the 23 maps, and some new things are coming up. And I feel 24 like, on the whole, it might be good for us sometimes to 25 stay focused on what -- I mean, if we trust that we

created the visualizations based on the first 10,000 COIs we received --

2.3

I just feel like we keep going back and forth, back and forth. Like we've made a decision, and I do believe that we will constantly get new information, and we may need to tweak, or we might not.

But I think as we -- different ones of us have said it different times. We can all find a COI -- we're always going to find something that's wrong with our maps. We can always find a COI to tell us that we haven't gotten it right.

So as you were saying, Chair, we need to just be at a place where we're comfortable.

And remember that we have limited time, and we've only looked at a portion of the map, and we can't -- you know, that's one of my stressors.

CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you. And I think -- and this whole -- the whole map -- all of the maps we have are based on COI testimony. That's where the foundation is, the COI testimony. And now we're having to make difficult decisions, because we have incorporated the -- the other aspects of it.

Commissioner Andersen, and then, Akutagawa, then -- at this point, I am seeing general consensus that we're all comfortable with this map and with the deviations.

1 So we're going to move on, unless there's something 2 that you can't live with. 3 Commissioner Andersen or Akutagawa? 4 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Yeah. On this note, I thought 5 we were trying to move some population down. And we're still messing with the ones that are all negative. 6 7 CHAIR TOLEDO: So we --VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Where we know the East Bay has 9 almost -- there's lots and lots of positives. And I 10 believe we will be pulling some population down from 11 there, which we can then shift into these areas. 12 CHAIR TOLEDO: Good point. And we're going to be 13 going to the East Bay very soon. 14 Commissioner Akutagawa? 15 COMMISSIONER AKUTAGAWA: Yeah, I'm not so concerned 16 about South Pen. I do agree with Commissioner Andersen 17 just said. 18 I do want to note, specifically, though, Alum Rock. 19 I remember that we received quite a bit of testimony. 20 this particular one, the testimony -- several testimonies 21 say that we're cutting a Latino and Filipino community in 22 half, and they've asked us to move that line up, it looks 2.3 like maybe a couple of streets, or a couple of intersections. 24

- 7 There's a downtown one that's over here. And then, 8 the Punjabi-Sikh COI comes across this way.
 - COMMISSIONER AKUTAGAWA: So Tamina, what I -- what I read is that if you move it up to Berryessa, it does look like -- there seems to be agreement between the different communities that if you move the COI -- that line dot over to Berryessa -- and it looked like it's about a couple intersections up, that it will -- it will balance, I think, community interests in that way.

And that's the way I read through -- I -- there's several testimonies, and they're similar, but that's what I'm reading about that particular area.

CHAIR TOLEDO: So let -- let's zoom back out, and let's come back to are we comfortable? Can we live with these districts as are in this count in this general, because, yes, we're at this point we're picking and choosing COIs. And so I don't want to get into that -- that's not an argument, but into that that area. I want to -- if we're comfortable with this -- these -- these --

- the general direction, it's more about refinement, and getting and balancing population, and trying to keep deviations whole.
- Now, if there's a minor devi -- a minor refinement that we can make, then that would be acceptable. But
- 6 anything more than a minor refinement that would shift
- 7 and then cause other problems, we wouldn't want to do is
- 8 in my opinion. So I'm -- I'm -- that's where I'm at.
- 9 And let's hear what the rest of the Commission is at.
- 10 Commissioner, let's hear from Fornaciari, down to Ahmad.
- 11 Ahmad?
- 12 COMMISSIONER AHMAD: Thank you. I just want to hear
 13 it out loud. The South Penn District visualization, that
- 14 deviation is acceptable as it currently is shown,
- 15 correct? Sitting in.
- 16 CHAIR TOLEDO: It looks acceptable to me.
- 17 COMMISSIONER AHMAD: Okay. Generally, I'm okay with
- 18 | this region. I get it at this point, we are picking and
- 19 choosing between different COI testimony, because we have
- 20 met the other criteria on our list. So now we're at
- 21 cities, counties, communities of interest. So I'm okay
- 22 | with where this currently sits.
- 23 CHAIR TOLEDO: Commissioner Akutagawa, then

1 CHAIR TOLEDO: Commissioner Fernandez? 2 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Yeah, I -- I -- you are correct we're at the refinement, but it sounded like the 3 COI that -- communities of interest that Commissioner 4 5 Akutagawa was talking about, I don't believe that's a conflicting COI. It has to do more with boundaries. So 6 7 I would be open to looking at that, because that -- I 8 would consider that a refinement. 9 CHAIR TOLEDO: And that's what I thought it was, 10 until -- if it is -- if it's actually a refinement and 11 it'll keep deviations aligned, that's why I was saying, 12 can you please send it to me? And if it actually is a 13 refinement, it's not going to cause other deviation 14 problems, I -- I would be okay with that. Given that it 15 comes from COI testimony. If it has other implications, 16 then we probably should maintain our deviations as -- but 17 that would be something that Tamina could look at either 18 now, in line drawing, or later. So that's where I was 19 at, and I'm hoping the rest of the Commission is -- I'm 20 looking around. It seems like for the most part, 21 everyone is okay with that. 22 Let's see, Commissioner Ahmad? 2.3 Okay. So it looks like -- Tamina, do you have that 24 area in front of you? 25 MS. RAMOS ALON: Yes. I'm taking a look at it now,

- 1 and I believe this is the line which Commissioner
- 2 Akutagawa suggests to move. And I'm sorry, which --

1 that -- I quess I do have an issue with moving Vallejo and Benicia out of a county that's whole, and then 3 bringing in other communities from a different county, 4 into Solano. So breaking -- basically breaking up 5 Solano, and Solano is a community of interest as well. 6 Again, I feel in the Senate and the Congressional, 7 this is something that we can definitely work on because you have higher populations. 8 9 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you. I mean, 11 the fact is we have to bring population from outside 12 because Solano, in and of itself, does not have 13 sufficient population to be an Assembly District. 14 slightly short. As how the districts are. then in trade-offs. 6 7 CHAIR TOLEDO: So you're saying -- your recommendation is not to accept Rodeo, Pinole, and --8 9 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: My recommendation is to 10 keep the districts as they are right now, before you make 11 any adjustments. Because if you make adjustments, it's pushing -- it's having to push something from Contra 12 13 Costa up and --14 CHAIR TOLEDO: So at this -- with this, we currently 15 have a negative deviation because we added Pinole, Rodeo, 16 so we would have to push that back. So you're saying 17 reverse all the changes is what you're advocating for? 18 Okay. I know what you're advocating for. And let's see, 19 Commission Sinay and Commission Turner. 2.0 COMMISSIONER SINAY: Okay. I guess I do have -- I 21 was going to say I don't, but I do have something. 22 is where the map got priority based on what we did first. 23 And so you know, and I've been saying that from the 24 beginning. Because San Diego always -- yeah. The very

southern part of California gets kind of pushed. And I

1 don't feel like we're sharing the pain at this point. feel like, and from the very beginning, this was one of my top priorities, and I mentioned it as one of my top 3 4 priorities when we were asked to put our top priorities 5 on the map. And it was to try to help this community, 6 this working class community in Contra Costa be more 7 together. So I do feel that we need to think through at the -- there's bare minimum, which would be swapping 8 9 Martinez and Concord. But I do feel that we need to 10 really think this -- that -- you know, I don't think that 11 there's any sacred red cows. 12 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you Commissioner Sinay. 13 Commissioner Turner? And I appreciate you saying that --14 the compromise. That you're willing to compromise here. 15 Commissioner Turner? 16 COMMISSIONER TURNER: Yeah. So I would like for us, 17 at a bare minimum, to consider what we currently have highlighted and split Martinez so that we are at least 18 19 keeping a portion of Martinez into the east Bay. And 20 then the top part of it. Still broader, would like to 21 have the communities of interest really, because 22 Hercules, if we go back, we have it outside of a county 23 that it's part of. It's part of, I believe, Contra 24 Costa. So what I'm looking for, ultimately, and perhaps 25 it can be done in a different map, would be the

1 Vallejo/Benicia that I've talked about before. But if we leave it here, I'm thinking Martinez -- a split in Martinez that will allow for the -- keeping Pittsburg, 3 4 because I'd like to still go as far as Pittsburg. 5 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. COMMISSIONER TURNER: And again, I think these 6 7 areas, Bethel Island, Oakley, Knights, and I think they 8 are actually in like communities that would not be 9 disserved by being in the Solano Community -- Solano 10 District. 11 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you Commissioner Turner. 12 need to take a break. So I'm going to ask Tamina to try 13 to find a cut in Martinez that minimizes the amount of 14 the Martinez that is taken, then. And to try to bring in 15 more of Pittsburg, so we can visualize it when we come 16 back from break. We are on a fifteen minute break. 17 Thank you. 18 (Whereupon, a recess was held from 1:50 p.m. 19 until 2:04 p.m.) 20 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you so much. Welcome back. 21 We are in -- looking at the Martinez, Solano, Contra 22 Costa area. 2.3 Tamina, were you able to highlight the areas around? 24 So what I did here is balance MS. RAMOS ALON: Yes. 25 Solano by creating a Martinez split as requested.

- 2 | it would be the wrong direction to add from -- to add
- 3 Pittsburg in, because we are already underpopulated here.

- 6 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you. So that's helpful. So we
- 7 | were able to keep Bay Point, some of the unincorporated
- 8 | areas around -- is that the -- no. That's not Antioch.
- 9 But the surrounding area around Martinez, and then
- 10 portion of Martinez, and then in through the Benicia
- 11 Bridge, it looks like. Is that the Benicia Bridge? Or
- 12 | Carquinez?
- MS. RAMOS ALON: Yes.
- 14 CHAIR TOLEDO: Benicia? Benicia Bridge. Okay.
- 15 Reaction from the floor?
- 16 | Commissioner Fernandez, Andersen -- and we are
- 17 looking for a compromise or a general consensus from the
- 18 Commission.
- 19 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: I mean, you're trading
- 20 | Hercules, Crockett, and Rodeo for Bay Point, Martinez. I
- 21 | mean, it's okay. Do I love it? No. But it's okay.

So your preference is to keep it the way it is, but could potentially live with this. 6 7 Commissioner Andersen, Commissioner Yee? VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Thank you. I believe the population that we took out of, you know, the -- it was 10 Crockett, Rodeo, Hercules, and that's -- was it under --11 just under 35- to 40,000? In which case, I'd really 12 rather find that in another area, to put into Solano. 13 I'm not happy with --14 CHAIR TOLEDO: What other area would you be looking 15 at, Commissioner Andersen? 16 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Well, Yolo wanted to be with 17 Solano. And now it -- you know, that was its number one 18 thing. And now none of it is with Solano. And I'm, you 19 know -- I -- unfortunately, I don't have the areas up 20 north that we modified. So that -- I'm getting yes 16 from both Commissioners. Which is why we're going to end 17 up -- if we're going to end up here, we have to solve 18 this before we go on a journey through the Bay Area, 19 fixing all the Bay Area issues, and creating a bottleneck 20 here. That's why we're -- that's why we're here. 21 Because otherwise, we can't solve other issues if we 22 can't come to a consensus here. 2.3 Commissioner Fernandez and this Commissioner Fornaciari? 24 25

COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Oh, sorry. I forgot to put

1 my hand down, but I just wanted to remind everyone, regarding the COIs, with the Yolano -- Yolo County, they said keep Yolo whole first, and then combine with Solano. 3 4 So that was the priority order. Thanks. 5 CHAIR TOLEDO: Yep. And we would need, of course, to rotate population in order to achieve that. Otherwise 6 7 we're going to create a bubble. So Commissioner 8 Fornaciari, have you some suggestions for us? 9 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: I've done a little 10 thinking. 11 Oh, good. CHAIR TOLEDO: 12 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: If you can zoom into 13 Emeryville? So technically Emeryville is with Oakland 14 right now. CHAIR TOLEDO: Uh-huh. 15 16 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: But I think the ask is for 17 Emeryville to be with the other side of Oakland. 18 west side of Oakland. And so that would -- that change 19 would just be an Oakland swap. 2.0 CHAIR TOLEDO: Uh-huh. 21 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Okay. If we go back to 22 northern Contra Costa, so -- let's see. This community 23 of interest, Vallejo, Benicia, Martinez, Bay Point, 24 Pittsburg, just want to throw it out there, because it

was -- it was brought that we've kept that together. Not

with Antioch, but we've kept the rest of it together in our current Congressional Maps. And I imagine we can keep it together or figure a way to change it with our -- in our Congressional maps to include Antioch, which was the ask.

- One last thing, you know, somebody brought up Bethel Island, Oakley Knights, and Brentwood. If we -- if we take Bethel Island, Oakley, Knightsen, and a little bit of the tail there up into Solano, that would -- that would -- you know, and not do this Martinez-Bay Point thing, that would -- that would get the Solano deviation down to around zero, but, you know, I'm just throwing it out there. I'm not sure how much support that has.
- CHAIR TOLEDO: So since we don't have much support for -- or since we don't have consensus on the Bay Point-Martinez area, I'd like to hear about support for -- for this suggestion that Commissioner Fornaciari just made.

 Let's hear from Andersen, Akutagawa.
- VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: I would support looking at that because that -- that area currently is with the -- goes all the way out to Stockton, you know, for that Bay Area. So that isn't -- isn't -- hasn't been, right now -- last ten years hasn't been part of, you know, Contra Costa.

1 MS. RAMOS ALON: Okay. So I am adding this area up -- up to 12 from SSAC-STANIS into ECCC; is that 3 correct? 4 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Oh, it's going into Solano. 5 MS. RAMOS ALON: Oh, going into Solano. COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Yes. Sorry. And it should 6 7 have minimal impact on SSAC. CHAIR TOLEDO: And let's -- let's highlight it. Let's highlight the whole area. The -- the little 10 portion of the Sacramento tail. 11 (Pause) MS. RAMOS ALON: This area is 1,161 people. 12 13 CHAIR TOLEDO: And how are we looking at -- in terms 14 of deviations, what do we -- what does it look like? 15 MS. RAMOS ALON: We are at negative 8.99 percent in 16 Solano and negative 2.67 percent in SACC-STANIS. 17 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Okay. So now we try to 18 grab Bethel Island. 19 Is that what we were doing, Commissioner Fornaciari? 20 We're going to grab Bethel Island to go into Solano, 21 please. And if you can zoom out just a --22 Pardon? Oh. 23 CHAIR TOLEDO: So let's just try to figure out what the vision here is. 24 25 So Commissioner Fornaciari, can you tell us what the

vision is? 1 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Sure. The vision would be move that part of the tail into Solano, and then look at 3 Bethel Island, Oakley, and Knightsen into Solano. And 4 5 that's your balance population. And then -- then we could --6 7 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. So we're balancing population with Bethel Island, Knightsen, and Oakley; is that 8 9 correct? 10 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Right. And then we can go 11 back to the vision of swapping Martinez and Concord and 12 Contra Costa. 13 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. Got it. So I see Commissioner Sinay's suggestion as well. So I'm not sure what we did with the other part 23 and if we still need that much of population. 24 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: I think it's -- I think it 25 would be too many people, but we can definitely look at

it.

CHAIR TOLEDO: So let's look at it, but we might have to cut -- we might have to cut -- we might have to up. So let's -- it was Brentwood, Discovery Bay, Byron adding that to the -- this population.

MS. RAMOS ALON: Okay. So just so the Commission knows before I do that, the resulting deviation, it's into Solano, with this area currently highlighted is 0.75 percent, and SACC-STANIS is at negative 6.5 percent.

CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you.

MS. RAMOS ALON: I'm sorry. Negative 2.65 I meant to say.

COMMISSIONER TURNER: It looks like negative 2 -- yeah.

CHAIR TOLEDO: Negative 2.65. If we add Brentwood, Discovery Bay, and Byron, what would the deviations look like at that point? I believe that was the -- I'm thinking that was a suggestion from Commissioner Sinay. Please correct me if I'm wrong. I know the rotation was in Concord, and Martinez was also -- yeah. So I'm trying to balance all the different COIs in my head, and there just too many.

MS. RAMOS ALON: Well, the resulting deviation after adding Discovery Bay and Byron is 4.22 percent in Solano, negative 2.65 percent in SACC-STANIS, negative

- 1 | 13.35 percent in ECC, and negative point -- oh, sorry.
- 2 Let's ignore that. That's a spread that I'm going to
- 3 | clean up right now.
- 4 CHAIR TOLEDO: Commissioner Turner wants to explore

And I 25 think we do achieve some of it in the State Senate.

1 All right. So let's commit to this. I see general consensus on this. And then we will give Tamina some 3 direction so that she can work through -- while we're on 4 lunch break, she can work through some of these changes 5 that were -- that we've been asking for. So let's give general direction to Tamina to do -- to do -- to swap Concord and Clayton for 8 9 Martinez, and to take in enough population so that the 10 deviations are balanced. We are visualizing 18 the Bay Area at this point. And we're shifting gears and 19 moving towards the Alameda County -- going -- we're going 20 to go through Alameda County and down into the South Bay. 21 So let's go, Tamina, to -- let's see. What's the 22 next area we're in? Let's go to East Bay. Take a look at that district and see if we're all comfortable with 2.3 24 it. East Bay includes Rodeo -- actually, Crockett, 25 Rodeo, all the way down to Emeryville, Piedmont area, and

1 portions of the hills, the Oakland Hills if I see that 2 correctly. Any concerns, Commissioner Yee? 3 4 COMMISSIONER YEE: Actually, I was going to start 5 with Crockett and oppose moving it to 680CC. CHAIR TOLEDO: We have a proposal on the table to 6 7 move Crockett to the Contra Costa district, Commissioner 8 Andersen? 9 COMMISSIONER YEE: Community of interest with Martinez. 10 11 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Yes. 12 CHAIR TOLEDO: Any opposition to that? 13 opposition. Let's add Crockett to the Contra Costa 14 district. And this aligns with community of interest 15 testimony we -- that we received that Crockett wants to 16 be with --17 COMMISSIONER YEE: Martinez. 18 CHAIR TOLEDO: -- Martinez. We still need 15,000 people. 2.3 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: As I'm looking at the 24 scoreboard, Chair, I think we're trying to get East Bay 25 first to an acceptable deviation, correct? And then we

1 are going to push -- when we get down to San Leandro, we 2 can fix Oakland. CHAIR TOLEDO: That's right. Okay. Let's do that. 3 4 So East Bay. Do we want to add this space into the East 5 Bay area? COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Adding this to Oakland 6 7 from East Bay. CHAIR TOLEDO: Yes, adding his to Oakland from East 8 9 Bay which would, of course, increase the deviation. 10 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Yes. CHAIR TOLEDO: Any objections to adding this area? 11 Commissioner Andersen, Commissioner Fornaciari. 12 13 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Yeah. And then we can -- because I mean, 3 4 now we've done the complete rotation. We should be able 5 to balance between the two Contra Costas and come out 6 even. 7 CHAIR TOLEDO: I am looking across the floor. 8 Everyone is in agreement. Commissioner Andersen, I just 9 can't -- I can't see if you are. Are you in agreement with this? 10 11 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Yes. This is a good step. 12 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. Appreciate it. So let's move 13 forward. And with this change. We will be adding the 14 City of Pleasanton. COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: And just to -- you want 15 16 some clarity on why we're doing this. 17 CHAIR TOLEDO: Yes, we do. 18 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: This will enable us to 19 keep the Tri-Valley COI together. 2.0 CHAIR TOLEDO: Mm hmm. 21 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: And then -- well, yeah. 22 It will stop there. COMMISSIONER AHMAD: Okay. 9 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. 10 COMMISSIONER AHMAD: Thank you. 11 CHAIR TOLEDO: Commissioner Fernandez? 12 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Yes. My recommendation 13 would be to split Pleasanton in order to get the 14 deviation in Alameda. That's what we're going to do is 15 move it in because -- because you can't keep all of 16 Pleasanton --17 CHAIR TOLEDO: So how about we do one at a time? 18 Let's prioritize the COIs that we're going to move into 19 Contra Costa County. So let's undo this and let's just 20 figure out are we going to do Pleasanton first or are we 21 going to do -- then we can cut. 22 Commissioner Andersen. 2.3 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Yeah. Actually, I did want to 24 get rid of it all because Union City and the northern 25 portion of Fremont have the Afghan population, which

1 they -- we got a lot of COIs about that. A lot of people 2 calling in about please add Union City to --3 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: -- the temples in the northern 4 5 part of Fremont. 6 CHAIR TOLEDO: Appreciate it. 7 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: -- (indiscernible, simultaneous speech) bit of that. 8 9 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you. Commissioner Fernandez, 10 Yee, Turner, and Akutagawa. Okay. We'll go to Yee, 11 Turner, and Akutagawa. And I want to make sure that we 12 are able to move this population and be able to rotate it if we move in this direction. 13 14 Commissioner Yee, do you have any thoughts about 15 that? 16 COMMISSIONER YEE: Yeah. I would like -- I would 17 like to -- yes, thank you. Let's commit this and we will explore. 2.3 All right. So now our deviations are off. 24 Suggestions for getting the deviations back in line. 25 let's start with suggestions on where to fix first.

- 2 | there a split in the Pleasanton or Dublin area or Sunol
- 3 that makes more sense? Commissioner Andersen, Yee, any
- 4 suggestions?
- 5 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Yes. I would like to grab a
- 6 little bit from the northern portion of Fremont. I don't
- 7 have the map of the Afghan community in Fremont, but they
- 8 wanted to be with Union City. So I would grab a bit of
- 9 that.
- 10 CHAIR TOLEDO: So I do want to note that if we grab
- 11 | a portion of Fremont, it will impact the City of San Jose
- 12 | if we zoom out. So let's zoom out so we can look at the
- 13 | whole region. So I just want to let the Commission know.
- 14 And we have negatives all under there, so we will -- if
- 15 | we do, in fact, take from Fremont, we will be impacting
- 16 | San Jose. I just want to make sure everybody understands
- 17 that. And we're open to all the options. Just want to
- 18 make sure that we are understanding the options.
- 19 Commissioner Yee?
- 20 COMMISSIONER YEE: Yeah. I'm sorry. I have to
- 21 | think more.
- 22 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. Let's think some more.
- 23 Andersen?
- VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Yeah. I will do that.

And right now we 20 have a overpopulation in Contra Costa of 30.75, which is a lot. So those are -- we're just looking at options. 21 22 Commissioner Yee. 2.3 COMMISSIONER YEE: Yes. Concerning the Afghan COI, so I believe Union City is already split here. 24

Is that correct, Tamina? If so --

1 MS. RAMOS ALON: Union City is not split. 2 COMMISSIONER YEE: It is not split? Oh. 3 MS. RAMOS ALON: No. Okay. I would like to see 4 COMMISSIONER YEE: Wow. 5 that exact COI before we try to make a change there. CHAIR TOLEDO: Do we have the shapefile, Tamina, for 6 7 that? MS. RAMOS ALON: I'm not sure --8 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. 10 MS. RAMOS ALON: -- of that. I know that there are 11 COIs take Union City and Hayward into this area, but they 12 come all -- the COI comes all the way down here, so they 13 just don't for Assembly. We can put in Union City. It 14 will split these -- all the COIs that we just talked 15 about, the various Latino, Punjabi COIs, Alum Rock COIs 16 down here at (audio interference). 17 CHAIR TOLEDO: Yeah. Any split into Fremont is 18 going to impact our COIs in San Jose. So let's --19 MS. RAMOS ALON: Correct. 20 CHAIR TOLEDO: -- let's keep talking about this. So 21 Commissioner Akutagawa, Commissioner Fernandez, and 22 Sadhwani I know will come up with a great solution for 23 all of us, and I'm just waiting for the great solution to 24 come forward. 25 Commissioner Akutagawa, what's your great solution?

1 COMMISSIONER AKUTAGAWA: Actually, I was trying to see if Tamina could scroll up because I'd like to see --3 no, the opposite way. See the bottom part. Okay. All 4 right. Thank you. I need to think again. 5 CHAIR TOLEDO: Oh good. No, no problem. Yeah, it's good to think about these things. 6 7 Commissioner Fernandez. COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Actually, I wanted to 9 scroll the opposite way and zoom in a little bit, please. 10 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. 11 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Yeah. Right there. 12 you. Just a little bit higher, please. Maybe just zoom 13 out a little bit. Thanks. Okay. Now, I got to come 14 back --15 CHAIR TOLEDO: We can zoom out a little bit so we 16 can all think about this a little more. 17 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Yeah. I got to think about 18 that, too. 19 CHAIR TOLEDO: Let's zoom out a little bit and let's 20 hear -- see if Commissioner Sadhwani has some suggestions 21 for this area which has a significant amount of COIs, 22 especially as we move down. And so we spent a lot of 2.3 time working on these COIs. I want to make sure that we 24 are doing this fairly. Commissioner Sadhwani? 25 COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: Thank you. From what I can

- 1 | tell, we have fairly good feedback on keeping Union City
- 2 | whole. In particular, I think we were told -- oh, sorry.
- 3 | I just had it up. Where did it go? That it was a
- 4 Punjabi community, I believe, in Union City that wanted
- 5 to be -- have the city kept whole.
- In terms of Fremont, we were given some thoughts in
- 7 | terms of possible cuts for the Afghan community, in
- 8 particular keeping Centerville of Fremont whole. That
- 9 being said, I think that we're in pretty good shape with
- 10 | the Fremont district. So I wouldn't -- I feel like
- 11 perhaps we can expand outward where there's already a
- 12 | plus thirty percent deviation as opposed to breaking into
- 13 | the Fremont district where there were so many COIs that
- 14 | we worked to keep together because we've had actually
- 15 | fairly positive feedback about that Union -- about
- 16 keeping Union City whole, from what I can tell.
- 17 CHAIR TOLEDO: Um-hum.
- 18 | COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: And so if we were to split
- 19 | into Fremont, the key piece is keeping Centerville whole,
- 20 | which is the Afghan piece that Commissioner Andersen was
- 21 raising.
- 22 CHAIR TOLEDO: Sunol? How many people are in Sunol?
- 23 | Is Sunol a COI with Fremont, Commissioner Sadhwani? Do
- 24 | you know or does somebody else -- Commissioner Yee I'm
- 25 | sure knows.

1 Commissioner Yee? 2 COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: It's about 900 people. 3 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Yeah, it is a lot of people. 4 It's the major route with the trains went through. Sunol 5 has a --COMMISSIONER YEE: Yeah. 6 7 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: -- (indiscernible, 9 simultaneous speech) --10 COMMISSIONER YEE: Yeah. It's hilly. VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: 11 It's about 900 people, yeah. CHAIR TOLEDO: Oh. Let's put the terrain on. 12 13 had a request for terrain, so let's look at the terrain. 14 Maybe that'll help us, too. I don't see as many hills, 15 but the train. 16 MS. RAMOS ALON: So Sunol's only about 900 people, 17 so it's not going to help. 18 CHAIR TOLEDO: Oh. That's not going to help too 19 much. Okay. All right. So suggestions from the floor 20 on addressing the deviation issue in Alameda. Okay. 21 have some ideas from Commissioner Fornaciari. Let's hear 22 them. 2.3 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Okay. We're going to have 24 to put some of Pleasanton back because we have to have --25 I mean, you have East Contra Costa at minus 13.5 and --

1 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Seventeen. 2 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: -- 680CC at 30.75. 3 two have to add up to --4 CHAIR TOLEDO: Agreed. 5 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: -- plus or minus ten --CHAIR TOLEDO: Right. 6 7 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: -- and they don't, so we 8 have to move some of Pleasanton back. 9 CHAIR TOLEDO: Do you have a suggestion where we can cut in Pleasanton? 10 11 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: So full disclosure, this 12 is where I grew up. Sorry to all my friends --13 CHAIR TOLEDO: And I appreciate for all the --14 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: -- who still live there. 15 CHAIR TOLEDO: -- the transparency. I think it's 16 important for us to provide that transparency. look at that. Look at that after we look at this.

CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. Let's look at this after we

1 is 19,000 people right now. It gets us to an acceptable 2 deviation in Alameda. COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Yeah. I think we need to 3 4 go a little more because we're at --5 CHAIR TOLEDO: 21,000 people. COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: We got to be down to below 6 7 twenty-six percent. CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. So let's clean this up a 16 little bit. We're at -- below twenty-six percent. Okay. 17 Any objection to adding this to Alameda? 18 COMMISSIONER YEE: What's that little bite that 19 keeps not wanting to come out where the "p" is? 2.0 MS. RAMOS ALON: It's already there. 21 COMMISSIONER YEE: Okay. 22 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. I see no objection. 23 do -- okay. So the general consensus is to add this to 24 Alameda. Let's see what it looks like. So we're at 25 negative 3.74 in Alameda, and we now shift over to our

My 16 understanding is that the piece around Vallejo is coming from numerous groups that represent multiple 17 18 organizations that had many conversations with the 19 communities they serve. 2.0 I wouldn't really want to split Vallejo if I'm 21 hearing that there was a population change between --22 that Vallejo's bigger than Brentwood. Does it make sense 23 to bring Vallejo in and -- or a portion of Vallejo in and 24 take out Brentwood and put it with that district on the

other side and shift the population around? Does it make

1 more sense to take all of the Vallejo and split Antioch? I mean, I do feel like there's a case to be made for 3 keeping a COI together that has been so strongly 4 advocated for. CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. So if we didn't move this area, then what area would you move because we need --17 18 COMMISSIONER SINAY: Vallejo and Benicia, and 19 then -- I mean --20 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. 21 COMMISSIONER SINAY: -- I would do -- I would pull 22 up exactly whatever -- take out Brentwood. 2.3 CHAIR TOLEDO: So that's where we're stuck --24 COMMISSIONER SINAY: Take out Concord. 25 CHAIR TOLEDO: -- right? CHAIR TOLEDO: Um-hum. 6 7 COMMISSIONER SINAY: You keep saying, do we have consensus and do we work on -- this is the question I 8 9 asked way long time ago. Are we working on consensus or 10 are we working on majority? CHAIR TOLEDO: Well, if we do -- it's actually our 11 12 break time, so I'm going to take a break right now. 13 COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: Wait. Can I make one 14 comment before the break? 15 CHAIR TOLEDO: You may, yes. 16 COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: Thank you. I just wanted to 17 note we're making a whole lot of compromises here to keep 18 Solano, Yolo, and Sacramento with as few of cuts 19 possible. We have a crazy district from -- from Mono all 20 the way up to the Oregon border so that Roseville wasn't 21 cut. Now, we have this issue here in Solano because 22 Solano doesn't want to be cut and they want to take the 23 vote -- they want to have their voting power come from 24 Vallejo. So I just want to recognize the number of 25 compromises that we are making just for these three

1 | counties alone.

VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: I was going to say if we're -can we back out just a little bit or move -- actually
move the map up a little bit so we can see what other
areas we have to work with? No, no. I'm sorry. The
map -- move south of the map, please. There we go. And
then expand a little bit, please, so we can see that area
so we can determine what --

CHAIR TOLEDO: There's certainly the Fremont area that we could go to, and that would lead us into San Jose and we could certainly start working on that area as well. So we can certainly move population from Fremont into this region, which would also get us to there, and it's been suggested by a couple of Commissioners -- Commissioner Akutagawa, Commissioner -- a couple of other Commissioners.

But we also have significant COIs down there as well that would be impacted. And we are -- a lot of COIs down there as well. So we have COIs throughout this whole

1 region and we all need to think about those, and that's why I'm going to take a fifteen-minute break for us to think about all the COIs in the different areas and where 3 we might cut. So let's take a fifteen-minute break and 4 5 just think through these issues. Thank you. 6 (Whereupon, a recess was held from 4:40 p.m. until 7 4:55 p.m.) CHAIR TOLEDO: Welcome back to the California 8 9 Citizens Redistricting Commission. We are looking at the 10 northern part of Alameda County, Contra Costa County 11 areas, and into the Solano region as well. We're looking 12 to transfer population from -- into the East Contra Costa 13 region. We are overpopulated in the southern Contra 14 Costa region, and we are looking for a consensus here. 15 Commissioner Andersen. 16 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: About this particular one, I 17 understand now we're basically trying to work between the 18 25.6 and the negative thirteen. 19 CHAIR TOLEDO: Um-hum. 2.0 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: And those two, of course, is 21 positive twelve, so it can't be. We have positive ten. 22 So we've got to take 10,000 people out of the whole area. 2.3 If we're stuck in these two areas, Bay Point, Pittsburg, Antioch, Martinez, and stuff, half of it's with other 24 25 areas, and I'm trying to look for something for the south

1 that might be more comparable. But this area right in here, it's not -- it is not that similar. And so I 3 understand exactly where -- why people are having an 4 issue. Accept this as we are right now and then try and 5 see if we can fix it. That's the best I think we could 6 possibly --7 Thank you, Commissioner Andersen. CHAIR TOLEDO: Any other thoughts from the floor, Commissioner Sadhwani. 8 9 COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: I'll say it again. I don't 10 like it, but I think in the spirit of moving on and 11 sharing the pain, let's do it in the Assembly districts. 12 We'll take a closer look when we get else -- to the other 13 maps. I think we're still going to need to transfer 14 additional populations somewhere else, and I don't have a 15 plan for that yet. 16 CHAIR TOLEDO: Yeah. Even with this move, I just 17 want to remember --18 COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: Yeah. 19 CHAIR TOLEDO: -- reiterate that there's still 20 10,000 people we have to sift into -- about 10,000 people 21 we have to shift in this -- to this district, and I'm not 22 sure where we would find it. So if any Commissioner can 23 take a look and -- and I know Commissioners are taking a 24 look at trying to figure out where, but I need some

feedback. Commissioner Akutagawa.

I know none of us like 5 this change, but it is a compromise. Is there any opposition? All right. Seeing no opposition, I will 6 7 take it as consensus to move forward. So let's commit this change, Trina -- Tamina. Sorry about that, Tamina. 8 So now this East Contra Costa is now an acceptable range 10 and we can move down and shift population from -- we have 11 overpopulation in the Contra Costa district. 12 are -- we can shift population south. We can shift it 13 east, and we can shift it west. And can you zoom out 14 just so -- these communities seem very well-balanced in 15 terms of this is a -- can you just speak to the district, 16 Tamina, where it starts and where it ends? 17 MS. RAMOS ALON: Sure. The 680CC district takes the 18 eastern half of Alameda County. We did go down the 19 freeway here as a dividing line between Dublin and 20 Pleasanton. And we have Dublin, Pleasanton, and 21 We go up through the 680 corridor: 22 Ramon, North Canyon, Danville, all the way up through 2.3 Walnut Creek. The La Marinda area is kept together, and 24 we have some incorporated areas on both the eastern side 25 and the Oakland Hills side.

COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Yeah. Yeah. Okay. And 8 9 then go north up into the area of Val Vista Park there. 10 CHAIR TOLEDO: We're at 5,000. UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: It's a science experiment. 11 CHAIR TOLEDO: 7,000. 12 13 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Okay. And then can you 14 scroll the map up to Dublin, please, so we can share the 15 pain? This area west of Village Parkway, that area. 16 CHAIR TOLEDO: So -- okay. 17 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: I mean, socioeconomically, there -- there's a disparity but -- between this area and 18 19 Hayward. 20 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. We're at 12,000 people. 21 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Okay. What do we got 22 there? All right. Yeah. 2.3 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Could we just do a portion 24 here and try to get like a thousand or so back into East

Bay rather than Pleasanton and Dublin shouldn't be the

1 sacrificial to make -- if we added two more thousand up to -- to make that a five instead of a three, then this 3 wouldn't have quite as many people there. 4 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: So where would you --5 where you thinking? VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: I would go over to the base of 6 7 those large --CHAIR TOLEDO: Before we go on -- before we go on, 8 9 can we finish this first? What other -- so can we do the 10 first portion of this and then leave the Dublin portion 11 for later, or what are your thoughts, Commissioner 12 Fornaciari? Which piece of this do you want to commit 13 to? 14 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Well, I mean, I don't know 15 what Commissioner Andersen is proposing. 16 CHAIR TOLEDO: Commissioner Andersen, are you 17 proposing a large number of people, a small number of 18 people? Because we need --19 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: I'm just proposing a bit of a 20 small number all around to come up -- basically we 21 looking for these two areas plus five and --22 CHAIR TOLEDO: So if it's looking to do refinements 23 around the whole area, then that we could give direction 24 to -- general direction to Tamina to do that off-line. 25 If we're looking at a large portion, then I would suggest

1 we do it now because we still have many pieces of the Bay 2 Area to do. So --VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: 3 Yes. 4 CHAIR TOLEDO: So if we're looking at a large 5 portion that'll --6 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: (Indiscernible, simultaneous 7 speech) --CHAIR TOLEDO: -- get us -- that'll fix our 8 9 deviations, then I'd say let's do it now. 10 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: They could be. I don't know. 11 All those large unincorporated areas, if they have -- if 12 the population is 2,000 people, that's going to need 13 2,000 people that don't have to come out of Pleasanton 14 and Dublin. 15 CHAIR TOLEDO: So I'd like to hear from Commissioner 16 Yee and see what he thinks as well. 17 COMMISSIONER YEE: Yes. The North Oakland Berkeley 18 district is overpopulated. We could make that cut a 19 little deeper, push population through Oakland, out San 20 Leandro back together, and that might be the two or three 21 percent we need. 22 CHAIR TOLEDO: Is that -- is there consensus for 2.3 that? So to not do these changes and move into Oakland? 24 COMMISSIONER YEE: No. I would include these 25 changes also because --

1 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. You want --2 COMMISSIONER YEE: -- we still need --3 CHAIR TOLEDO: -- to include these changes. 4 COMMISSIONER YEE: -- we still need more, yeah. 5 CHAIR TOLEDO: So the thought process here is to do the changes in Pleasanton, potentially also Dublin, and 6 7 then to go on to Oakland for further cuts. Okay. looks like we have consensus to do this. If there is an 8 opposition, please let me know. Commissioner Sadhwani. 10 COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: No. I mean, I thought that 11 the whole point was that we try to minimize the cuts in 12 cities. We're already cutting into Pleasanton and 13 Dublin, so just make it one cut, right? We've certainly 14 heard of strong COIs to keep Oakland whole with 15 Emeryville. So we're going to make a cut anyway, so 16 let's make the cut. 17 CHAIR TOLEDO: So your suggestion is one large cut 18 that gets us into deviation and move on. 19 COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: That's correct. And I feel 20 like -- I'll be honest, I feel like this is something we 21 can ask -- if we're all in agreement -- ask Tamina to do 22 off-line. It's Friday and we haven't gotten to San Diego 23 yet. 24 CHAIR TOLEDO: That's correct. So let's do one big 25 cut here and let's move on. Let's see. Let's add this

- 1 | area here. Does this get us into acceptable deviations?
- 2 And then we can always ask for refinements around the
- 3 other areas in Oakland if that's the desire of the
- 4 Commission.
- 5 COMMISSIONER YEE: I'd be happy to work with Tamina
- 6 on further cutting.
- 7 CHAIR TOLEDO: Appreciate Commissioner Yee for

I just 17 wanted to ask Tamina about that area just above Hollister 18 in very southern Santa Clara County. Is there a reason 19 that that doesn't follow the county line? 2.0 MS. RAMOS ALON: That was part of Benito, so it was 21 taken for -- because there's a Hispanic LCVAP there a few 22 blocks in there which assist with that. 2.3 COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: Thank you. 24 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. I'm sorry. 15 CHAIR TOLEDO: Commissioner Fornaciari was 16 suggesting potential changes to the Watsonville area and 17 then incorporating some of the smaller -- smaller 18 agricultural cities, the low Kings cities, if I remember 19 correctly. 2.0 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Yeah. I was exploring 21 maybe taking out Rio Del Mar or -- and/or Corralitos, but 22 it sounds like they've already looked at that and 23 maybe --24 CHAIR TOLEDO: Commissioner Yee. 25 COMMISSIONER YEE: Yeah. I'm sympathetic.

At the end of the day 11 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: 12 here, could we get a picture of -- because I don't -- I 13 can't look at what's current. I'd like to be able to 14 look at what's current so I could make suggestions. 15 CHAIR TOLEDO: So that's why I'm actually interested 16 in going down to Southern California because if we can 17 get down to Southern California, we would be able to post 18 a picture of all of California with all of the latest 19 data. And so that's why I'm trying to move down to 2.0 Southern California so that can be possible tonight. 21 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Thank you. 22 CHAIR TOLEDO: So that's why we're moving down this 23 way. But for general purposes, what we're looking at 24 right now is general consensus on each one of these 25 districts, that they're -- that they have the right COIs,

1 that they're the right district, that the deviations are correct. And if there are some refinements, we can certainly explore those -- explore those with the line 3 4 drawers. But they would be minor, minor refinements like 5 the ones we're exploring in Oakland and in Sacramento. 6 All right. So Santa Barbara. Any concern around this 7 district? We've looked at it many times in visualization 8 and through this process. So let's take a look at Santa 9 Barbara. Can you go over it to me, Tamina, just general? 10 MS. RAMOS ALON: Sure. Santa Barbara, the SBARBARA 11 district, keeps the Santa Barbara County intact, 12 including its associated islands, and comes up into San 13 Luis Obispo County taking Oceano south through Los Veros, 14 Nipomo, Blacklake, Woodlands, Callendar along the coast. 15 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you so much. And I don't see 16 any hands raised on this area, so we're going to keep 17 going south. This is an area where we have worked very, 18 very hard on these COIs and I think it shows. 19 Commissioner -- or Tamina, can you please walk us through 2.0 VENTURA? 21 MS. RAMOS ALON: Sure. So the VENTURA district 22 takes the north -- takes Ventura County from the north, 23 western, and southern borders, keeps together the Port 24 Hueneme through Piru COI, keeps this. 1	CHAIR TOLEDO: I see Jaime has joined us. Jaime has
2	been so busy and has been working so hard to get us Los
3	Angeles County and to try to minimize the impact of our
4	changes yesterday. So let's take a look at this and
5	let's review it and let's go over it for all of the
6	Commissioners and for the public.
7	Jaime, can you walk us through some of the changes
8	that have been made?
9	MS. CLARK: Yeah, absolutely.
10	CHAIR TOLEDO: And this is Los Angeles County, for
11	the public.
12	MS. CLARK: Yes.
13	CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you, Jaime.
14	MS. CLARK: Thank you, Commissioners, for the
15	opportunity to present to you again today. I have been
16	very busy, and just wanted to show you briefly what I've
17	been working on, get some feedback about whether this is
18	going in the direction that you would like to move
19	towards, so that if not, I can pivot now.
20	And with that, I'm just going to review some of the
21	changes that I've been working on. There's a lot
22	throughout the county. And if I may, I'd like to start
23	here in the where is this Los Angeles County-Orange
24	County area. So based on counsel direction, or guidance
25	rather, the direction was to include La Habra and La

Mirada in a VRA district.

Additionally, yesterday, Commission was unhappy with moving La Habra into the AD 60 Corridor District. So I took that out and put La Habra into the AD 5 Corridor District. For contiguity, East Whittier and South Whittier had to also be included in AD 5 Corridor. As a population trade, Pico Rivera is now in. This is a negative .18 percent deviation with 55.02 percent Latino CVAP.

Moving on to AD 5 Corridor, again, La Habra, La Mirada, East Whittier and South Whittier are included. And for population, had to move out Bell Gardens. This is negative .55 percent deviation and a 63.15 percent Latino CVAP.

Moving on to the AD Gateway, again, this now includes Bell Gardens for population purposes. Then had to split Lakewood. So now Lakewood and Hawaiian Gardens are with the NOC District. I had received guidance to look into splitting Long Beach instead. With this general structure of your VRA Districts, moving Long Beach into AD Gateway as opposed to splitting Lakewood would increase the Latino CVAP. This is the CVAP that the Commission had worked to generally bring down, and so that's why Lakewood is split as opposed to Long Beach being split in this iteration. Just really high-level

overview in this iteration of NOC, again, Hawaiian

Gardens and part of Lakewood is in NOC. The split in

Fullerton is different as a result of just the population

trade there and to get allowable deviation throughout all

of these districts.

I'm going to move on to what I've been working on more in the City of Los Angeles. I have been trying to incorporate the direction that Commissioner Turner provided yesterday with other direction that I have been provided by the Commission throughout this process.

So I'm just going to start with the AD South Bay
District. Lawndale was moved out of this district and
Gardena is still split for population purposes. West
Carson and some of the Harbor Gateway neighborhoods are
in the AD South Bay, as well as this part of Coastal San
Pedro Neighborhood Council to the very west. The reason
that had to go in there is because I was directed to
maintain the boundary between Long Beach and San Pedro to
keep the ports separate.

Moving north, I moved Watts Neighborhood Council into this Compton and Carson-based AD South LA District.

West Athens, Westmont.

I'm just going to continue north. On this 110 LA

This puts the rest of 5 Glendale, the Sunland-Tujunga Foothills Trails, all of Burbank, Studio City, Sherman Oaks and POSO, Encino, and 6 7 Tarzana all in one district. In the Central San Fernando Valley District, it 9 hasn't changed a ton. It does include Mission Hills, 10 Arleta, Northridge Neighborhoods like Balboa, Reseda. 11 And for East San Fernando Valley, Granada Hills, 12 Sylmar, San Fernando, most of Pacoima Neighborhood 13 Council. Foothill Trails District Neighborhood Council 14 is split in this, and it includes Sun Valley Neighborhood 15 Council, NoHo areas, most of Van Nuys, and that is --16 those are the changes. 17 CHAIR TOLEDO: Wow. MS. CLARK: Just again, wanted to thank you for the 18 19 opportunity to present this to you and would love to hear 20 if this is the direction that you generally would like me 21 to go in or if I should pivot now. 22 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you, Jaime. Our appreciation 23 to you for the hard work. I love it. I'm just giving

you my thoughts. I love it. This is our direction.

19	work to send all of the files to staff as soon as
20	possible to be posted by tomorrow morning.
21	CHAIR TOLEDO: I just want to make sure we have
22	consensus on it, because I see some conflicting testimony
23	and some conflicting direction. So I just want to make
24	sure we have direction that doesn't conflict. So
25	Commissioner Turner, and then we will go through and

Commissioner Turner, and then we will go through and

outline the direction that we all agree to.

Commissioner Turner.

COMMISSIONER TURNER: I'm definitely supportive of the line that Commissioner Vazquez mentioned about Culver City. But Jaime, when you named going back and doing other things, that's where you lost me. No, I'm not sure about that part.

CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. What Commissioner Turner is saying is she loves the maps. She loves the maps as they are now. And didn't like the potential ripple effects of changes.

COMMISSIONER TURNER: Culver City, she said it's doable and easy. That's a straight line.

and may not have as many implications. You'll be able to explore that. I see consensus on that. Let's continue on and see where else we might be able to get consensus in terms of direction for the line drawers. Any additional direction that we want to give to the line drawers? This is for Los Angeles County. Let's give Commissioner Fernandez.

COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: I'm not sure if this is impacting the Assembly, but I just want to make sure we cleaned up the POSO boundary. It's the north border along Oxnard to Hazeltine down the 405 West along



- 1 | Sepulveda. I hope I pronounced that correctly.
- 2 CHAIR TOLEDO: I believed Commissioner Sinay had
- 3 also brought up the question. It was a question for
- 4 discussion about the parks and whether we wanted to
- 5 include portions of the park in each one of the
- 6 districts. I thought that was for the federal maps. I
- 7 | didn't think it was for the Assembly, but I just want to
- 8 make sure that we talk about it because it was brought
- 9 up. And I believe this is a -- correct me if I'm wrong,
- 10 | I believe this is federal land. I'm not 100 percent
- 11 | sure, but I believe that would be --
- 12 MS. CLARK: This is Angeles National Forest.
- CHAIR TOLEDO: So yeah, federal jurisdiction. All
- 14 | right. Commissioner Andersen.
- 15 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Yes, I like the idea because
- 16 they said this is essentially the only way in, and I
- 17 believe there's virtually no population. So I think that
- 18 | it's a very good idea in terms of adding that because
- 19 | they do -- the whole fire zone right through there
- 20 affects anybody right next to it.
- 21 CHAIR TOLEDO: You're right. There's fire
- 22 management that may have some state issues. I don't
- 23 know.
- 24 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Correct.
- 25 CHAIR TOLEDO: I actually don't know how much of



1 that is federal and how much of it is state. VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Yeah, but Cal Fire ends up 3 having to do quite a bit of the federal land anyway. CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. So that is an item for 4 5 discussion, if Commissioners are interested in having Jaime explore including a portion of the national forest 6 7 in each one of these districts. It doesn't appear that there's much population. 8 9 Jaime, can you put up the map that shows how many 10 people in each district? Do you know how -- there's a 11 lot of zeroes. I want to see here -- let's just make 12 sure that there's a lot of zeroes here and we're not 13 shifting populations. 14 MS. CLARK: Doing that, I can say from experience 15 that --16 CHAIR TOLEDO: Oh yes, absolutely. Give us your 17 quidance. 18 MS. CLARK: -- there's not very much population in 19 here. Right in this area, there is some population. 20 can look at moving this either in the populated areas, 21 which it's not a ton but it's more densely populated 22 here, can work on adding that in with the East San 23 Fernando Valley Base District and then adding more of the

forest itself and the unpopulated areas into South San

Fernando Valley Base District if that is agreeable with

24

1 the Commission. CHAIR TOLEDO: How much population are we talking about? And Commissioner Sadhwani. 3 4 MS. CLARK: I'll put it up. 5 CHAIR TOLEDO: This is just to try to get general consensus if we're all in agreement on this. So 6 7 Commissioner Sadhwani, do you have comments? COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: I live literally right off 8 9 of --10 CHAIR TOLEDO: Oh, cool. COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: -- Angeles National Highway 11 12 there. The squiggly line coming down into La Cañada, I'm 13 not too far from that, a couple blocks. So I don't see a 14 problem with the splits that exist. We definitely do get 15 fires in Angeles National Forest. To me, I don't exactly 16 know a whole lot about fire management but my 17 understanding is that it's a partnership between federal 18 funds and state funds and Cal Fire and federal -- it's 19 all hands on deck when we do have fires. So having 20 additional Assembly members who care about that region makes sense to me. I don't feel like we need to add 21 22 additional to that though. 2.3 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. As I look at this, we're 24 really only talking about 9, 17, 27, at most 100 there. 25 So there's not much population in this area. The impact

1	would be negligible, I believe. Jaime, tell me if I'm
2	wrong, at least in this portion that I'm looking at right
3	now.
4	MS. CLARK: Yeah, I think it would be possible to
5	add either to the South San Fernando Valley District or
6	to just include up to the forest. I think either/or.
7	And if the Commission is comfortable with it, if there
8	are larger implications with all the people added
9	together, then I can just balance the districts if
10	needed.
11	CHAIR TOLEDO: I'm going to look to the Commission
12	and see if the Commissioners are comfortable with that.
13	Yes? Okay. I don't see anyone in opposition. Anyone
14	opposed? Commissioner Sinay and Commissioner Kennedy.
15	COMMISSIONER SINAY: Just for my clarity's sake,
16	would you go up five kilometers, ten kilometers, or
17	you're going see all that and that's what let it go?
18	CHAIR TOLEDO: Do you have any recommendation,
19	Commissioner Sinay? Okay.
20	MS. CLARK: I understood the direction to be add
21	this part of or the direction that's up for discussion
22	to be add this part of Angeles National Forest in with
23	Sunland-Tujunga. So I would try to do that to the extent
24	possible based on population requirements.

CHAIR TOLEDO: Commissioner Kennedy.

COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: My further recommendation
would be to add the western part to the East San Fernando
Valley District.
MS. CLARK: Do you mean just this part or all the
way up to Santa Clarita?
COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: I don't know where the census
blocks fall. I would be fine with that east/west line
continuing all the way out to the border of Santa
Clarita, and then the southwest of those dividing lines,
yeah, that segment going with East San Fernando Valley.
MS. CLARK: I understand, thank you.
COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: Thank you.
CHAIR TOLEDO: So some of this would go to the East
San Fernando Valley and some of it would go into the
other district to the south. Okay. General consensus
here? Okay.
So we'll ask you to do that as you have time and are
able to do that with balanced deviations and not impact
the communities too much.
Any further direction for the line drawers at this
time? Commissioner Taylor.
COMMISSIONER TAYLOR: Sorry got get into this a
little late, but services to the Angeles National Forest
come from the Santa Clarita Sheriff Station area. So do

we want to align them with where they get some of their

- fire services from? As it is in tax schemes, it makes
 sense to me according to where they get their emergency
 services from in regards to fire management.
 - CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you, Commissioner Taylor. Any suggestions on where the lines should be drawn? Keeping it in Santa Clarita?

- CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. You would keep it as is. All right. Commissioner Kennedy. No comment. So it doesn't sound like we have consensus on adjusting population.

 Any other comments on this? It really is national forest, so maybe it is a federal issue rather than a
 - COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: So I guess my thinking is that part to the northwest of the new cross there in the middle of the forest would be with Santa Clarita, a part with East San Fernando Valley, and part with South San Fernando Valley. So everybody has a part of it. Thank you.
 - CHAIR TOLEDO: Given that there's not a lot of population, I'm going to suggest we move on in a second. Let's just get clarification as to whether we're going to do this. So I want to hear from Andersen and Taylor, and then we're going to move on.
- 25 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: I really like that idea

1 because we're talking about representation. I'm sure that some of the firefighting has to come up from 3 Tujunga. But we need three Assembly people on it to make 4 sure it's going to get the proper funds and also be able 5 to work with the Congressmen in this area. I like what Commissioner Kennedy said. 6 7 CHAIR TOLEDO: I would just say that this area does have representation. It's certainly represented. 8 9 talking about more representation. 10 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Correct. 11 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. Commissioner Taylor. 12 want the public to think this area doesn't have 13 representation. It certainly does. Commissioner Taylor. 14 COMMISSIONER TAYLOR: Right. Again, one of the 15 things -- I just look at it from a sense of where they 16 get their resources so they can have a vested interested 17 in deciding how their resources are used. So actually, 18 where Commissioner Sadhwani brought up that little line, 19 La Cañada at Montrose, those services are split between 20 Santa Clarita and it goes along the lines that you have 21 now to the other side. 22 Sunland Tujunga technically does not participate in the allocation of the resources. The resources come from 2.3 24 Santa Clarita along down to the La Cañada to the 210

Corridor. That's where the resources come from when

1	we're talking about fire management. So the Sunland
2	Tujunga doesn't necessarily participate in the same
3	manner in that fire management. Thank you.
4	CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you, Commissioner Taylor. It
5	doesn't seem like we have consensus here. Again, since
6	the population of the districts do have representation,
7	let's move on to other areas of the map. Other direction
8	we want to give to the line drawers for Los Angeles
9	County? We are looking for consensus on direction just
10	so that the line drawers aren't spending time on
11	conflicting direction. Commissioner Sadhwani.
12	COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: I'm generally comfortable
13	with the direction we're moving in here. I would love to
14	get public comment on the maps. For me, I feel like
15	CHAIR TOLEDO: Me too.
16	COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: it would be helpful if we
17	can have an opportunity in our schedule to revisit this
18	after we've had a chance to post it, people have had a
19	chance to digest, I think that would be helpful. But in
20	generally, I'm generally pretty pleased with the
21	direction we're moving in, maybe some minor refinements.
22	CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. So certainly, I think we
23	certainly want the public to weigh in on this. And there
24	are certainly opportunities to weigh in either through

public comment tomorrow and also if they're in the queue

today as well as through only public submission. And we'll take as much public comment as we receive. All right. Any other direction for this area? Commissioner Vazquez.

COMMISSIONER VAZQUEZ: Not direction, but just because -- thank you for zooming out. Do we have the same -- where is the data box for the east part of -- sorry, the west part of the Antelope Valley? Oh, because it's up in Kern. Got it. Perfect. Okay, thank you.

MS. CLARK: Would you like to move on back to Kennedy's area?

CHAIR TOLEDO: Let's see. I just want to make sure that there's no other direction for Los Angeles County before we head up to Kennedy's area. Any other comments here on Los Angeles County? We will be going up to Sacramento, and we're going to be looking at the Vineyard area. If there's no other comments here, we'll going back to Northern California. We're going to give Jaime huge thanks, props, and appreciation for all your great work.

To the public, the maps you saw today are the maps that we're exploring for -- that we've been working on and visualizing and that we have for you, and they will be posted as soon as we possibly can, either tonight or tomorrow. We're working on that as we speak. And we

1	will be going up to Sacramento area for review of that
2	area. And I think our staff needs a five-minute break,
3	so we're going to take a five-minute break to switch line
4	drawers and then we'll be back in five minutes. And
5	that'll give us all time to
6	MR. MANOFF: Chair, our next scheduled break is at
7	6:25. Do you want to just take it early? Take fifteen
8	right now?
9	CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. Let's just take fifteen
10	minutes now, because we have a scheduled break in a
11	couple minutes. So let's just take it now. We'll come
12	back. Grab your dinner because this is going to be a
13	working session. Thank you.
14	(Whereupon, a recess was held from 6:17 p.m. to
15	6:33 p.m.)
16	CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you. Welcome back to the
17	California Citizens Redistricting Commission. We've been
18	visualizing all day and continue to visualize. We have
19	just looked at the changes for Los Angeles County and are
20	very pleased with them. We are now looking at Sacramento
21	County. We worked on this yesterday. We're exploring
22	some possible tweaks in this area.
23	Commissioner Fernandez, I'm going to ask you to
24	actually, I'm going to ask Kennedy to go through some of
25	these changes. This is a snapshot to the of course,

1	this is just the visualization we're exploring here. And
2	we'll see where this visualization goes. You can see
3	where the impacts are in the map. So Kennedy, can you
4	walk us through some of the potential changes here?
5	MS. WILSON: Yes, one moment. Let me pull those up.
6	I wasn't sure what we were starting with, so I moved, but
7	let me put that visualization back up. Thank you,
8	Commission.
9	CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you. Thank you for joining us
10	again today, and for working on this, this morning and
11	this afternoon. So can you go through some of these
12	changes?
13	MS. WILSON: Yes. Thank you also, Commissioner
14	Fernandez for sending this over.
15	CHAIR TOLEDO: Before we move on to that,
16	Commissioner Fornaciari has a comment. And then
17	Commissioner Fernandez has a comment as well. And then
18	we'll introduce this as this is a visualization of
19	trying to get Vineyard into Sacramento and some of the
20	challenges we have, just so the public and the
21	Commissioners can see why it's so difficult to get
22	Vineyard into a Sacramento-based District.
23	Commissioner Fornaciari and then Commissioner
24	Fernandez, and then we'll go back to Kennedy to give an
25	overview.

COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Kennedy, I'm sorry, when you were zoomed out, this looked like our draft map and not the map that we wound up with yesterday. But you've just changed it that much. Is that -
MS. WILSON: Given the sheet file that was sent to

MS. WILSON: Given the sheet file that was sent to me, I made changes that were on that sheet file, and I still have our version from yesterday too. This is just the changes with the sheet file that was sent over.

CHAIR TOLEDO: So let me give some context to this, and this might help us. We are exploring possible changes that Commissioner Fernandez has been working with our line drawers on to potentially move Vineyard into the District. So we're trying to visualize what it might look like if we included Vineyard into this area.

Certainly, this has been looked at before, but we're trying to see if there's a possibility of a path forward with this. This is for visualization purposes, and that's where we're at. And certainly, we have very high deviations that we have to work through, but this an exploration. So Kennedy — actually, Commissioner Fernandez and then Kennedy.

COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Thank you so much. I'm not sure if everyone recalls, but besides the VRA Districts, trying to get Vineyard in was one of my high priorities.

So I went home last night to work on it again. I was

- 1 having computer issues, and now, it worked out. So based 2 on the information, I moved in Vineyard.
- I don't know, Kennedy, if you can maybe zoom into
- 4 | that, that would be great. Thank you. And to address
- 5 Commissioner Fornaciari, some of the neighborhoods might
- 6 be different up top. I'm not sure from what you did
- 7 because I was working -- I didn't have the latest
- 8 information in terms of -- so what I did is I moved in
- 9 Vineyard plus that section above it just to make it
- 10 | whole. And then what I did in terms of the boundaries, I
- 11 obviously had to move some of the population from the SAC
- 12 Elk Grove up to West SAC.
- And so what I did there was -- if Kennedy zooms in,
- 14 | I brought the western boundary down to 35th Avenue.
- 15 | That's by the -- that draws the line from the airport to
- 16 99, I believe. And then on the West Side, I went
- 17 | through -- that boundary came down -- yes, thank you,
- 18 | Kennedy, that's perfect. And then on the West Side --
- 19 I'm sorry, the East Side, right about -- yeah. We went
- 20 | through Broadway to San Joaquin to 14th Avenue, and then
- 21 just carried that across.
- 22 And by doing this, I was able to maintain quite a
- 23 bit of the communities of interest that wanted to be kept
- 24 together in the SAC Elk Grove community. And I did
- 25 | not -- I don't believe I touched the West Plaster. I

1	might've moved some neighborhoods around, but for the
2	most part, as you can see, the SAC Elk Grove does have a
3	somewhat higher deviation of 4.83. We could
4	theoretically move the boundaries, but I felt that I was
5	trying to respect as many communities of interest as
6	possible, and I felt fine having a 4.83. I do believe
7	it's based on the communities. I don't think they're
8	going to mind having a 4.83 if we can get Vineyard in.
9	But of course, what's going to happen then is the
10	SAC_STANIS now has a negative 10.49. So because I didn't
11	have our updated maps, I wasn't able to work on that
12	piece of it. So we'll have to in order for this to
13	work, we're going to have to bring in some population to
14	fill that gap of at least six percent.
15	CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you for that overview,
16	Commissioner Fernandez, and thank you for drafting a map
17	on the GIS system.
18	Kennedy, can you talk to us about the potential
19	impacts and what we would have to do if we were to
20	incorporate Vineyard into a Sacramento-based District
21	with our current map? And I believe you're on mute.
22	MS. WILSON: So as you can see the surrounding
23	areas, this is also due to Commissioner Fernandez using
24	the older map, so I followed these boundaries that were
25	in the sheet file. However, this impact with the maps

that we have now, I do not have.

CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. Maybe if you and Commissioner Fernandez can take this back and start exploring that on your own, and if there's a path forward, I'd like to see it tomorrow. So please take this and we'll see if there's a path forward. It looks very complicated and very difficult to have a path forward, but if anyone is able to do it, it would be Kennedy.

MS. WILSON: Can we perhaps just put the new lines on top in the --

CHAIR TOLEDO: Sure, let's do that. Let's talk about that. Let's look at the new lines overlapping these lines, and perhaps there's some discussion that you want to have. And then after this, I do want to go to public comments. We'll be going to public comment earlier, given that it doesn't look like we will be able to work through this.

COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: I think we can probably take the seat out numbers off so that it's not as confusing. I think that might be helpful, thank you.

MS. WILSON: Yes, I will do that now. I am going to make those changes now from this. As you can see, the green lines, I'll make them slightly bigger so they're a bit easier to see. So this would bring in Vineyard. It balances Sacramento; however, it does not balance all the

1 outside districts. So I'm just going to do this really 2 quickly to show you it's not going to take very long. CHAIR TOLEDO: Do this with the new district 3 4 configurations? MS. WILSON: Yes, with the new district 5 configurations. 6 7 CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. Thank you. Commissioner Fornaciari has a comment. 8 9 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: No, I already barged in 10 and made my comment. Thank you. 11 CHAIR TOLEDO: Oh, okay. 12 Commissioner Sinay. 13 COMMISSIONER SINAY: Can I encourage us to put this 14 at the very end of the agenda tomorrow, so that we can 15 get to the Southern part of California? 16 CHAIR TOLEDO: Oh, absolutely. 17 COMMISSIONER SINAY: Because we're going to need 18 more than just a couple hours, and we have spent so much 19 time in this area. 2.0 CHAIR TOLEDO: Absolutely. That is the priority for tomorrow is Southern California. 21 22 Commissioner Fernandez. 2.3 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Yeah, we can definitely --CHAIR TOLEDO: And we're not doing Southern 24 25 California today because the line drawers for Southern

California aren't here. 1 2 COMMISSIONER SINAY: Oh. CHAIR TOLEDO: -- which is why. Otherwise, I 3 4 would've done Southern California right now. But they're 5 not here. They're going to be here tomorrow morning, and that's when we're going to be doing Southern California. 6 7 Otherwise, I would definitely have done Southern 8 California tonight. 9 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Oh, okay. Kennedy, 10 actually just -- if you move back up real quick --11 CHAIR TOLEDO: So that's why we're doing this right 12 now. 13 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Thank you. 14 CHAIR TOLEDO: Just for context for the Commission. 15 I wouldn't want to do it COMMISSIONER SINAY: 16 tonight anyway because it would be rushed because there's 17 public comments waiting. So I just --18 CHAIR TOLEDO: I would've wanted to start it, right? 19 But I understand your feelings. 2.0 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Can I go now? 21 CHAIR TOLEDO: Oh, absolutely. Go ahead. 22 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: I wasn't sure if I was 23 going to be interrupted again. Okay, so notice that in 24 terms of the maps that we had before versus these maps, I 25 believe they -- North Highland and Antelope were, I

1 think, flipped. Is that right, Commissioner Fornaciari? 2 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: No, no cities were split 3 in the county. COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Oh, was North Highlands 4 5 with West SAC? That's what I meant. COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Yeah. 6 7 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: I believe North Highlands 8 was with the West SAC --9 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Oh, okay. 10 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: -- District, but I am not 11 sure. But right now, it's not super important. Anyway, 12 so now, the negative 10.24. So as I mentioned earlier, 13 we'll have to get about six percent. And we do have the 14 Cal Inyo that's over quite about that we could 15 potentially move in some of those areas. 16 CHAIR TOLEDO: Any feedback from the Commission to 17 give direction to our line drawers on this? 18 Commissioner Andersen. 19 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: Yeah. With all the stuff we 20 just did to the Bay Area, then to say, oh but now, we're 21 going to try to fix this but cutting up the whole reason 22 why it shifted that way, I'd like us to revisit that. If 2.3 we're taking population from Cal Inyo and moving it to 24 NorCal and taking it all the way around, okay. But this 25 seems like --

1 CHAIR TOLEDO: This is an exploration --VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: -- out of place. CHAIR TOLEDO: -- Commissioner Andersen. And it's 3 because we don't have the Southern California map 4 5 drawers, so we're entertaining it. But right now, the maps are what they were as of yesterday. 6 7 Commissioner Fernandez. COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: I think a somewhat simple fix might be to bring in the entire Amador County into 10 that SAC STANIS. I think that would even it out, if we 11 could try that. 12 CHAIR TOLEDO: We have hands up from Commissioner 13 Fornaciari and Commissioner Turner. 14 COMMISSIONER TURNER: Oh, I'd like to see it. 15 CHAIR TOLEDO: Commissioner Turner and Commissioner 16 Fornaciari. 17 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: I'll wait. 18 CHAIR TOLEDO: Were you in consensus with wanting to 19 see this? No, okay. Commissioner Turner does. 20 So this would get us into the appropriate 21 deviations. Something to think about. Let's hear from 22 the floor. 2.3 Can you show us what the districts would look like 24 so it would have -- it would go from Rancho --25 MS. WILSON: Marietta, and then it would take all of

1 Amador County and then go down to Stanislaus where there's Oakdale and Knights Ferry and Lathrop, Manteca, 3 Ripon, eastern farming towns of San Joaquin County. 4 There's Lodi, Galt, Walnut Grove, Isleton. 5 CHAIR TOLEDO: I would want to hear community of interest testimony in this area before we move forward. 6 7 So if Commissioners could bring community input and let us know what's prompting the change. Commissioner 8 9 Fornaciari. Or it could be deviation too. It could be 10 deviation. It could be -- the reason for this change. 11 So Commissioner Fornaciari, Commissioner -- and 12 we'll go through. 13 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: I just had more of a 14 couple general comments about Northern California --15 CHAIR TOLEDO: Sure. COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: -- and maps. 16 17 CHAIR TOLEDO: Absolutely. Go ahead. 18 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Let's see. I quess maybe 19 some of the --2.0 CHAIR TOLEDO: We can move the map. Is that what 21 you -- would that help you or not? 22 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: That's fine. I just want to check in with the rest of the Commission. I feel like 23 24 maybe my reaction stifled some potential path forward,

and I want to apologize to everyone for that if it did.

Well, either way.

I proposed this Inyo to Siskiyou thing because I felt like we were stuck and looking for a solution for that. I haven't seen the public comment on this yet, if we've gotten some, but clearly, it's -- well, we did get one from Chino, right? So clearly, this is a huge district. I guess, in reflecting on it, if I lived in Oramano (ph.) -- I don't know that we've heard from them yet, but I guess I'd rather be in the Cali Inyo District if I had to choose between the two. And I heard other feedback about it.

So I just want to say, I'm open to whatever outcome the Commission decides. I'm not married to this. I just want to bring that back because Commissioner Andersen was making a suggestion and I had a reaction to it, and I feel like I shut her down and that wasn't appropriate.

So I want to apologize to her, first of all, for that.

And secondly, just say that I'm open to outcomes.

The second thing I want to say is that I received an email directly with a suggestion for modifying the border in Santa Rosa, and I forwarded that to our BordersFirst email so it'll be -- and Ravi got it. But that was one person with one piece of input on how to modify it.

That's input we've received and we'll take in, but I think it's appropriate to not react to that --

1 CHAIR TOLEDO: I saw it too, and I wasn't supportive 2 of that change. COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Okay. So I just want to 3 4 say that -- I want to acknowledge that we got it -- that 5 I got it and I sent it to you all, and that we'll look at all the public feedback that we get and go from there. 6 7 CHAIR TOLEDO: So let's hear from Commissioner 8 Kennedy, Turner, and Fernandez. Then we will go to public comment once we hear -- oh, and Sinay. So let's 10 go through all the queue, and then we'll go to public 11 comment. Fornaciari just went, so Kennedy. 12 COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: Thank you, Chair. 22	that is, Prairie City. If you can grab that section as
23	well, between Rancho Cordova, yeah. And then if
24	additional population is needed then we could go into
25	Eldorado. And I want following the 50.

1 MS. WILSON: So do not go above the 50? 2 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Right, right. Thank you. 3 CHAIR TOLEDO: Thank you. And with that, it looks 4 like we're going to be getting some more population and then we will see if we can live with it, then we'll 5 commit it and then we will incorporate it into our maps 6 7 that will be posted tomorrow. COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: We're -- we're breaking the 9 county line? Is that what's happening? I thought we didn't want to break --10 11 MS. WILSON: Oh, sorry. I was going to say to go 12 into Eldorado, that's in Eldorado County. 13 CHAIR TOLEDO: Commissioner Fernandez, Commissioner 14 Andersen, did you have comments? And Commissioner Sadhwani, as well? 15 16 VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: I do have comments. This is, 17 you know, from this point forward, it's actually 50 is 18 going up at this point. Eldorado, you know, Eldorado 19 Hills -- we're pushing it to say, you know, Folsom south, 20 but now we're talking about let's grab some of the hill 21 country and put it also south and we're also crossing the 22 county line. Wait a sec, why are we doing that? I would 2.3 rather look, still, in Sacramento. 24 CHAIR TOLEDO: So I think that was, yeah, I think 25 the general consensus was to get population from

1 Sacramento, but let's see if we still have general consensus on going into Eldorado. Commissioner Fernandez and then Commissioner 3 4 Sadhwani. 5 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: We can go into Folsom. just, at this point, I have to have you zoom in to see 6 7 where to cut because it's too far out right now. CHAIR TOLEDO: Can you zoom in so we can see where in Folsom we can pull population? And I am sensing that 10 folks are having difficulty with -- actually, Commissioner Andersen, didn't give an impression that she 11 12 did actually, so let's take it out. 13 And then Commissioner Sadhwani, did you have 14 comments? 15 COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: Yeah, I just, I mean, I was 16 under the impression that we were trying to minimize cuts of Sacramento County because it was so sacred. So to me, 17 18 I thought it --19 COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Well, not anymore, because 20 they took a little bit more of it to another county. 21 CHAIR TOLEDO: We're not -- nothing is sacred here. 22 Nothing is sacred. 2.3 COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: Where Folsom, you know, 24 maintains the county border, right? Isn't this the 25 county line here in black?

1 CHAIR TOLEDO: I don't believe so. COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Yeah, so what I was saying 3 was that we went ahead and moved another part of Sac 4 County into Solano that wasn't there before. So that's 5 another cut into -- oh, can you grab the part below? 6 Thank you. 7 CHAIR TOLEDO: So are we -- are we cutting into Sacramento County or Stanislaw County? This is all 8 9 Sacramento, okay. And what's the population that we need 10 here? 11 About 26-, maybe 25,000. MS. WILSON: CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay, and we're at 15,000. Okay, so 12 13 let's just do this off-line, because we do need to get a 14 public comment. So I'm going to ask that Commissioner 15 Fernandez work with the line drawing getting -- well, you 16 have 27,000 though. A minimum of 25,000 people to shift 17 and to get into appropriate deviation from the Sacramento 18 side, Folsom area, to be able to reach the deviations. 19 Commissioner Fernandez, did you have comments? 2.0 It looks like we have the population now; is that 21 correct, Kennedy? 22 MS. WILSON: That is correct. 2.3 CHAIR TOLEDO: It looks a little haphazard, but 24 maybe we can refine the lines out? Okay, so at this 25 point I do want to see what the Commission -- if the

1 Commission is comfortable with -- we will refine the lines around the borders, but comfortable with this change. Anyone that is not comfortable, please speak up 3 4 now. We are exploring the possibility of adding this 5 area to the ECA district. Sorry, the South Sac district. 6 Sorry, I apologize. I have too many districts in my 7 mind. And can you please zoom in so we can take a look 8 at it, so that we can see the roads up above? 9 MS. WILSON: Yes, and I can read them too, as well. 10 It goes up to East Natoma Street, comes down by Folsom 11 Lake College, goes to Oak Avenue Parkway along Riley 12 Street, down to Natoma Station Drive, and then runs along 13 Folsom Boulevard out to the border of Rancho Cordova into 14 this -- this is the prairie land underneath. 15 CHAIR TOLEDO: Let's look at the eastern border of 16 this map, and then let's also look at the southern 17 border. Let's just go around the borders and make sure 18 that -- and can you please zoom out so we can see them? 19 MS. WILSON: The eastern border here is along the 20 county line between Folsom, Sacramento, and Eldorado 21 Hills. We'll zoom out a little bit more. This is, I 22 believe, it says White Rock, this street here down on the 2.3 southern border, but that would dissolve into South 24 SAC STANIS district.

25

COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Can you grab the rest of

1	that Prairie City, just to at least make it thank you.
2	MS. WILSON: So I'm pushing this border up to
3	it's not going into Rancho Cordova, but touches just at
4	the border of Rancho Cordova.
5	CHAIR TOLEDO: I'm looking to the Commissioners and
6	making sure that we are comfortable with this change. If
7	we are, we're going to commit this and this will become
8	the new border, replace the district that was in here
9	before, and this is for deviation purposes, but primarily
10	to add Vineyard into Santa into Sacramento. And in
11	the room I'm seeing a lot of consensus around this and
12	I'm looking at the Zoom windows. I'm not seeing any
13	opposition. Let's hear from Commissioner Fernandez.
14	COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Yeah, after all this, I
15	would prefer to just keep Vineyard out. I know we went
16	through a lot, but it's it is what it is.
17	CHAIR TOLEDO: So you're willing to go with the
18	consensus? Let's see what the consensus of the group is.
19	So let's see let's just go through the lines.
20	Commissioner Sadhwani?
21	COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: I'd like to commit the
22	change.
23	CHAIR TOLEDO: Commissioner if you're not I'm
24	not going to go through everybody. If you're not
25	comfortable with this, just let me know. And I've heard

1	from Commissioner Fernandez. Is there anybody else who
2	is uncomfortable with this? Commissioner Kennedy?
3	COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: I am happy combining Vineyard
4	and Elk Grove. I feel that taking a thin slice from the
5	area in Amador, Calaveras, and Tulare to make up the
6	population in South SAC_STANIS is the best way to go
7	because those are the communities that are most similar
8	to the communities in South SAC_STANIS. Thank you.
9	CHAIR TOLEDO: And I do want to say that this is why
LO	we do it in live line drawing, because if we had sent
L1	this to visualization, we would have spent a lot of time
L2	and it would have come back and we would have gotten a
L3	no.
L 4	So Commissioner Andersen, would you be comfortable
L 5	with these possibilities in Amador County, as suggested
L 6	by Commissioner Kennedy? I think that's the area we had
L 7	highlighted previously and I believe you were not
L 8	thrilled about those.
L 9	Is that something you would consider?
20	VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: I'm more than not thrilled
21	about cutting two counties up to do this. Yes, so I'm
22	more than not thrilled.
23	CHAIR TOLEDO: So if we don't have consensus, we're
24	reverting back to our previous map. I just want to go

25

through one more time.

1	Commissioner Fernandez has her hand up.
2	VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: I'm sorry, I thought we were
3	going to do this we're talking about committing this
4	change.
5	CHAIR TOLEDO: That's right. We're committing a
6	Folsom change. So right now we're talking about the
7	Folsom change.
8	VICE CHAIR ANDERSEN: I could live with that.
9	CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay, so you can live with Folsom,
10	and I believe Commissioner Turner she could live with
11	Folsom as well, but let's hear from her and Fernandez.
12	COMMISSIONER TURNER: Yeah.
13	CHAIR TOLEDO: But I think your preference was the
14	Amador.
15	COMMISSIONER TURNER: Absolutely. That is the
16	priority. That is my preference and this just might be
17	an area we eventually may have to get to a vote on.
18	CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay. This may be an area where we
19	all have to vote on.
20	Commissioner Fernandez?
21	COMMISSIONER FERNANDEZ: Yeah, and I also agree with
22	Commissioner Kennedy and Commissioner Turner.
23	CHAIR TOLEDO: Okay, so this may be an area that
24	so we will leave this to end and if we need to get to a
25	vote on it, we will get to a vote on it. So for now,

1	this change we're going to snapshot, we're going to
2	take a picture of it. We're going to take a snap of this
3	area and at the end, once we're done with Southern
4	California, because we're going to spend enough time to
5	get the Southern California maps done adequately not
6	just adequately, done fairly, and give them the
7	appropriate time that they need and then once we get
8	through that then at the end we will come back to this
9	area and explore the possibility of a vote.
10	Commissioner Turner?
11	Fernandez, Turner, and Kennedy.
12	So for direction to Kennedy, we are not committing
13	this. We're going to snap we're just going to and
14	we're not we don't have any direction from the
15	Commission on this and so we're not committing it. We're
16	just taking it we know what it is. It's the Folsom
17	area, 25,000 essentially shifting. This may be an area
18	where we will need to take a vote on it at the end once
19	we're through since we don't have general consensus. I
20	just can't find general consensus of the Commission here.
21	So at this point, we are moving forward with public
22	comment, so we will be going to public comment now and
23	until we're done with oh, sorry, Ms. Kennedy. I
24	missed your hand, and then Akutagawa.

25

MS. WILSON: I was just going to ask. So I will

screenshot putting Vineyard in and having this negative ten percent, but go back to the map that has Vineyard.

CHAIR TOLEDO: Yeah, the maps right now we have -we looked at this and this is something we will continue.
We will have a conversation at the end of this.

In the meantime, Commissioner Fernandez will work with line drawers just looking at her particular other options that they may have. We will take a vote at the end of this process on this area if we can't get general consensus.

back to this area at the end because it may 1 potentially -- it may potentially require a vote, and so we'll need clarification on all of this, and that will be 3 4 at the end once we're done with Southern California and 5 Southern California gets the attention it deserves. So right now, let's go to public comment. 6 7 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Right now, we'll be getting the caller 3241, and up next after that will be 8 9 caller 6725. 10 Caller 3241, if you'll please follow the prompt to 11 unmute by pressing star six. The floor is yours. 12 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Can you hear me? 13 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: We sure can. 14 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: All right. MR. QUINONES: Good afternoon. My name is Steve Quinones (phonetic). I live in the Florence-Graham community. I have lived here for over fifty years. here to talk about the 105 draft map. For many years, our Florence-Graham community has been neglected on all levels to include the State Assembly. This new proposed 105 map has the tax slips from all the communities that we have common in interest. We have been added to the map that contains Inglewood, Hawthorne, two communities that are completely opposite our community. People twenty-five and older with high school diplomas, Hawthorne and Inglewood, is seventy-seven percent, while Florence and Graham is less than forty-five percent. People with ambassadors over age of twenty-five is Hawthorne and Inglewood over twenty-three percent, while Florence-Graham we have only five percent with bachelor's degrees. These examples are just to show you the difference of what priorities these very different communities would have. I am asking you to stop the injustice to our communities and place the Florence-Graham community with the Gateway Corridor map that includes Huntington Park and Walnut Park. Thank you.

PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. And

right now we have caller 5038. And up next after that will be caller 7175. Caller 5038 if you'll please follow the prompts to unmute by pressing star six. The floor is yours. Caller 5038 double-check your telephone and make sure you are not on mute. You are unmuted in the meeting.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Hi Commissioners. Good evening. I was already on the line when I heard the new changes to the SCV map. I was originally calling to say that I Agua Dulce and Acton in the High Desert areas in LA County should be connected to the SCV map, and that would reinforce communities of interest and resolve your overpopulation issues in the Victor Valley, High Desert Valley. My solution of adding those areas to SCV makes so much more sense than extending SCV to Woodland Hills. It's at minimum, an hour from Santa Clarita to Woodland Hills, and there's no way to drive between the two while staying in the district. So please remove Woodland Hills, West Hills, Northbridge and add Acton, Agua Dulce, Gorman, and Lake Andrews to the SCV map. This will make

1 SCV more compact, protect millions of interests, and resolve your population issue in the Victor Valley High 3 Desert district. I hope you'll listen to me and other 4 like-minded callers. So have a good evening. Thank you. 5 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. right now we have caller 7175. And up next after that 6 7 will be caller 3812. And as a reminder to all those 8 calling in to please take your time with the names, names 9 of cities for our interpreter. Caller 7175 please follow 10 the prompts to unmute by pressing star six. The floor is 11 yours. Thank you. Good evening, Commissioners. 12 MR. PAYNE: 13 This is Jeremy Payne (phonetic) calling on behalf of 14 Equality California. I wanted to call in and thank the 15 Commission for your ongoing work with the Glen LA 16 Assembly district in Los Angeles and for the robust 17 discussions about how best to unify our LGBTQ2+ 18 communities and the neighborhoods from Silver Lake to 19 West Hollywood in the Fairfax, La Brea, Larchmont, 20 Miracle Mile, and Melrose areas and neighborhoods. 21 bringing in all these communities, we have one of the 22 most empowering districts for Los Angeles LGBTQ2+ 23 community now. And there's a historic significance for 24 us as well. This district brings in Silver Lake, which 25 was the site of one of the first demonstrations of

1 LGBTQ2+ liberation in the United States, the 1967 black cat riot, and ties of history with a district that 3 includes the City of West Hollywood, the first city in 4 the nation to have a majority openly gay governing board 5 in 1983. And in present day, the City of West Hollywood is widely considered one of the nation's most prominent 6 7 LGBTQ2+ hotspots with locations for nightlife, as well as 8 just having many members that live in this community. And so I want to thank the Commission once again for 10 creating a district that truly unifies and empowers our 11 local LGBTQ2+ community, and this was one of the strongest considerations of this district that we have 12 13 seen to date. So thank you so much for your work. And 14 we look forward to seeing the final map for this area. 15 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. 16 right now, we have caller 3812. And up next after that 17 will be caller 8743. Call 3812, if you'll please follow 18 the prompts to unmute by pressing star six. The floor is 19 yours. 20 MS. VOGEL: Hi, I am Gail Vogel (phonetic), and from 21 the Santa Clarita Valley, and I am really, really pleased 22 with your Congressional district map that you've that 23 you've drawn the first time. And because we -- these 24 communities share -- we're mostly residential commuter 25 cities and it's contiguous, and it has -- all these

share similar communities of interest in San Bernardino

County. In the past, we have been represented by

population centers in LA County, which disenfranchised

the voices of smaller communities like mine. In the

eleventh hour, the Commission has drawn a VRA district

1 that disenfranchised our voice in Sacramento. Thank you. PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. right now we have caller 9747. And up next after that 3 4 will be caller 4527.
