

Jesus “Jesse” Fraire (Tohono O’odham/Chicano) is the current Statewide Census Manager and Southern California Regional Outreach Manager with the California Native Vote Project. He holds a BA in Political Science and currently focuses on civic engagement advocacy and outreach for Tribal communities across the state, along with field campaign coordination and management in Southern California.

The California Native Vote Project, or CNVP, is the first-of-its-kind statewide effort to engage Native American communities across dozens of counties to build political power through an integrated voter engagement strategy. We launched three months prior to the 2016 presidential election to educate Native American voters, and has since expanded into integrated voter engagement and census advocacy and outreach.

CNVP has deep partnerships with California Indian Tribes and Native-led nonprofits throughout California and is a member of national Native American groups: Native Voice Network, the Native American Voting Rights Coalition, and Advance Native Political Leadership. It is also a part of several statewide multi-racial, multi-issue tables, including Youth Organize California, Power California and California Calls.
