I hope you have coffee and your specialty muffins this morning so that you're able to dial-in and engage with us on today. We are listening. And we are here to take your comments. At this time Katie will be in your hands.

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PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Good morning, Chair.

In order to maximize transparency and public participation in our process, the Commissioners will be taking public comment by phone. My name is Alberto. And I would like to ask for you guys to please consider the VRA Latino for our Senate for the cities of Riverside, Jurupa Valley, Lake Elsinore, Moreno Valley, (indiscernible), San Jacinto, Good Hope, Nuevo, Romoland, Lakeview, Woodcrest, High Grove, Lead Valley, Homeland, and Green Acres to keep our communities together. Thank you so much.

PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you.

MS. DUPONT-WALKER: Good morning. And before I start, I want to report yesterday twice when he asked my phone to unmute I did and was unable to unmute. That may be a glitch the system.

But good morning. My name is Jacque Dupont-Walker.

And I represent the AME Church, African Methodist

Episcopal Church, with over one hundred across the state.

We are a partner in the Black Hub presentation. So we commend their visualizations to this Committee.

I want to thank each of you for what you do. I served on the LA City Redistrict Commission twice. So I know exactly what you're going through. And thank you for the fact I can do this from the comfort of my home with my cup of coffee.

Thank you for what you've done with the Senate match. It is so important to us here in the Los Angeles area. I support the hard-working commission, the work you have done to address the dilution of the African-American voting strength in that map.

I urge you, however, to still work on the

Congressional line. Once again, the current lines

eliminated African-American district and representation

in Los Angeles, putting us in peril in the state. We

- don't want this to be the legacy of the 2020, '21 effort.

 And work also remains to be done on the assembly line.
- The collapsing of African-American seats by half should not be the legacy of our work here.

We want to revive our communities. We want to honor the American Civil Rights movement. And we want to work in the spirit of the Voting Rights Act. It is so important for us to remember equity in action. And that's what we have the opportunity to do today. You represent a significant part of voting, then the census, and redistricting. It has been a stellar effort so far, and we support you going --

My name is Bobbie Singh-Allen. I am the proud mayor

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1 residents. And we are also home of the fourth largest school district, the Elk Grove Unified School district. 3 I am a proud Asian-American immigrant. And I wanted 4 to share with you some important statistics about our 5 city. We are a majority-minority city, including thirty-6 three percent representing the AAPI community. 7 And I am calling to strongly oppose being included in the Solano County visualization map. I have heard 8 very loudly from many of my constituents who raised 10 significant concerns. This is Senate District 6 and 11 Assembly District 9. We share the same goal of keeping communities of 12 13 interest together with fair representation of minority 14 groups. Our voice and residents are diluted in the 15 Solano County map proposal. So just wanted to strongly 16 urge staying as close to the current map with adjustments 17 to reflect the population only. 18 I want to thank all of you for your service. 19 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thirty seconds. 20 MS. SINGH-ALLEN: And thank you, again, for 21 extending public comment period so that more of us can 22 raise our concerns with all of you. Thank you, again, 2.3 for the opportunity. Have a great morning.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Hello. I'm calling in reference to Visualization Page 5, VSD_SWRIV_1027. I -- I am not in favor of including the Cities of Temecula, Corona, Coronita, Wildomar, Menifee, Murrieta.

With my communities of interest as a Latino resident here for all my life, these communities do not reflect -- not only the sentiments -- but the demographics of the rest of the cities that you mention on your visualization.

Are -- for the Senate district we want to make sure that our VRA is aligned with our communities of interest as Latinos. These communities: Temecula, Corona, Coronita, Wildomar, Menifee, Murrieta do not have the same demographics and income that we do in the Cities of Riverside, Jurupa Valley, Lake Elsinore, Marino Valley, Perris, San Jacinto, Good Hope, Nuevo, Romoland, Lakeview, Woodcrest, High Grove, Mead Valley, Homeland, Greenacres. The cities I just mentioned, that -- that's what we want our Senate district to be, as it reflects the Latino VRA. We want to make sure that our community has a voice, and it's not incorporated with communities

- 1 that have not had good sentiments toward Latino
- 2 residents. Especially Latino -- the City of Temecula has
- 3 passed many resolutions against -- anti-immigrant
- 4 resolutions which do not align with our -- with our
- 5 communities of interest as Latinos.
- 6 Please --
- 7 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thirty seconds.
- 8 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: -- consider not including the
- 9 cities that I mentioned in our Senate for -- for the
- 10 Riverside County. Thank you so much.

- 19 My name is Patrick McFarland. And I am a -- a south
- 20 Los Angeles resident. And I'm commenting on the
- 21 | Congressional Senate and Assembly maps.
- 22 While we -- while there is work on the map that
- 23 | remains, I wanted to thank the Commission for addressing
- 24 | the concerns about African-American representation in the
- 25 Senate plan, and the concerns of communities of interest

in West and South Los Angeles, and to support the new architecture for Los Angeles.

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I do think that there is still work to do on the Assembly and Congressional maps to unite black communities in Los Angeles.

South Los Angeles is a long-standing, welldocumented community of interest with shared common,
social, and economic interests that should be included
within common districts for the purpose of effective and
fair representation. Preserving this voting strength
means ensuring all of these communities in their sizable
African-American populations, stay connected in two
Senate districts and four Assembly districts.

I ask that the Commission should look at the options submitted by the NAACP, My Black Counts, the California Black Census and Redistricting Hub, and the Equal Representation Project. Thank you.

PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much.

Caller 0983, if you will please follow the prompts to unmute at this time by pressing star six. And one more time, caller 0983, you'll please follow the prompts to unmute at this time by pressing star six. The floor is yours.

MS. LI: My name is Linda Li. I -- I am -- I was happy to see the Commission recognize the current Little Saigon bordering of Garden Grove, Westminster, Midway City, and Fountain Valley together in sum up the latest map. And discuss of the bring back like extend area of Little Saigon to Los Alamitos, and Rossmoor. I really appreciate that you are hearing us. However, I was sad to hear a Commissioner talk about adding -- adding Costa Mesa to Little Saigon instead of Huntington Beach and Seal Beach. If you need to add more area to Little Saigon, the best area where our community of interest -- interests come together is Huntington Beach and Seal Beach. Huntington Beach Harbor in Huntington Beach has almost thirty percent Asian-American, roughly around 7,000 residents with one point four square miles. Huntington Beach, Westminster, Garden Grove, and Fountain Valley school district cross over each other city. For example, Huntington Beach Union High School District oversees schools that are in Westminster and Fountain Valley. Fountain Valley School District it's in Huntington Beach, Garden Grove. And -- and (indiscernible) School District is the Westminster and Garden Grove.

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My children have moved to Huntington Beach, but they

1 come over to visit us and go to the grocery store here. And we love it when --UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thirty seconds. 3 4 MS. LI: -- they bring the grandkids over so that 5 they can celebrate the festival with us and attend weekends -- we can (inaudible) temple with us. 6 7 Costa Mesa is different from City of Little Saigon. There are no school districts --8 9 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Fifteen. 10 MS. LI: -- that crossover with -- with Costa Mesa. 11 We don't go to Costa Mesa to go grocery shopping or 12 to restaurants there. We go towards Huntington Beach and 13 seal Beach where it's close to my children. And a 14 largest number --PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. 15 16 And right now we have caller 4585. And up next after that will be caller 2966. 17 18 Caller 4585, if you will please follow the prompts 19 to unmute at this time by pressing star six. The floor 20 is yours. 21 MS. MCLEAN: Good morning. I'm Marsha McLean, 22 Councilwoman for the City of Santa Clarita. I am also 2.3 the current chair of the North County Transportation 24 Coalition KPA, soon to become our own COG. 25

We are a large community as the -- the lines are now

drawn. We have a diverse population ethnically,
socially, economically. We are a community of interest
regarding our water, our infrastructure, our electricity,
our education.

- And there was, I heard, a map proposed by your consultant that stripped us away from the North County and put us into the San Fernando Valley quite heavily.

 And if you were to look at the demo -- the demographic, the topography, we are separated from the San Fernando Valley by mountains. And that just doesn't seem like it could possibly work.
- So I'm asking you to look more closely at the lines that are drawn now, keep us whole with the North County.

 Keep our city whole. And take a look at the -- the lines, as I said, as they are drawn now. They're working very well for us along with Simi Valley, and the way we are looped into the other areas. North County has fought long and hard --
- 19 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thirty seconds.
 - MS. MCLEAN: -- to get representation for us. And to take that away now would just not be good for our residents. As I said, very diverse population socially and economically.
- 24 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Fifteen.
- MS. MCLEAN: So thank you so much for taking that

1 into concern.

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And if anyone needs -- wants to come out to take a look at how we are out here and how we're separated by the mountains from the San Fernando Valley, I think it might be worthwhile.

PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much.

I live in Fresno County. And the way the visualizations are now it separates those communities of color, and will not allow them to have a voice in Congress. The Fresno map is all over the place right now, and it breaks up the Latino community, therefore muting their voices in government.

There needs to be representation for the Latino community just south of Shaw Avenue in Fresno.

Again, thank you for all you guys are doing. I know it's a lot to take into consideration for the whole State of California, but we do appreciate your time and your

1 effort. Thank you. And have a good morning. PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. And right now have callers 6777. And up next after 3 that will be caller 3966. 4 5 Caller 6777, if you will please follow the prompts to unmute at this time by pressing star six. The floor 6 7 is yours. MS. HEROSBERRY: Thank you. Thank you. 8 I live in Fresno County. 10 And first, I want to thank you so much for all your 11 time and effort to serve on this Committee. 12 I live in Fresno. My name is Kay Herosberry (ph.). 13 And I ask you to not divide our Hispanic communities. 14 Dividing up our communities takes our voice away, and it 15 makes it difficult to elect people who really can 16 represent us and know us well. 17 Please stay with the court -- current map. And 18 again, please do not divide the Hispanic community in 19 Fresno County. Thank you. 2.0 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. 21 All right. Now, we have caller 3966. I am calling 3 to notify that I am not in favor of including Hemet or 4 the East Hemet in our Assembly district. As a Latino, these cities -- cities do not have and will not represent 5 our community of interest. Please do not include Hemet 6 7 or the East Hemet in our Assembly district. These cities do not reflect our community nor our population. Most of 8 it would be racism. Please consider, instead, Good Hope 10 for our Assembly district. Thank you. 11 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. 12 And right now we have caller 6058. And up next 13 after that will be caller 8348. 14 Caller 6058, if you will please follow the prompts 1.5 to unmute at this time by pressing star six. And one 16 more time, caller 6058, if you will please follow the 17 prompts to unmute at this time by pressing star six. That connects our 19 community with the other rural communities in the Inland 20 Empire. Our community is definitely -- our community 21 definitely fills a tie to other rural areas. And I think 22 this visualization is a great example of giving rural 2.3 communities fair representation. 24 I would urge the Commission to keep these maps as

close to the final map as possible moving forward, and

- 1 also encourage the Commission to keep up the good work. 2 My community feels heard. Thank you. 3 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: All right. Now, we will 4 have caller 0793. And I'm calling regarding 13 the districting map that I viewed a few weeks ago. 14 I live in Seal Bach, California. And the current 15 map is showing -- bringing in three cities from Orange 16 County into LA County. So Seal Beach is in Orange 17 County. And those cities are Los Alamitos, Rossmoor, and 18 Cyprus. Really, those three cities have nothing in 19 common with going over the 605 into Los Angeles County. 20 So really the -- the concept is keep LA County cities
 - There's a couple of just pertinent things. One, the 605 clearly defines Orange County and Los Angeles County. Also, these three cities we all share school districts, all of us. Also, all of the mutual aid agreements that

together, keep Orange County cities together.

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1 we have are all within these cities. And all the communications for first -- first responders. So we 3 share no mutual aid with Long Beach, which is where 4 you're trying to put these cities. All of the cities --5 again, I'm in Seal Beach -- so we're saying these three cities are more like us in how we use things, schools, 6 7 first responders, and mutual aid agreements. So we hope you'll reconsider drawing and keeping LA 9 County cities within LA, and Orange County cities within 10 Orange County. 11 Thank you so much allowing this. Have a good day. 12 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you. 13 And right now we will have caller 8348. And up next 14 after that will be caller 1043. 15 Caller 8348, if you will please follow the prompts 16 to unmute at this time by pressing star six. 17 MS. DIOS: Good morning. 18 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: The floor is yours. 19 MS. DIOS: Thank you. Good morning. Linda Dios 20 here of Yolo County and the City of Davis. I'm quite concerned about the two visualizations I see here, both 21 22 for our -- the Congressional district. That would be, I 23 believe the Tehanapa 1027, and oh, no, sorry. For 24 Congress, it's NORCAL 1027. We have -- we called in 25 before. I called in last week, asking that we be placed

in with Solano County because we have so much more in common with Solano County and even Napa County.

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With regard to our water needs, transportation needs, fire protection, education, and economic wherein we have UC Davis that is located in both Solano and Yolo Counties. We don't have any communities of interest with the counties bordering the Oregon border and further north.

Secondly, I'm calling in about the Assembly districts. Terados, Tehadapa, and Salona. You have split Davis into two. We have a very large community called El Nesaro that shops with us, shares our school district with us, shares our utility districts with us. But they are now in a separate Assembly district. You also split up the Town of Winters. And that makes no sense to us considering the fire dangers we had in the mountains there.

So please keep us all into one Assembly district.

Right now, you've got Yolo split into three. Don't -
please don't use us as the way to keep your lines in

order, keep us with our communities in interest. Thank

you.

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MR. WING: Hello my name is Long Wing (ph.).

I am from Orange County, that's where I live. I am pleased for the Commission working has to draw this district. But I disappointed to hear the Commission talking about this adding (indiscernible) Little Saigon areas. Our two community -- communities do not have anything in common.

This Little Saigon district that the Commissioning had drawn contained a high concentration of the Vietnamese and Asian young relations so this is a 42 percent Asian -- percent Asian is not an Asian city. It is not -- it is only a nine percent Asian. Adding customization to Little Saigon would decrease the Asian nature of our area and hurt us to be able to elect candidates of our choice who truly have our community interests at heart.

This is hard to understand that any elected official would represent Costa Masa and Little Saigon where if our communities are so different. Our communities make a mistake ten years ago when we did not get involved and voice our voices. We enter from one Congress member who weak represent entire Little Saigon community and care for our concerns to three Congressional members who have

little interest in our community.

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Only one of this member have one staff member who spoke with me. Our elderly prefer Vietnamese to English so it is so disappointing with two of our Congressional member don't have a -- need to have someone who speak Vietnamese when we call them. There is not a care to wanting to help or they are not able to any because no one can speak Vietnamese there.

This is what happened to us ten years ago and I am begging you do not use -- not to do it again to us. I would appreciate and ask Commission to keep Cosa Mesa away from our Little Saigon area and keep our Vietnamese, Asian inclusivity intact.

PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much.

We are greatly concerned by the proposed Senate and Congressional maps presented for Davis and Yolo County.

We believe the Assembly map is generally reasonable but could be improved. Our greatest concern is that the Senate and Congressional maps shift Davis and much or all of Yolo County to a new inland north state district that stretches all the way from Yolo County to the Oregon border through sparsely populated rural areas.

It divorces our city and county from adjourning urban and suburban areas in the Sacramento metropolitan area, the Napa/Solano area, East Bay and northern Sacramento Valley which is a better fit for us. This is a radical and unfortunate departure from existing boundary lines.

The current districts place Davis in a much more compact geographic area comprised of midsized urban and suburban communities in a coherent community of interest.

The new Congressional and Senate lines are contrary to the principles upon which the state Commission is supposed to operate and would greatly hinder the

- effective representation of residents of the City of Davis and Yolo County.

So I remind you of that as you are making public comment and so that you can appreciate the enormity of the task that we are attempting.

Also a couple of helpful tips I'd love for you to please consider as you are writing or -- writing in and calling in. First of all, when you're calling in for a couple of callers that's naming my district, I would love to know exactly who you are and where your district is. But it's helpful when you name your district and say this the district that I'm in.

It's helpful to name what you want along with what you don't want. So to call in and say, I don't like this and don't tell us what you do, doesn't really provide a lot of helpful instruction. So we are listening, but it's helpful when you can add in -- when you know, what you'd like to see. And then, thirdly, I'd just like to suggest, when applicable, if applicable, please indicate which visualization you're responding to. Is it the Assembly, the Congressional maps visualizations? Is it the Senate visualizations? And it kind of will allow us to focus on specifically what you're speaking concerning. 1 from Siskiyou County. I've been a rancher here for fifty-two years, and I am concerned with the lines that are drawn for Siskiyou County. It splits our county in 3 4 half along the I-5 corridor, which puts us half with the Bay Areas and the Delta communities of Yolo, Solano, and 5 Sacramento. And the other half of it with the coastal 6 7 communities, both of which are areas that we do not have common interests with, and in fact, have competing 8 9 interests, and making meaningful representation difficult 10 or impossible. 11 We travel mostly from north to south; east to west 12 is difficult. We are geographically isolated from each 13 other, as well as economically and culturally. Our 14 community interests are predominately rural, 15 agricultural, forest management and water resources, and 16 we need to be connected with other communities of similar 17 interests. We cannot be connected under any 18 circumstances to the coast -- Sacramento or Yolo 19 Counties. Sacramento and Yolo are Delta counties that 20 have conflicting --21 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thirty seconds. 22 MS. PIMENTEL: -- interests with us. They are urban 2.3 and more connected to the Bay Area and coastal 24 California, and our interests are with forest management, 25 water, and agriculture and require proper representation

a such. And so --

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2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Fifteen.

MS. PIMENTEL: -- thank you for providing us this opportunity. Thank you.

PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. And right now we will be going to caller 1007. If you will please follow the prompts to unmute at this time by pressing star six. The floor is yours.

MS. SMITH: Oh, hi. My name is Belin Smith. Good morning, Redistricting Committee. I am calling back because I think I forgot to leave my name. I was just saying that I've lived in -- my name is Belin Smith, and I've lived in the City of Seal Beach for seventeen years, and I live at Leisure World. And I and many of our Leisure World community are completely opposed and are against becoming part of the Los Angeles and Orange County redistricting. We have nothing in common with the Los Angeles County from our Orange County transit, our healthcare, our education, and utility companies, and water companies.

Our law enforcement have a mutual agreement between the Orange County neighboring cities where they cross the city lines and help one another. Unlike Long Beach and Los Angeles County, and that's really very important to us, especially as senior citizens. We will become an

1 outcast if we become Long Beach or Los Angeles County, so please, please don't make us an orphan city. Please 3 don't separate us from the rest of Orange County. We 4 really need representation that fits our needs and our 5 concerns, and I truly am prayerfully asking and making an earnest appeal that you include our objections; please 6 7 listen to our pleas with your community discussions. And I want to thank you in advance, and once again, God bless 8 you and have a blessed day, and I will continue to pray 10 believe for America. Because Long 14 Beach and LA County are completely different from Orange 15 County. We have no common interests and our district 16 representation could be completely muted. So please, add 17 back our three cities of Los Alamitos, Cypress, Rossmoor, 18 into Orange County, where we belong. I go up to Medford for a 4 specialist there, which is I-5, and it's fifty miles. 5 And I go to -- I go to Redding on I-5, which is an hourand-a-half. So mainly, people here in Siskiyou County 6 7 use I-5 for all our commerce and everything that we do. And so the last visualization I saw is totally 8 unacceptable to me, that you would split Siskiyou County 10 in half and put it on the coast where we have absolutely 11 nothing in common with the people on the coast, nor do 12 they have anything in common with us. 13 Also, I wanted to make a comment that I have been in 14 the public input comments, and I noticed that there's 15 someone who's frequently put input in there by the name 16 of Matt Steiner, and just FYI in case the Commission 17 doesn't know, Mr. Steiner is running for Congressional 18 District 1, and --19 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Ten seconds. 2.0 MS. I want to reinforce how well-drawn 21 the north LA County map was for the Senate in Set A of 22 the original visualizations, and voice my concerns about 23 VSD SCSFV 1027, which extends from Santa Clarita, where I 24 live, to Van Nuys in North Hollywood. I don't think

you'll get a single call from anybody, I'm willing to

1 wager, saying that that map makes sense to those of us 2 who live here.

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So we think that the mountain range just south of Santa Clarita's a good dividing line. We're northern LA County, and we've been aligned and had districts shared with the Antelope Valley for a very long time. It makes all the sense in the world to us. And so if you need additional population, we have Sylmar and areas that are right near our mountain range, as well, but it doesn't make any sense to connect us with the Greater San Fernando Valley.

So again, I just want to thank you all. The Congressional and Assembly Districts in our region make a lot of sense here in Santa Clarita. The Senate District just needs work. Thanks so much.

The floor is yours. 16 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thank you. Can you hear me? 17 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: We sure can. 18 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thank you so much for this 19 opportunity to speak. I'm calling from Lake County in 20 northern California. And we are a county that has been 21 besieged by wildfire after wildfire, famously so, for 22 some of the largest ever. Sixty percent of our county 23 has burned in wildfires, and that was actually as of a 24 few years ago, so it's more now. And I'm very concerned 25 that the changes being made on the map apparently are

1 going to change our representation in the government. And we are so -- I'm a Valley fire survivor myself, and 3 still -- along with so many others trying desperately to 4 rebuild and recover. 5 I'm concerned that if you remove our existing representation, we will lose more by losing continuity of 6 7 all the work that's been done up till now to support the rebuild. And it's just absolutely crucial that this area 8 9 do that while facing the fact that we are the most vulnerable to wildfire area. And we need to be 10 11 absolutely as prepared as we can be, and our current 12 representation is aware of that, has been working --13 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thirty seconds. 14 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: -- on that. And I don't -- I 15 fear that a change will harm our well-being. 16 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. 17 And right now we will have caller 1620. And up next 18 after that will be caller 2978. 19 Caller 1620, if you will please follow the prompts to unmute at this time by pressing star six. The floor 20 21 is yours. 22 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Can you hear me? 2.3 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: We sure can. 24 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Okay. Thank you very much.

I also just want to say thank you for allowing --

extending comments and allowing me to talk today. I know that you guys have so much on your plate, and I just want to thank you for all your hard work, and keeping Long Beach together. One of the things that I just want to say is that we try so hard as a regional partner to work well with all the cities along our border, regardless of whether they're from LA County or from the Orange County cities.

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I heard -- we all heard earlier that a commissioner requested to move Paramount into a Congressional district with our neighbors Bellflower, Lakewood, and Long Beach, and I really want to support this because we definitely do share a border with Paramount, and both of our cities border the 710 and the 91 freeways, too. And Paramount is with Lakewood and Long Beach in the Senate map, so adding us to the Congressional map also makes sense. So thank you so much, and appreciate your time.

PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much.

And right now we'll have caller 2978. And up next after that will be caller 1327.

Caller 2978, if you will please follow the prompts to unmute at this time by pressing star six. The floor is yours.

MS. TANNO: Hello. My name is Laura Tanno (ph.), and I live in Rossmoor, California. And I became aware of this redistricting idea about two weeks ago. I'm very concerned about the redistricting of Los Alamitos, possibly Cypress, and Rossmoor -- I'm sorry -- Los Alamitos, into Long Beach. Right now, my entire life is centered around Orange County. I live there; I shop there; we pay our taxes there; our sheriffs come from there; our school district -- all is about Orange County.

We feel any redistricting from the Senate and the Assembly to be included in Long Beach -- the voices and the concern to the residents of Rossmoor, Los Alamitos, and Cypress will not be heard because we'll be drowned out by the large constituent base that they have in Long Beach.

Long Beach is a great city. LA has amazing things in their county, but our county has unique concerns and unique challenges, and we want our representation to come from Orange County so those concerns can be addressed by somebody who is coming from Orange County and their ideas and their values share are more similar to the ideas that we share with Orange County than with Long Beach, LA County. So I ask -- I plead, I beg, that we in Rossmoor, and Los Alamitos and Cypress are not redistricted into Long Beach. We really want the representation to be coming from somebody who is elected from Orange County.

Again, we have our own unique concerns, and our own

1 unique challenges, and only a representative who comes from Orange County can adequately address those concerns and be our voice in the district -- in the state. 3 Thank 4 you so much for your time. 5 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. And right now we will have caller 1327. And up next 6 after that will be caller 5157. 7 Caller 1327, if you will please follow the prompts 9 to unmute at this time by pressing star six. The floor 10 is yours. 11 MS. LUBIN: Good morning, Commissioners. Can you 12 hear me? 13 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: We sure can. 14 Thank you. Thank you for this MS. LUBIN: 15 opportunity to speak. My name is Kathleen Lubin (ph.). 16 I live in Santa Clarita Valley. I've lived here for ten 17 years -- the past ten years. I'm calling to request that 18 Santa Clarita Valley and Simi Valley be in one 19 district -- Congressional district, and possibly remove 20 San Fernando Valley. The reason is, Simi Valley and 21 Santa Clarita Valley are situated between mountains and 22 hills, and we're -- our communities are high-risk areas 2.3 for wildfires that sweep through the southern California 24 mountain ranges.

The communities share resources and we have lived

1 through -- recently, we've lived through horrifying wildfires and power outages in our communities. 3 house had substantial damage in the Tick Fire, so our 4 neighborhood is still rebuilding. So I would like to be 5 unified in one district, Santa Clarita and Simi Valley. We are currently working towards making our area safer 6 7 and we would like representation so our concerns -- our unique concerns can be addressed. And I thank you --8 9 thank you for your time. 10 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. 11 And right now we will have caller 5157. And up next 12 after that will be caller 9104. 13 Caller 5157, if you will please follow the prompts 14 to unmute at this time by pressing star six. 15 The floor is yours. 16 MALE SPEAKER: Thank you. Good morning, 17 Commissioners. My name is Michael (ph.). I live in East 18 Highland, part of San Bernardino County. The reason I'm 19 calling this morning is I wanted to voice my support for 20 Assembly Visualization of VICVAL High Desert, and 21 Congressional Visualization of VIAVICVAL. I'm a business 22 owner and resident of the City of Highland on the east 23 side of the 210 Freeway. We are connected to Big Bear 24 and the rural parts of San Bernardino County by the fact 25 that we are adjacent to the national forest and are

1 threatened by wildfires, and by the 330 Freeway that goes up to the mountains. Our city is split by the 210 Freeway and is split into different school districts, 3 even. I agree with the idea of splitting our city along 4 5 the 210 Freeway into different districts, for several 6 reasons. 7 First, the east and west sides are very different. The east side is more rural and literally touches the 8 natural forest, and it's got hiking paths and biking and 10 all that connected to it. West Highland shares the same 11 school districts as the City of San Bernardino, has 12 similar neighborhoods and demographics, and does not 13 touch the national forest. 14 My only issue is I would also like to see East 15 Highland, where I live and work, put into the 16 Congressional visualization of BEAVICVAL. Because of our 17 connection to the rural communities around us, both 18 VAD VICVALHIGDES and VAC BEAVICVAL look great. 19 just like to see my community kept with the mountain and 2.0 the rural areas at the Assembly and Congressional levels. 21 I really appreciate all your time and taking my 22 considerations. Thank you. 2.3 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. 24 right now, we have caller 9104.

I'm calling to 22 make a comment to request that the cities of Rossmoor, 23 Los Alamitos, and Cypress not be districted with Long 24 Beach in Los Angeles County because we're Orange County,

and we want to stay with Orange County. And I -- that's

1 | what I would like to say.

PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. And right now, we'll go to caller 0047. I see that raised hand. Let's give this another try.

And caller 5882, I see you have just called in. If you wish to give comment, please press star nine.

Caller 0047, if you will please follow the prompts to unmute at this time by pressing star six. The floor is yours.

MS. CHEN: Hi. My name is Betty Chen. I live in Rossmoor for over thirty years. And I cannot believe if your district, Los Alamitos, Rossmoor, Cypress, being belong to Long Beach or LA County. No. I don't want that. I was in -- in Orange County and have been the proud resident of Orange County. So please don't put us into the LA County or belong to Long Beach.

We are on the east side of 605 Freeway. If you look at a map, you would see that. We don't belong to LA County at all. So just please, please don't put us in LA County. It's totally different. Orange County is Orange County. The school is Orange County. The place that we go for shopping, restaurants, all the activity, even culture is different. Orange County is not LA County, so don't put us in Long Beach or LA County, please. Thank you very much. Have a good day.

PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Right now, we will go to caller 5882. And up next after that, we will return to caller 9104.

Caller 5882, if you will please follow the prompts to unmute at this time by pressing star six. The floor is yours.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thank you. I live in the City of Redlands, which is split in a variety of ways, currently -- politically, economically -- and there's also often splits in the Congressional districts that are proposed with the visualizations. And so I guess following from the commissioners' discussions of yesterday, which -- you know, which towns, which cities get to be split, which get to be kept whole, who would join together is -- is bewildering.

And that is, I guess, you guys' task to figure out how to -- how to aggregate all of these testimonies that you're getting from us. But I find it distressing, some of the assumptions that are being made about towns. So I would encourage, in the case of Redlands, that while we are, unfortunately, have some social segregation and economic segregation in our town, that we are more oriented, currently, to the west. The Arrowhead Line is going to come out from San Bernardino and draws us more towards the west.

1 We also look east, but we are an urban community. And most of the Congressional visualizations that are being drawn, I don't think that Redlands would serve well 3 4 because of the more rural nature of those concerns in the 5 desert. And so I would encourage you to think about the orientation of different cities when we're thinking about 6 7 the western neighbors, eastern, southern, northern. And I really liked Commissioner Sadhwani's comment 9 yesterday about through us thinking about the anchors and 10 then maybe letting things flow from there, because right 11 now, the process seems a bit arbitrary. 12 Thank you very much for your work. 13 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. All 14 right. Now we have caller 7028. And up next after that 15 will be caller 9104. Oh, wait, no. I was going to 16 caller 9104. I apologize. 1 town near the 91 Freeway. I want to thank you for keeping our community mostly connected. We have a lot in common with our neighbors we have been drawn with, 3 4 including Bellflower. And we have a lot in common with 5 our neighboring cities that are currently -- that are not currently included in our Congressional lines but are 6 7 included in the Senate visualizations. One specific example would be Paramount, which is to 9 the north of me and very, very close. I can walk to 10 Paramount from my home. We heard this mentioned as an 11 idea yesterday, and I completely agree with going as far 12 north as Paramount. I will tell you, quickly, why. 13 I've owned a home here for almost five years. And 14 when there are environmental justice issues stemming from

I've owned a home here for almost five years. And when there are environmental justice issues stemming from some of the industry that employs many people -- and -- and I'm not against it, necessarily, but the industries that are in Paramount do impact the health and quality of life of my family and my growing children.

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Having one unified voice at the State legislative level would really make sense to me. And so I am in favor of those proposed changes. I thank you again for your work. I know you have so much to consider, and thank you for your time. Bye.

This is Jack Tanner, currently a 22 resident of Rossmoor, 90720, and just calling on the 23 redistricting, of course. 24 I was born and raised in Long Beach and had gone

through all the -- the schools. My -- I've been running

1 my -- my small business there in Long Beach for, gosh, eighteen years now. And when we had our child back in 3 2007, we -- we decided to make a move. And my wife grew 4 up in -- in -- in that area as well. So we made a move 5 specifically to get into Orange County, just because it was a -- a different feel, different cultures, different 6 7 beliefs, and it was just -- it was different. And so I'm being told that the -- the areas of Long 9 Beach feel like they're the same and that we share a lot of the same services. And -- and we don't. We -- we 10 11 tend to -- we're right on the border there, right between 12 LA-North County, but we -- we tend to stay in Orange 13 County and head into Orange County for everything. Our 14 school districts are different, our services, our police 15 departments, everything. So we really would like to --16 to retain the representation of people that are 17 specifically identifying and -- and representing this 18 county and our thoughts and beliefs. 19 So thank you for taking the time to hear this, and 20 we hope that it makes a difference. 21 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. 22 And right now, we have caller 8626. - Now, we only have less than ten percent of black

- 16 | So I -- I would like for you to recon -- to reconsider or
- 17 look at this again to make some adjustments for that and
- 18 take that into consideration.

- 22 response, if I can, to just what can be done about that.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Hi. Thank you so much for taking comments. It's so wonderful in California to have this process available to us, when I learned that in other states, it's just run by elected officials.

I am calling in regards to the Inland, Northern, and Central areas of California. I live in Nevada County. I lived in Placer County for ten years before I lived here. And the newest map that was issued this week, which is labeled VCD_ECA_1027, is just geographically really challenging to imagine how any representative could ever effectively represent this area, being that it's 400 miles long.

And in the winter, in order to access the southern

- 1 areas of this, like Inyo and Mono Counties, a representative would have to travel into Nevada and back 3 out in order to cross the mountains because the only path 4 that's open in the winter is the one that goes through 5 South Lake Tahoe or I-80, which -- both of which one must travel into Nevada. 6 7 It just seems kind of really crazy to ask a elected official to realistically represent the interests of 8 people who live right down by Sacramento and then drive, 10 you know, hundreds and hundreds of miles or fly. It's --11 the geography of this new drawing, I just don't see how 12 it could work. 13 And in terms of the community of interest, Inyo and 14 Mono County are linked much more closely with the areas 15 to the south, towards Bakersfield, because of the Owens
 - River Gorge.
 - Anyway, I thought in the previous week, you did a really awesome job with the map that was -- that put Nevada and Placer County and El Dorado County with the Greater Sacramento area. And that map --
- 21 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much.

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- 22 And right now, we have caller 3605. And up next 2.3 after that will be caller 7863.
- 24 Caller 3605, if you will please follow the prompts 25 to unmute at this time by pressing star six. The floor

1 is yours.

MR. WEDEMEYER: Oh. I guess I was muted. Sorry.

My name is Bradley Wedemeyer. I am a San Francisco Bay

Area resident. And I've looked at the visualizations up

and down the State, and I'm appreciative of all your

work. I know there's so many things to be considered.

I do want to remind other people. I've heard this concern about having towns divided. But you know, there's a plus in that sometimes too, where you get two representatives and a chance, if one's not doing the job, to work with the other.

Anyway, but I -- I'm very concerned about representation for the working class. Traditionally, we've looked at other things. And I'm afraid that some of the visualizations, you know, chop up working-class neighborhoods. And I don't know if there is a majority working-class district in the whole state.

You know, this is represented by not having labor people as the Secretary of Labor. You know, this, obviously, is for districts for Congress and the State. But I think it's really important where we have, like in urban Southern California and in the San Francisco Bay Area, where there's -- along the Bay, both sides, there's working-class neighborhoods where you have higher union representation. There is a district that stretches from

1 Napa and Vallejo up over a luxury sort of residential districts in the hills and then goes back down to East 3 Oakland. So you get --4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thirty seconds. 5 MR. WEDEMEYER: -- you know, sort of a dumbbell working-class district with Vallejo at one end and East 6 7 Oakland at the other end. But it seems like, you know, you could have a majority district going along the 8 9 working-class neighborhoods along the Bay --10 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Fifteen seconds. MR. WEDEMEYER: -- between, instead. And we need to 11 12 have class representation as well. And I don't think 13 that it's been accomplished. On the west side of the 14 Bay, there's the -- you know, we have more concern in our 15 working-class neighborhoods of San Francisco with San 16 Bruno than Pacific Heights and stuff. 17 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. 18 Right now, we will go to caller 7863. map for Western Riverside County.

The first map is the Congressional visualization map on page 59. And I live in the City of Riverside, and I would like to thank the Commission for taking into consideration our communities of interest. They are Jurupa Valley, Riverside, Moreno Valley, Perris, and surrounding areas. And we approve and totally endorse this map. Thank you.

The second map that I would like to address is the State Senate on page 48. This map crosses the San Bernardino County line. And as residents of Riverside County, we feel that all the cities in San Bernardino which have been connected to our area are not communities of interest and never have been. The City of Riverside, being the seat of the county, needs to be represented and in — in its entirety in the Senate district.

Together with Jurupa Valley, Moreno Valley, Perris, and surrounding communities, which are our true communities of interest, we would sincerely appreciate you taking into consideration our testimonies in the past.

The third map I would like to address is the one on the Assembly on page 94.

1 for this district to cover the entire City of Riverside and not Corona and Coronita. They're not communities of interest. I would like to talk about the new -- one of the new 14 15 possibilities on Senate District 21 in North LA County. 16 I think that it would be better to do what y'all did 17 with the Congressional map with the Senate map. The 18 Congressional map, you combined Antelope Valley and Santa 19 Clarita Valley, left off Simi Valley. That is the 20 correct direction for all of our maps up here, Senate, 21 Assembly, and Congressional. 22 I am a president, Democratic Club, so I can speak 23 from political perspective. I'm also the founder of Vote 24 Your Power Back last year. If you saw the protests that

were happen -- many of the protests that were happening,

1 I was a part of many of those. The community is very adamant on not being -- continuing to be drowned out for 3 the next ten years. I am also the chair of the Black 4 Chamber of Commerce in the Antelope Valley. 5 So from a business perspective, me working at Northrop Grumming and -- or Grumman, many of my 6 7 coworkers, colleagues, and friends worked and do business 8 in Santa Clarita. We don't go down to Simi Valley. And I think that that shows our -- how that the Santa Clarita 10 Valley and also Antelope Valley should be together in all of it, any of the outcomes of these maps, and shouldn't 11 12 be tried to separate Antelope Valley by itself or with --13 only with the San Bernardino County-type cities that are 14 more rural, and it would drown out the actual voices of 15 the Antelope Valley. 16 Thirty seconds. UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: 17 MR. CALLOWAY: So that -- that really is all that I 18 need to say. Please make sure to keep Antelope Valley 19 and Santa Clarita Valley together in any of the maps 2.0 in -- in all three of the districts. I'm very grateful for the Commission's new visualizations around the UC Irvine area. And I was -- I was very concerned about previous visualizations, especially Visualization A, which would have split Irvine into as many as three Senate districts and paired UCI, which has a large population of first-generation and lowincome students, with the gated communities of the Orange County Coast.

For those of you that are unfamiliar with UCI, we are a community of over 30,000 undergraduates and 6,000 graduate students, many of whom live off-campus throughout Irvine and commute to campus. And we have -- our campus has struggled with a lack of affordable housing near the main campus, especially during the pandemic.

I believe that the most recent visualizations better represent UCI's student body, especially our off-campus students who live in other parts of Irvine where rent is

1 less expensive. Around the main campus, rent can get as high as 3,000 dollars a month, which is not affordable 3 for many of our students. And in fact, some students 4 have to resort to cramming as many as five people into a 5 two-bedroom apartment to meet rent. So many students live throughout Irvine and commute to students (sic). 6 7 And previous visualizations, especially Visualization A, would have divided us into multiple 8 9 districts, diluting our off-campus student-body voice in 10 Statewide and federal politics. 11 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thirty seconds. 12 MR. GRIGGY: I also appreciate this -- that these 13 new maps pair UCI with Irvine Valley College, which 14 allows us to collaborate with the community college and 15 better advocate for students. So in the future, I'd hope 16 that you will avoid -- continue to avoid dividing the 17 City of Irvine, especially for Senate and Congressional 18 districts, that you avoid using I-5 as the dividing line, 19 and that you avoid pairing UCI with South Irvine or with 20 South Orange County and the Orange County Coast. MS. PESANTE: Good afternoon. My name is Lori
Pesante. My pronouns are she, her, and hers. I am
director of civic engagement for the Dolores Huerta
Foundation, based in the Central Valley. We have been
facilitating equitable map coalition spaces throughout
the Central Valley since January and have been involved
in the redistricting process in the Central Valley for
many years now.

We have never known equitable prosperity in the Central Valley. And indeed, the gap between haves and have nots in our region reflect the gap between the Central Valley itself and the rest of California, exacerbated and maybe even created by inequitable district maps at all levels of government.

Thank you for recognizing that the Central Valley cannot be an afterthought in this process. And indeed, as we have engaged with over 5,000 marginalized resident participants in the Central Valley, we have a submission package that is forthcoming to you that will present district maps that we believe absolutely gets us where we want to go, with regard to the fact that we now have all eleven Central Valley counties at over fifty percent Latino population.

Currently, the visualizations don't seem to align

1 with what we believe the VRA obligations are in our region. And absolutely, the VRA obligations, we are 3 asking them to be prioritized. For example, we will be 4 submitting in our package a list of VRA communities that 5 we have identified --UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thirty seconds. 6 7 MS. PESANTE: -- and non-VRA communities so that things can be more surgical within your visualizations. 8 For example, West Bakersfield, west of Gosford Lane 10 (ph.), north of Panama Lane, this is an area that in the 11 general plan for Kern County extends with affluent 12 development all the way out to I-5, along the Ming Avenue and Stockdale corridors. This is not an area that should 13 14 be in a VRA district. 15 There are other examples of this. It will be in our 16 pack --17 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. 18 And right now, we'll go to caller 3471. 19 next after that will be caller 9512. 20 Caller 3471, if you will please follow the prompts 21 to unmute at this time by pressing star six. 22 is yours. 2.3 MS. ALLEN: Thank you. This is Sheila Allen. 24 from Davis and -- Davis, California, and which is in Yolo

County. And I -- the ten years ago, we had a part of

1 Yolo County, West Sacramento, was removed from our Senate and Assembly and Congressional districts, which has been -- I'm an advocate for seniors and work a lot with 3 4 older adults. And we've found it very difficult for 5 advocacy measures to be able to get people to listen to us and to have a strong voice. And so we have been 6 7 advocating from the beginning of making Yolo whole. And now, with the latest lines that were drawn, now we're divided into three different districts. So I am 10 really frustrated by that and hope that we can redraw the 11 line so that Yolo can stay together, instead of being 12 separated into three different Assembly districts. 13 And then for the Senate and Congressional districts, 14 Yolo has been removed from where we historically have 15 been connected to our neighbors to the west. We are --16 Yolo is cut out, and then it goes all the way up to the 17 Oregon border. And the -- the mountain and the far 18 northern counties have -- are a much different part of 19 California than what Yolo County is. 2.0 There -- Yolo has quite a bit of rural, but we're 21 more similar to the rural areas of the Central -- you 22 know, Central Valley --2.3 Thirty seconds. UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: 24 MS. ALLEN: -- and more towards Napa -- Napa.

I'm asking that you take a -- a careful look at that and

do not connect Yolo to the far north counties and bring
us back similar to where we are now. It's been very
effective. So thank you.

Additionally, I'm curious the thought process of why the current rendering of Congressional map places us with our neighbors in north and San Diego and pulls us away from Chula Vista and the South Bay. I'm not sure how folks feel about that, but -- because then the Assembly and State Senate maps overlap with each other but mirror or the opposite to Congressional maps, where the variable is the City of National City, where we only really can relate to Spring Valley, Lemon Grove, and La Prensa, but nothing in common with Rancho, San Diego.

1 I just want to stress that it's so important to keep our Latinx and Filipinx populations together.
