SINGH: Commissioner Yee? 6 7 Chair, the roll call is complete. CHAIR FERNANDEZ: Thank you. 9 With the recognition of Juneteenth as a federal 10 holiday, the Commission wanted to recognize this 11 historical moment in our nation's history. We are 12 honored to take part in this milestone in our nation's 13 growth and encourage all communities to remain civically 14 engaged by participating in California's redistricting 15 process. 16 I will start by sharing a little bit about the 17 Commission. Every 10 years, after the federal government 18 publishes updated census information, California must 19 redraw the boundaries of its Congressional, State Senate, 20 State Assembly, and State Board of Equalization districts 21 so that the districts correctly reflect the state's 22 population. 2.3 In 2008, California voters authorized the creation 24 of the Commission when they passed the Voters FIRST Act. 25 It authorized the Commission to draw the new district

lines for State Senate, State Assembly, and State Board of Equalization districts. In 2010, the Congressional Voters FIRST Act added the responsibility of drawing Congressional districts to the Commission.

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The 14-member Commission is made up of five

Republicans, five Democrats, and four not affiliated with

either of those two parties. The Commission must draw

the district lines in conformity with strict nonpartisan

rules designed to create districts of relatively equal

population that will provide fair representation for all

Californians.

When we receive census data, the Commission begins drawing maps using six line-drawing criteria, as outlined in the California Constitution. One of these is minimizing the division of counties, cities, neighborhoods, and communities of interest to the extent possible.

We can obtain the city and county information from those jurisdictions, but we need the neighborhood and communities of interests' information from Californians directly. That is why we have launched these Communities of Interest input sessions to get that valuable information from you directly. We encourage all Californians to participate in this process.

If you would rather submit a community of interest

- 15 CHAIR AHMAD: Hi, everyone. My name's Isra Ahmad,
- 16 and I'm so excited that you all are joining us today for
- 17 our Communities of Interest input session.
- 18 CHAIR FERNANDEZ: And next we will go to -- I do not
- 19 | believe we have Commissioner Akutagawa; are you here?
- 20 No. We'll go to Commissioner Andersen.
- 21 COMMISSIONER ANDERSEN: Good morning, California.
- 22 My name's Jane Andersen, and it's an honor to be here
- 23 | with you this morning, and I hope to hear from many
- 24 | Californians today.
- 25 CHAIR FERNANDEZ: Commissioner Fornaciari? I do not

1 believe he's here yet. We will --2 COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: I am here. 3 CHAIR FERNANDEZ: Oh, you are here. COMMISSIONER FORNACIARI: Yes. Good morning, 4 5 California. Thanks for joining us today. I'm really looking forward to hearing about your communities of 6 7 interest and, you know, what drives you with regard to 8 redistricting. 9 CHAIR FERNANDEZ: Commissioner Kennedy? 10 COMMISSIONER KENNEDY: Good morning, everyone. I'm 11 here from Morongo Valley, beautiful Joshua Tree gateway 12 community in rural San Bernardino County. Thanks for 13 joining us. 14 CHAIR FERNANDEZ: And Commissioner Le Mons, I do not 15 believe is here yet. Commissioner Sadhwani? 16 COMMISSIONER SADHWANI: Good morning, California. 17 I'm very excited to be here today on this beautiful 18 Saturday in Southern California, looking forward to 19 hearing from folks across the State on this Juneteenth, 20 our newest federal holiday. Thank you so much. 21 CHAIR FERNANDEZ: Commissioner Sinay? 22 COMMISSIONER SINAY: (In Spanish). Good morning, 2.3 California. We're so excited that you're here with us 24 today, and please tell us all about your communities.

2	Like my Commissioners, very excited to be here in these
3	historical moments. I encourage everyone to get and
4	remain civically engaged, and I look forward to,
5	anticipate, and want your public input. Thank you.
6	CHAIR FERNANDEZ: Commissioner Toledo?
7	Commissioner Turner?
8	COMMISSIONER TURNER: Good morning, everyone. We
9	welcome you on this glorious Saturday morning. I am
10	Trena Turner, here in the Central Valley heat, looking
11	forward to spending the day with you, hearing all about
12	your communities.
13	CHAIR FERNANDEZ: And Commissioner Vazquez?
14	COMMISSIONER VAZQUEZ: Good morning, Californians.
15	This is Angela Vazquez. I am here calling in from Los
16	Angeles by way of the Inland Empire, where I grew up,
17	excited to hear from my fellow Californians today.
18	CHAIR FERNANDEZ: And Commissioner Yee is not here
19	today. And I already introduced myself. (In Spanish).
20	Welcome and thank you for joining us today, Californians.
21	I will go over a few housekeeping rules. This
22	meeting is primarily for communities of interest
23	testimony. General public comment will take place at the
24	end of the meeting.

Today we are joined by our line drawing team,

1 HaystagDNA and Q2 Data and Research, who will be displaying a map of the area that attendees describe. Please start with the area you would like to discuss and 3 be as specific as possible about the boundaries of where 4 5 your community is located. Attendees will not be able to share their screen. 6 7 We are also joined by Katy, our comment moderator, who will be introducing attendees when it's their turn to 8 speak. When you join the meeting, please use the raise 10 hand button at the bottom of your screen to enter the 11 queue. If you have registered for the time slot, we 12 encourage you to call in during your appointment time 13 slot. 14 When it is your turn to speak, Katy, our comment 15 moderator, will be identifying you by your assigned 16 unique ID number. You will be reconnected to the session 17 with the ability to enable your own video and/or audio. 18 The comment moderator will assign you a speaker 19 order number before you begin speaking, and please make a 20 note of this for future reference. You will be able to 21 use this number to identify your community of interest 22 testimony on our website at a future date. 2.3 The Commission will be enforcing a three-minute time

limit with a warning at 30 seconds and 15 seconds

At the beginning of your input, you will see a map on the screen. Please remind the mapper what area you would like to see on the screen and be as specific as possible about the boundaries of where your community is located.

Communities of interest tool, there are no clear rules on how to define a community of interest. We have identified ways for you to describe your community.

What brings you together? What is important to your community? Are there nearby areas you want to be in a district with? Are there nearby areas you do not want to be in a district with? Why or why not? Has your community come together to advocate for important services, better schools, roads, or health centers in your neighborhood?

We will now begin the public input sessions, and I will pass this over to Katy, our comment moderator. We will start with the people who are registered, and then open the phone lines, if there is time before the next session.

When it is your turn to speak, you will be identified by your assigned unique ID number. You will be reconnected to the session with the ability to enable your video and/or audio. You will then be assigned a speaker order number. Before you begin speaking, please make a note of your speaker order number for future reference.

LAYBA: We are honored to be the --5 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Real -- real quick. sorry, real quick. Your clock won't start, just one 6 7 second. 8 MS. LAYBA: Okay. 9 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: If you could please make 10 note that your speaker order number is 01, and please 11 make sure to remind the mappers of the area you want to 12 see. And the floor is yours, ma'am. 13 MS. LAYBA: Will do. Thank you so much. I am 14 calling regarding map E, Thousand Oaks. 15 Good morning, Commissioners and California. 16 you for allowing me to speak again. My name is Mina 17 Layba. I'm the Legislative Affairs Manager, officially 18 here on behalf the City of Thousand Oaks. The City of 19 Thousand Oaks is in Ventura County. We're between Los 20 Angeles and Santa Barbara Counties. I'm here to share 21 our community of interest. 22 We share a common interest within Ventura County in 23 diversity, socioeconomic levels, services, such as water 24 resources, air quality, and public safety services, 25

business, and agriculture. Ventura County has a strong

emphasis in biotechnology. Thousand Oaks is home to Amgen, Takeda, Atara, Arcutis, and Capsida. We are proud to be the in-season training facility for the Los Angeles Rams, who wanted a quiet community away from an urbanized setting to focus on training.

We are part of SOAR, Save Open Space Resources initiative. Most cities in our counties require a vote of the people before agricultural, land, or open space areas can be rezoned for development. Thousand Oaks is surrounded by open space, 15,000 acres of protected open space.

COSCA, which is our joint partnership with the

Conejo Recreation and Partnership, owns and manages

approximately 12,000 acres in open space, and more than

150 miles of trails. Thousand Oaks open space even abuts

the Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area. We

are active supporters of wildlife preservation.

Unfortunately, due to our geography, vegetation, and climate, Thousand Oaks is in a very high wildfire severity zone, as with most Ventura County cities. As you develop your maps, we ask that you consider the uniqueness of Thousand Oaks, and we prefer current mapping. We ask that you keep Thousand Oaks whole and avoid integrating us with the City of Los Angeles.

Although we're part of the same Los Angeles-101

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    corridor, we are unlike the San Fernando Valley in
    urbanization, terrain, density, and size. Thousand Oaks
    is truly a community of interest in Ventura County.

3	PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: All right.
4	OLIVIA: Hello. So please bring up the map of LA
5	County that includes the neighborhood of El Sereno, and
6	it's part of East Los Angeles.
7	PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: I'd like to remind you
8	that your speaker order number is number 2. Please make
9	note of that. And your time begins now.
10	OLIVIA: Okay, thank you. El Sereno is in the City
11	of Los Angeles, just east of the City of Alhambra, and it
12	is in the area east of the 710 Freeway and north of the
13	10 Freeway.
14	My name's Olivia (ph.), and good morning to all of
15	you. I'm calling to ask that the Commission keep my
16	community whole, within the same lines as much as
17	possible. My city is in the 51st Assembly District, 24
18	Senate District, and 34th Congressional District.
19	Over the last 10 years, my community of El Sereno,
20	which has grown from being a primarily Latino community
21	to a diverse community ethnically, economically, and
22	educationally. It is because of these changes and
23	economic growth that I request that my community of El
24	Sereno remain within the current district lines.
25	We share a lot more in common with the Highland Park

1 and Eagle Rock areas to the north, both of whom have experienced the same type of economic growth that we have, and as a community, share more in common with than 3 4 any other communities to the south or east of us. 5 Thank you. I appreciate just being able to give my 6 input. 7 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. Up next, we will have 001, and waiting in the queue 9 after that will be 003. Right now, we have 001, and up 10 next in the queue will be 003. 11 And 001, I would like to remind you that your 12 speaker order number will be number 3, if you'd please 13 make note of that. And you can now enable your video and 14 audio. Please remind the mapper of what area you would 15 like to see. And the floor is yours. 16 MS. SOM: Good morning, Commissioners. My name is 17 Laura Som. Would the mapper pull up the City of Los 18 Angeles for the City of Long Beach -- County Los Angeles, 19 Long Beach. Thank you. 2.0 Commissioner, my name is Laura Som. I'm a former 21 survivor of the Cambodian genocide. My people and I 22 immigrated to the City of Long Beach about 40 years ago 2.3 after the genocide happened in 1975 to 1979. Ever since

then, we have been thriving, and our community is a

community of interest and also the importance of this

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community for us is where we meet our family. We have contributed to the City of Long Beach economically, in addition to adding to diverse community to the City of Long Beach.

2.3

I'm here to ask that the Commissioner keep the City of Long Beach together, intact, as much as possible.

Even after 40 years after the genocide, many Cambodians from around the world would come to the City of Long Beach so that they could find their family members that they have missed, been missing, or scattered due to the genocide in Cambodia.

In addition, I wanted to let you know that I'm the executive director of the MAYE Center. And at the MAYE Center's Community Healing Center, we provide services for the City of Long Beach in terms of improving mental health, in addition to sharing all the wonderful techniques of holistic healing to improve the residents' mental health and physical health as well.

And I think that's about it. And I just want to say thank you so much for all the hard work that you are doing, and I hope that you can, as much as possible, keep my city intact, the City of Long Beach. Thank you so much.

PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much.

So right now, we will have 003, and up next in the

MS. LEMIEUX: Thank you very much. My name is Dotty
LeMieux. The area I would like to see is Marin County.

1 Thank you.

I'm a resident of Marin County, have been for the last 50 years. I'm an attorney and a campaign consultant.

In 2011, a group of us appeared to testify at the hearing held in Santa Rosa for the purpose of getting Marin County away from San Francisco, as we previously had been. We felt very strongly that Marin County should be paired with Sonoma County and the other coastal counties north, rather than sharing the same district as San Francisco, which we don't have that much in common with. We felt we were better served not crossing the bridge and having representatives serve a contiguous coastal area.

What we share in common with the rest of the coastal area is obviously the coastline, large, rural food-producing areas, the coastal mountain range, the 101

Freeway, which is the main artery from the Golden Gate
Bridge north, all the way to the Oregon border, and also large areas of open space and federal National Park

Service land.

That change was made in 2011, and we have been in the contiguous coastal region ever since then and feel that we have been served well. I was a little alarmed to see that your outreach zones have Marin County in an

- outreach zone separated from those other counties and put
 with San Francisco and the East Bay. And we hope that
 doesn't signal that you are planning to move Marin County
 back to an area that will cross bodies of water via
 either the Golden Gate Bridge or the San Rafael-Richmond
 - So we would like very much to be put back into our regular county, and I will be testifying at the hearing of Zone C, where we are now, and hopefully will be put back.
- 11 MR. MANOFF: 30 seconds.

Bridge.

- MS. LEMIEUX: We don't quite understand how this happened, and if you could explain why these zones were created and if that does signal that there's some change in the works, that would be important to know.
- MR. MANOFF: 15 seconds.
 - MS. LEMIEUX: And also it would be great if there was a little more publicity on these hearings. I only heard about it because I'm an activist and connected to other people, but I haven't seen it publicized largely, so if you could make sure that that happens. Thank you very much.
- PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: All right. Thank you so much.
- 25 Up next we have Caller 065. And I'd like to remind

1 those in the queue, those calling in, star 9 will raise your hand, indicating you wish to comment, and that is 3 the only instruction given at this time. But 0565 is who 4 we have right now, and as our -- oh, and up next, we will 5 have Caller 2409. So right now will be Caller 0565, and up next will 6 7 be Caller 2409. And these are callers, so we will not be 8 promoting them. Let me ask them to unmute. 9 Hi, Caller 0565. Your speaker order number is going 10 to be number 6, if you could make note of that. And if you could remind the mapper of what area you would like 11 12 to see. And the floor is yours. 13 MS. JONES: Hello? 14 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Yes, hello. Did you hear 15 the instructions? 16 MS. JONES: Yes. Hi. 17 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Your speaker order number 18 is number 6. And remind the mapper of what area you 19 would like to see, and the floor is yours. 2.0 MS. JONES: Can I see the area for Simi Valley, 21 California? Simi Valley, California?

MR. MANOFF: Go ahead.

MS. JONES: Hi. My name is Jennifer Jones, and I

1 it looks like the district that I am in for Congressional, which is the 25th District, is likely to be expanding. So from what I'm looking at, the expansion 3 4 would be kind of a natural to include all of Simi Valley. 5 We do have a little section of Simi Valley that is currently in the 26th, Julia Brownley's District. And it 6 7 only makes sense to keep Simi Valley whole, to expand to include the rest of Simi Valley into the 25th, since the 8 majority of Simi Valley is already in the 25th District. 10 And given just the numbers I'm looking at, looking at the 11 expansion, the natural progression, and also the dynamic 12 recently that I've looked at regarding the different 13 heritages here in Simi Valley. 14 So we are definitely growing, and we are definitely 15 being a lot more inclusive of a lot of different 16 minorities, and especially the 26th area, there is a 17 significant number of Hispanic minorities. So it would 18 only make logical sense to just include all of Simi 19 Valley, including that -- get rid of the 26th area and 20 just put it into the 25th area. 21 And that's just kind of my input. So thank you very 22 much for taking time to listen to me and have a good day. 2.3 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. 24 up next, we have Caller 2409, that's Caller 2409. 25 Caller 2409, you are now unmuted, and your speaker

order number is number 7. Please make note of that for 1 future reference to this testimony. And please remind 3 the mapper of what area you would like to see on the map. 4 And the floor is yours. 5 SPEAKER 07: Hi, good morning. May we see the map 6 for Long Beach? 7 MR. MANOFF: Go ahead. PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Go ahead, the floor is 9 yours, ma'am. 10 SPEAKER 07: Hi, good morning. So I'm calling from the City of Long Beach. I've lived here for over 54 11 12 years. And I'm calling on behalf of keeping support, 13 keeping Long Beach together in the Congress and State 14 districts. We currently have Congressman Lowenthal's 15 area and also Nanette Barragan. And we also -- I support 16 and organize one of the largest Latino community-based 17 organizations here in the City of Long Beach, where we 18 have almost 50 percent of our community represents 19 Latino, (indiscernible), Hispanic. 2.0 Separating areas would definitely be a hardship for 21 our community. We have, you know, one of the largest 22 Cambodian residents outside of Cambodia, and we have a 23 large Asian-Pacific Islander and African American 24 population.

So we are very much in support of keeping our city

1 together. So I would respectfully ask the Commission to keep Long Beach together when drawing the lines. 3 you so much. 4 PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR: Thank you so much. 5 And we currently do not have anyone in the queue, so I will defer to the Chair. 6 7 CHAIR FERNANDEZ: Thank you, Katy. We will stand at ease for two minutes. And I just wanted to remind everyone what our interpretation requests, what that 10 consists of, or the different ways that you can submit 11 requests for interpretation. And again, they must be 12 submitted at least five business days prior to the 13 meeting. And the school 20 district, it tried to initiate parent (indiscernible). 21 So my opinion is -- is that I think that the City of 22 Chino and Chino Hills' votes being diluted because that 2.3 district is in more of a, kind of, a liberal or say, you 24 know, district, with the Senatorial District, with the 25 Assembly District in that area, and also with the

Congressional area.

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So I think in order for them to have, you know, choice of, you know, candidates that could address their issues -- I listen to the City Council meetings all the time; I live in Pomona. And you know, they have failed recently to, you know, to get candidates, you know, except for one, into the senators recently, you know.

But I think that incorporating the City of Chino into maybe the eastern portions like Murrieta, Riverside, and so -- such forth, would be a better choice for them since, you know, those areas are also conservative like Chino, whereas Pomona is, you know, completely opposite, you know, and some of the areas of Fontana and so forth.

So those are my comments. Please take those into consideration in reuniting Chino and Chino Hills again.

Again, last time they did Chino Hills was X'd out because of some factors that came into play that, you know, some of the candidates were more liberal, they didn't want Chino into it because they were a powerful voting block, you know, that stopped a lot. So that's my comments.

We recently had a joint economic study done 24 between Marin and Sonoma on the economic impact of horse 25 keeping, and breeding, and training, and boarding, and

1 | all of those activities that accompany it.

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We don't have close alliances with San Francisco in that area, nor do we have them with Alameda or Contra Costa County, a little bit more with Contra Costa, but really, Marin belongs in that coastal area that would include Marin, Sonoma, Mendocino, and up north to the Oregon border.

So please consider this in your efforts. It makes a difference in land use for us. When we increasingly have more interests that are aligned with urban development or suburban development, we lose ground to other uses, such as agricultural or horse keeping, or even recreation.

We've seen recreation areas lost to intensive development. Thank you.

Those are cities that are legally defined cities. But the rest of the blue is the City of Los Angeles.

Now, one thing that the San Fernando Valley has that is unique is we have communities. And these are legally defined communities by the City of Los Angeles, and I'm actually going to show you the map I have, that shows — so I live in the community of Van Nuys. It's like a city, but it's a legally defined community.

We are asking that when you draw the lines, that your mappers get the lines from the City of LA and respect those lines, and we ask -- this happened last time, and we appreciate that, but that those communities are kept whole.

Historically, the San Fernando Valley has been cut up. In fact, on your map, you can't really see it, but at the bottom of my map, you should be able to see that

1 it is Mulholland Drive. We ask that no district be cut over towards Mulholland Drive. Anytime that we've had 3 districts that have gone over there, we have not been 4 represented. 5 Now, the numbers I have on my map, my background, are from 10 years ago, so our population is about 2 6 7 million now, but we have grown. And we are a separate 8 community from Los Angeles. We share the same heat 9 problems, we share the same water problems, we share the 10 same traffic problems in the San Fernando Valley, but we 11 don't with the rest of the City of Los Angeles. 12 So we respectfully ask that when you are drawing 13 lines --14 MR. MANOFF: 30 seconds. 15 MR. WALDMAN: -- through the San -- thank you --16 that include the San Fernando Valley communities, that 17 one, you keep those communities whole; two, you also 18 ensure that the districts are either a majority San 19 Fernando Valley or wholly contained in the Valley. 2.0 In this last redistricting, everything --MR. Today, I want to strongly recommend the Commission respect the boundary of the City of Long Beach, and ensure the City is nested within single Congressional and State Legislative districts.

I recall vividly decades ago when the Redistricting
Commission split the City, nesting Congressional district

1 partially in Long Beach and half in Orange County, if you can believe that. These boundaries dramatically lessened our voice at the State and Federal level. 3 As the second largest city in LA County, Long Beach 4 5 reflects the demographic and economic diversity of the state. I'm calling in today to express my support to have the communities of Walnut, Diamond Bar, Roland Heights, Hacienda Heights, West Covina, and the Philips Ranch Community of Pomona to all be in the same Federal and State Legislative districts.

I call this the 60-freeway corridor. It's a major transportation and jobs corridor for the area, with many people using this freeway as the main transportation avenue to and from their jobs along this corridor.

In addition to jobs and transportation, ethnically these communities are diverse and should remain together. The demographics of the -- these communities are one-third AAPI and one-third Latino, when combined. These ethnically diverse communities of the San Gabriel Valley should remain together. They have more in common with each other than the Orange County communities and are not currently -- that they're currently bundled with in the State and Federal Legislative districts.

I'd also like to state that while I live in Diamond

1	Bar, my neighborhood, and most of the northern part of
2	the city, is also part of Pomona Unified School District.
3	This includes the sharing of the theater schools with the
4	Phillips Ranch community of Pomona.
5	Phillips Ranch has many similarities to Diamond Bar.
6	Both communities are made up of mostly single-family
7	homes, they share similar demographics, and are connected
8	with the 60 Freeway corridor. Thus, Diamond Bar and the
9	other San Gabriel Valley cities should be in the same
10	district as Phillips Ranch and should include Cal Poly
11	Pomona, all the way up the 71 Freeway to the eastern
12	border.
13	Again, Diamond Bar, Phillips Ranch east to the 71
14	Freeway, Walnut, West Covina, Hacienda Heights, and
15	Roland Heights should all be in the same Legislative
16	district.

I'd like to talk about preserving a Community of Interest that was gerrymandered long before 6 7 the Citizen's Commission was created, and that's 8 Palmdale-Lancaster. 9 We are the urban center, north of Los Angeles and 10 Mojave Desert and Antelope Valley area of the high 11 desert. The two cities are of similar size, similar 12 populations, virtually identical demographics, and yet, 13 for some reason, nearly half of Lancaster has been split 14 off and attached to the 23rd Congressional District 15 rather than with the rest of the community in the 25th. 16 I'm hoping that the community can be restored. 17 currently is preserved in the Assembly District, in the 18 State Senate District and the Board of Equalization 19 District and the Los Angeles County Commissioners 20 District, but for some reason it's split in the 21 Congressional. So as a result, half of Lancaster, if 22 they wanted to go to their main Congressional offices, 23 they have to do a hour and a half trip through the 24 mountains up to Bakersfield, California, which, while a 25 nice community, has very little in common with the

1 interests that we have down here.

While El Monte 3 4 clearly shares an SGV identity with all its neighbors 5 between the 710 and the 57, it's also specifically part of an API corridor in the western end of the valley. 6 7 We share a Community of Interest with our West San Gabriel Valley neighboring cities, including Alhambra and 8 Monterey Park. Our community also experiences 10 environmental justice issues. The El Monte bus station 11 is the largest bus station west of the Mississippi, with 12 lines like the Silver Line and Silver Street, connecting 13 folks east and west. Despite this resource, we breathe 14 in dirty air on the daily from our surrounding freeways, 15 the 210, the 605, the 60, and the 710. 16 Our community is also park poor. We need more 17 resources to get community members to visit our beautiful 18 San Gabriel Mountains National Monument, which accounts 19 for 70 percent of our open space in LA County. The San 20 Gabriel Valley also has many monolingual, Spanish, 21 Mandarin, and Cantonese-speaking residents. Given our 22 diversity, I suggest the CCRC holds one of its LA County 23 meetings here in the San Gabriel Valley. The August 16th 24 meeting, which is being translated in Spanish and 25 Cantonese, would be a great opportunity to do so.

1 Lastly, I'd like to request the CCRC host these public input meetings for the entirety of the advertised duration. On June 10th, I tried to call into the meeting 3 after work out at around 6:45 p.m. I thought the meeting 4 5 was until 8:00 p.m. However, the meeting adjourned already, and I couldn't provide my comments. To make 6 7 this a more flexible and equitable process, I also 8 encourage you to host the meetings until the advertised 9 times. I'm calling about a very traditional Community of Interest designation within 8 9 the city of San Diego. That is the Chollas Creek 10 Watershed. When San Diego was first founded by Pedro 11 Fages back in 1779, he met the Kumeyaay Indians. 12 The Kumeyaay Indians moved back and forth from the 13 San Diego Bay, up the Chollas Watershed. And if you look 14 at the distribution of San Diego Latinx people, they are 15 mainly in the Sandy -- the Chollas Watershed. 16 Watershed is important for us because that's how people 17 of this culture are organized. They shop and live in 18 this Watershed, not artificial communities created by 19 developers or other things. 2.0 So if you're considering how to organize or draw 21 boundaries, please respect the Watersheds. And our 22 Watershed is the Chollas Watershed and includes an area 23 from, essentially, the La Mesa border down to the San 24 Diego Bay at 32nd Street in National City. That's the

Chollas Watershed. And it's particularly important,

- because we're an impaired Watershed, polluted, and unless
 we get concentrated attention as a Watershed, our people
 and our environment will be continued to be polluted and
 misused.

- 6 SPEAKER 19: So please consider Watersheds. Thank
 7 you for your service.

And let's see, some of the shared interests we have with wanting to preserve -- well, I understand the 25th District will have to grow in population, about the same size as the population of Moorpark. So that's what we're asking to add Moorpark to Santa Clarita and Simi and not just split the districts up, because we share the same geography, being wildfire zones and the shared water resources.

1	Excuse me. I woke up with no voice today. So thank
2	you for bearing with me. And let's see, what's important
3	to our community is a preservation of family, and safety,
4	education in a planned-out community, eliminating
5	overcrowding and of course, our Constitutional right.
6	Let's see I'm looking at your questions here.
7	Let's see. We've fought hard to prevent
8	high-density housing projects in the area that cannot
9	accommodate the city cannot accommodate the traffic
10	constraints on or the resources for that. And that is
11	that's what brings us together as a community and our

While the organization that I engage with and the communities I work with really reside throughout the state, you know, I -- just in terms of the conversation, I also want to just highlight along with many of the other issues, the importance of language as a focal part, in terms of, as we're defining sort of Communities of Interest. I work largely in Punjabi-speaking communities really from Kern County up to Sutter as well as across from the Inland Empire to the Bay Area. There's just something I just wanted to keep in focus. Appreciate all the input you're taking, all the time you're putting into this, and hope to be a partner in any way possible. Thank you.

PUBLIC COMMENT MODERATOR:

Welborne, W-E-L-B-O-R-N-E, in Los Angeles, California. And I would like to talk about the central area of Los Angeles, in particular what is known as the Mid-Wilshire District, the Greater Wiltshire Neighborhood Council, and so forth. I will attempt to send a series of seven PowerPoint slides that deal with the suggestions for the Commission. Personally, I was very involved with the city redistricting 10 years ago and should have paid more attention to the state. Specifically the concern relates to the boundaries separating on a north-south basis. State Assembly Districts 50 and 53, State Senate Districts 26 and 24, and the House of Representatives 37th District and 34th District. Unfortunately, your predecessors on staff and

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Commission followed a boundary that had been created a
few years before by the Los Angeles Police Department
when a new division, Division 20, was created. And so a
division boundary had to be cut through the middle of the
Wilshire division.

And so a line was placed based on census tracts
between Division 7 and the new Division 20 going right

between Division 7 and the new Division 20 going right down the middle of our neighborhoods, cutting in half the Larchmont Village Neighborhood Association, cutting in half the Windsor Square Association, cutting between the Windsor Village Association, Wilshire Park Association, a lot of viable neighborhoods.

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The city, in its redistricting, corrected that, and the council district boundary goes on Western Avenue.

And I will send materials showing why it would make much more sense for you to move the boundary certainly to

Western Avenue, which is quite easy for those three districts that you all oversee, or actually six districts. But just to be consistent, so it does not split up a major Community of Interest which works together as the Greater Wiltshire Neighborhood Council.

So I think that's it. Thank you.

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SPEAKER 24: Hi, I live in Glendora and I'm in Los Angeles County. I'm north of the 210 freeway, up along Grand Avenue. And the city of Glendora, currently not in the same district as San Dimas and La Verne. but we're all Foothill cities. We share that same east-west travel corridors, such as Foothill and Sierra Madre, and we share our same fire concerns, the same local junior college, and we have the same local sports leagues together.

And all of us Foothill communities have historic homes, we go to church in each other's communities, and we have a very similar mix of retirees and families. Our Foothill communities share trails and mountains, as we go back and forth. And all of these are important to us, and I'd really like you to include Glendora into Assembly District 41, please. Thank you for your time.

As a long, long-term resident, I feel that Duarte is left out from the other Foothills cities, as we are in Assembly District 48. The Foothills cities are special, as we all have historic homes, we have shared faith communities, and we share the same east-west travel corridors. We have the same fire concerns, because of the hills, and our kids go to the same local junior college. Our Foothill communities share the same Foothill Mountains and hiking/walking trails.

These are important to us. I myself am an avid walker of the Royal Oaks Bike Equestrian Trail. And many of the walkers note on a regular basis how important this trail is. We don't walk north-south, we walk east-west. Duarte doesn't have ties to the cities south of us in District 48. We do have ties in Duarte to the east, Azusa, Glendora, San Dimas, and La Verne. My medical care is all in that area, along with most of my retail, entertainment, and other personal business.

By including Duarte into Assembly District 41 will keep this special Foothill communities' character, which is basically pastoral rather than urban. Thank you very much for your time.

And the fact that you've never posted it, we're not really quite sure if you even received it, if you've read it, if you've acknowledged it, if you've discussed it.

And so we just really want to encourage you to show us you're listening by putting this online in a way that people can follow. We can't sit here and listen to what people in our community are saying. And so we really encourage you to translate this into a way that people can really read into what people are calling in, and also what people are submitting online.

I also want to say that a lot of times your screens are off. And so it just feels like a very impersonal way

1 of engaging with you. And so I really hope that you take these callers and all of our submissions into consideration and really show us you're listening and not 3 4 sort of picking and choosing who you tweet about. 5 It really does send the wrong signal to all of us and shows us that maybe we need to call in and submit 6 7 online. And you're telling us to skip the line and 8 submit online, which we've done. And we're trying to respect your process, but it doesn't seem like you're 10 respecting our time. 1 because I'm calling from my cell phone. For some reason, I got stuck in your tutorial. But I am not even sure 3 you're taking discussions on Congressional districts, 4 because most of the callers before me, were focused on 5 Assembly districts. But I'm going -- and there was -you keep reminding us of numbers to call in, but you're 6 7 not remind -- remind -- it might have helped if you could 8 have reminded us of the parameters of the meeting, 9 Congressional districts, if it also includes Council 10 districts locally. 11 But I'm calling from Los Angeles, and I live in 12 Congressional District 37, and that accompanies --13 encompasses West LA, all the way to downtown LA and South 14 Central. Might I suggest that the 37th districts should 15 possibly end at either Robertson or La Cienega Boulevard. 16 And the areas west of that should be added to this 33rd 17 Congressional district. 18 Areas west of Robertson or Las Cienega share more in 19 common with the 33rd Congressional district, west --20 westside and beach communities than we do with downtown 21 in LA and South-Central communities. The needs of 22 Downtown LA and South Central are great and urgent, while 23 less urgent, West Side needs get pushed down the list of 24 priorities. So we would be better served being a part of 25 the 33rd Congressional district than the 37th.

TEDDY: Hi. My name's Teddy, and I grew up in
Hacienda Heights in southeast San Gabriel Valley. And I
currently reside in the city of San Gabriel, which is in
the West San Gabriel Valley. I'd like to speak today to
the two distinct Communities of Interest that I resided
in. The cities of San Gabriel, Arcadia, San Marino,
Alhambra, Monterey Park, and Pasadena are really one
Community of Interest united by common businesses,
languages, and cultures.

You know, our main thoroughfare, Valley Boulevard, Huntington Drive, Atlantic-Del Mar. These are just a few of the busy thoroughfares that link the Asian American communities in this area together. You know, one of the annual events that have really unified this area is the

1 626 Night Market held at the Santa Anita Racetrack in
2 Arcadia. It's a food festival that brings together
3 various kinds of Asian foods and cultures that the 626
4 area has been known for in one location.

And while I live here now, I grew up in another part of the 626 area, which is Hacienda Heights in the southeast San Gabriel Valley. The west and southeast San Gabriel valleys are both known for having large Asian communities. But they really are distinct geographic areas divided by the 605 freeway. The 605, being a large freeway, runs along the San Gabriel River, and as a result, there's very little commercial residential presence around it. It creates a natural boundary to the East and West San Gabriel Valley.

And when I lived in Hacienda Heights, I would frequent the neighboring communities of Roland, Walnut, Diamond Bar for my shopping and restaurant needs. These communities are linked by Colima Road and Gale Avenue. I'd venture out to the West San Gabriel Valley infrequently, because all of my needs were met in this area. Now living out in San Gabriel, it's exactly the opposite. I rarely cross the 605 to shop in the southeast San Gabriel Valley, because all of my needs are already met in the neighboring cities of West San Gabriel Valley.

1	So thank you for your time today. You know, I
2	really like to recognize that distinctness of these two
3	communities. Appreciate your time.
