Under Government Code section 11123, subdivision (a), all meetings of a state body are open and public, and all persons are permitted to attend any meeting of a state body, except as otherwise provided in that article.

Both the video and transcript will be available respectively at WeDrawTheLines.ca.gov as soon as is practicable after the meeting. Livestream availability cannot, however, be guaranteed due to limited resources or technical difficulties. The meeting will not be cancelled if livestream is not available.

The time and order of agenda items are approximate and subject to change at the discretion of the Chair. In the event a quorum of the Commission is unable to attend the meeting, or the Commission is unable to maintain a quorum once the meeting is called to order, the members present may, at the Chair's discretion, continue to discuss items from the agenda and make recommendations to the full Commission at a future meeting. The Commissioners will periodically recess after no more than 90 minutes for the comfort of the participants and staff, without reference to agenda items.

Government Code section 11125.7 provides the opportunity for the public to address each agenda item during discussion or consideration by the Commission or prior to the Commission taking any action on said item. Members of the public will be provided appropriate opportunities to comment on any issues before the Commission, but the Chair may, at his or her discretion, apportion available time among those who wish to speak. If public comment is not specifically requested, members of the public should feel free to request an opportunity to comment.
